MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

2006 proved to be another remarkable year in the city's continued development and growth. The confidence that investors and developers have in our city was clearly evident with significant mixed developments taking place right around the city.

The confidence that investors and developers have in our city was clearly evident with significant mixed developments taking place right around the city. Seven new hotels were either under construction or opened during the year bringing another 1500 bed spaces to the city to cater for increased visitors. Our financial situation continues to improve and I was delighted as Mayor, on behalf of the elected members of the Council, the Management and Staff, to accept an award from Chambers of Commerce Ireland for reducing our commercial rates. The reduction of a complete 1% in the commercial rate represents the biggest reduction ever and the second year in a row that our rate has been reduced.

The continued pedestrianisation of the city centre by replacing traffic from our streets with high quality street surfaces, trees and street furniture is contributing to the visual enhancement of the city centre. Businesses, retail owners and the wider public have welcomed the pedestrianisation project and the most exciting phase is about to start with sections of O'Connell Street from William Street to Roches Street scheduled for work. The city centre is the undisputed heart of the wider region and current and planned projects will ensure that those who come into the city will have a pleasurable experience.

As Mayor, I was delighted to participate in the establishment of a city centre working group who meet regularly to discuss how we can collectively contribute to ensuring our city continues to develop in terms of its attractiveness. Our annual festivals, such as Springfest and Riverfest, continue to attract thousands of people into our city from all over the country and this year's Christmas lights were certainly the brightest and biggest display the city has ever witnessed.

The substantial regeneration taking place in the city also brought attention on the Docklands area. I am confident that through the consultative forum now in operation that the redevelopment of the Docklands area will contribute significantly to the sustainable growth of the city. There are exciting new projects being discussed presently which will also enhance Limerick's reputation as Europe's latest riverside city. The vision and determination by both the elected members of the Council and management will ensure that the best days in this ancient city's history are undoubtedly ahead of us.

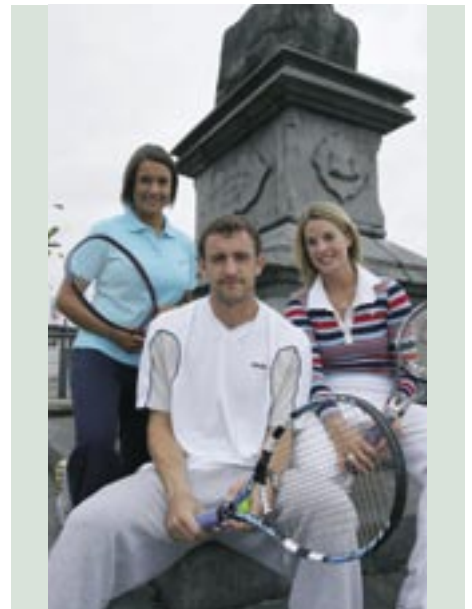

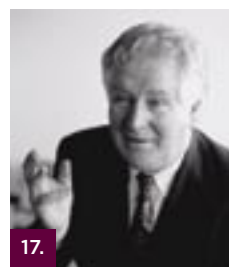

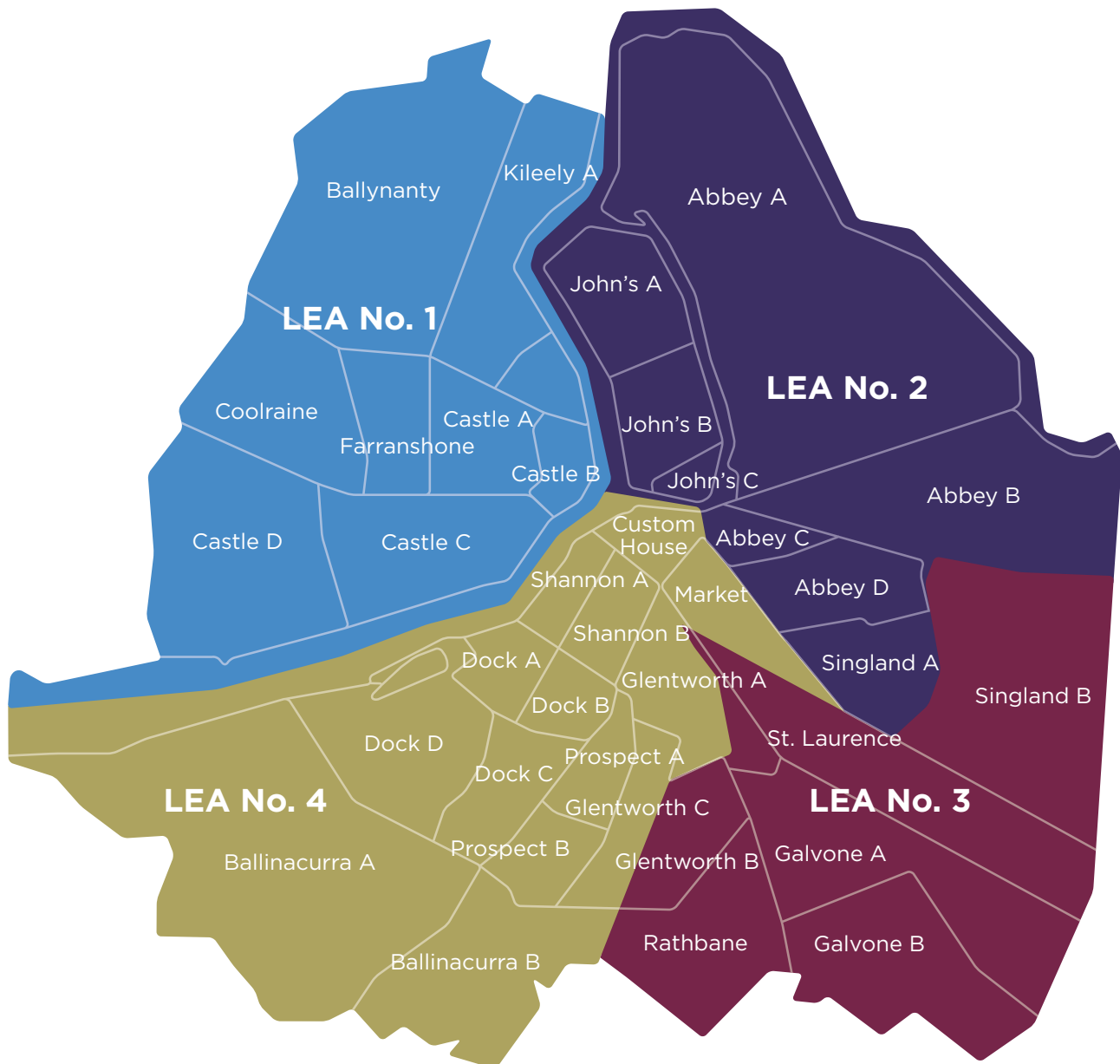

Telecommunications & Network Services

- Installed LAN/WAN internet connection incorporating secure access to Government Networks.
- Network infrastructure: Upgraded server backbone to GB connectivity, installed new backup systems and increased storage capacity and application access speed.

Geographic Information Systems

- In 2006 a new data capture tool was commissioned for the City Council. The 'On-line Digitising Tool' has been employed in the Fire Station, Planning Dept. and Environment Dept. A map-based tool, it is managed centrally and allows individuals from these departments to capture spatial information with minimum expertise and training.
- A platform independent 'light' application was also commissioned to display simple map-based information to the public via the Corporate Website. This tool has been used in conjunction with the 'On-line Digitising' tool and compliments the existing Planning Enquiry System.

Web Services

- Design work commenced on the corporate site www.limerick.ie, to the standards set out in the Web Accessibility Initiative (WAI) funded by the DoEHLG through Community & Enterprise. The redesign project will run until June 2007 and it is planned that individual departments within the City Council will play an important role in the daily maintenance and updating of website content through the use of a Content Management System.
- ICT supported Community and Enterprise and PAUL Partnership in specifying the requirements for a new website for the Social Inclusion Measures Working Group (<http://www.limericksim.com>).
- An intranet based 'Staff Expenses' system was implemented in 2006. This system improves efficiency and reduces the paper trail in processing expenses claims.

- A new customer complaints system was designed and developed in-house to record and manage complaints and request for structural repairs to City Council assets (i.e. water mains & roads etc.) in a more efficient manner. Initially launched in 2005 to the Water Services Department this application was successfully rolled out to the Roads and Traffic Departments
- Introduced Government Network Application Infosys for Housing Department
- Introduced new Childcare Application
- Major upgrades to financial system, email, remote access and citrix applications

HEALTH & SAFETY

The health and safety programme for 2006 took account of the long awaited new Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act of 2005. This has raised the bar in relation to safety responsibilities in the workplace with a special emphasis on managing work activities in order to ensure safety and health. In addition there were a number of new safety regulations signed into law during 2006.

Key Achievements in 2006

- Developed and implemented a Public Access Defibrillation Programme for City Hall and the City Library.
- Developed and implemented an Hepatitis Vaccination Programme.
- Arranged safety reviews for six sections and upgraded their Safety Statements.
- Provided VDU Assessments and training following the office reorganisation for staff
- Carried out Radon Monitoring survey in City Hall.
- Developed six new Safety Guidelines for Mobile Access Towers, Critical Incident Stress, Fall Arrest Systems, Angle Grinders and the Hoist.
- Developed Safety Inspection Checklists for the offices and other work sites.
- Developed a Register of Inspection for Fall Arrest Equipment.
- Prepared annual management report on all accidents that occurred in 2005
- Provided Safety Induction Training courses for the Library staff, Art Gallery and Temporary staff.

- Provided safety training in Mobile Access Towers, Construction legislation, Public Access Defibrillation and Fire Safety Training.
- Prepared a specification for VDU operators office chair.
- Provided FÁS SafePass refresher training courses and cards for eligible staff
- Organised H&S awareness activities during H&S Week for LCC employees.
- Organised the meetings for employee Safety Representatives.
- Arranged fire drills.
- Contributed to the Local Authority Safety Advisors Group (LASAG) publications

Sudden Adult Death Syndrome & Defibrillation

The Irish Heart Foundation has indicated that approximately 6,000 people die each year in Ireland from sudden adult death syndrome (a sudden cardiac arrest) and that about 70% of these occur away from hospital. Some of these fatalities may have been prevented if the victim had access to early defibrillation.

Limerick City Council has installed defibrillators into City Hall and the City Library and trained staff on how to use them. These devices will play a vital role in improving the survival rate of a person suffering from a cardiac arrest while working in or visiting City Hall or the City Library.

PARTNERSHIP

The Partnership process is a mechanism to secure delivery of change and modernisation. It involves management, unions and employees at all levels addressing a wide range of issues of strategic and operational importance, and the delivery of positive outcomes to benefit all parties i.e. management, unions, employees and the public.

Directorate Partnership Sub-Committees

Discuss issues relating to their particular directorate and the recommendations/suggestions put forward are brought to the full Partnership Steering Committee for approval. Committee members comprise of management and union representatives.

A new protocol Handling Significant Change through Partnership has been adopted by LANPAG as it had become clear that managers, union representatives and employees all agreed that all issues of a significant nature should be handled through Partnership.

Towards 2016 is the new Ten-Year Framework Social Partnership Agreement 2006-2015 and discussions have commenced in relation to the provisions contained within T2016. These discussions will take place through the Partnership process.

LIMERICK ARCHIVES

Limerick Archives holds a large collection of archives of the local authorities in Limerick City and County, including minute books of council meetings, rate books relating to the payment of rates on property, valuation records, letter books of incoming and outgoing correspondence, wages books and managers orders. Limerick Archives also holds a large collection of now disbanded authorities including the Board of Guardians, Rural District Councils and the Limerick County Infirmary.

The archives also holds some major collections relating to business in Limerick including the records of Limerick Harbour Commissioners, Limerick Chamber of Commerce and Geary's Biscuit Factory. The archives contains a large collection of deeds mainly relating to property in Limerick as well as family and estate papers, including the papers of the De Vere's of Curraghchase and the Monteagles of Mount Trenchard, Foynes. All of these collections are fully available to the public for research, as Limerick Archives aims to make the archives of Limerick as widely accessible as possible

In 2006 Limerick Archives embarked on a joint project with Limerick Civic Trust to undertake a conservation and cataloguing programme to provide best practice preservation and access standards for the archives service.

Recent accessions include the papers of Fitt's Auctioneers, a small collection relating to the Massey family of Clarina and a collection of drawings relating to Limerick City Council's housing design schemes.

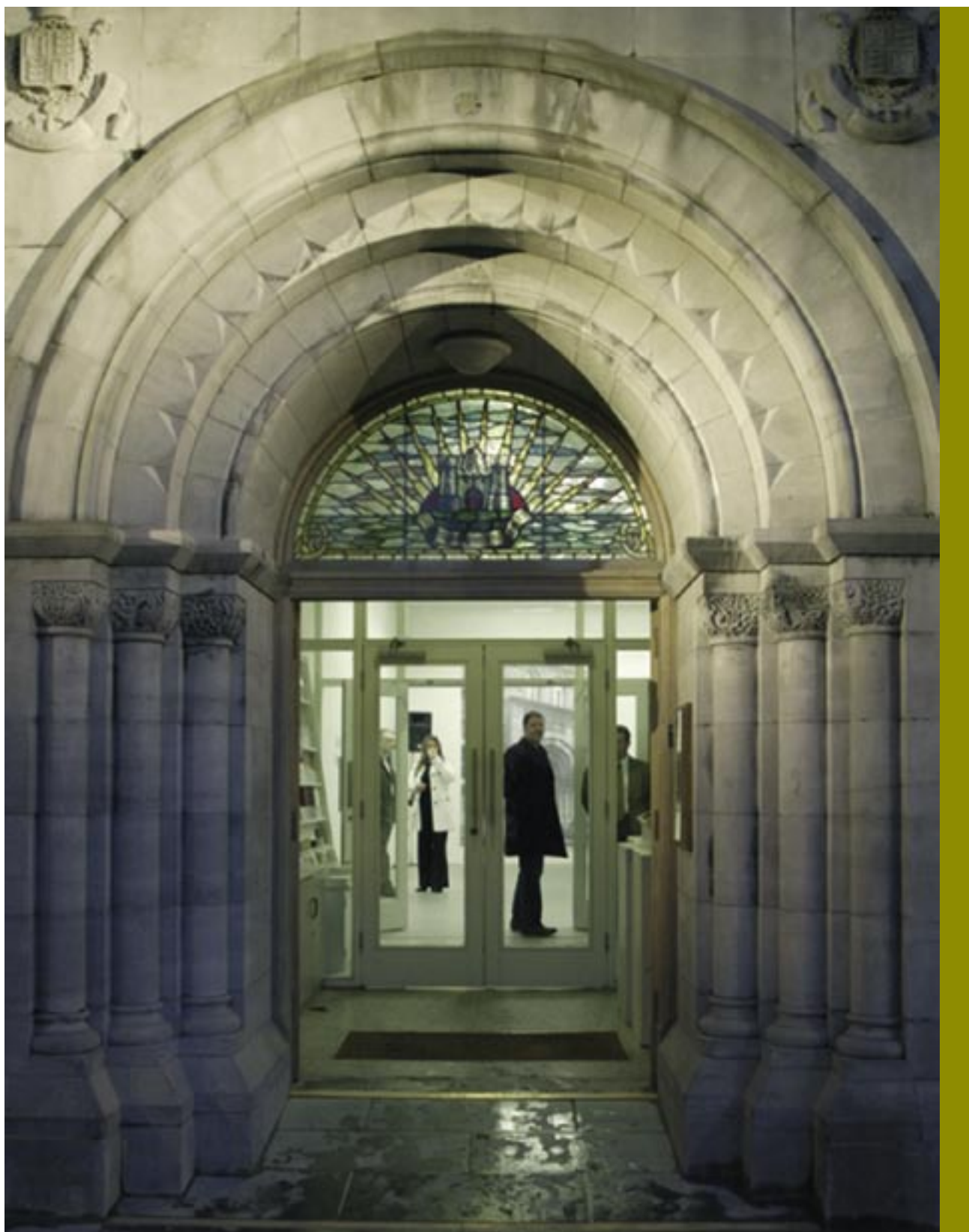

Social Inclusion Unit

2006 was the fifth year of the pilot Social Inclusion Unit (SIU). The key themes for 2006 were:

- Disability
- Community Safety
- Traveller Services

Disability

The SIU continues to coordinate the Council's responsibilities under the National Disability Strategy. In brief this involves undertaking work in the following areas:

Preparing a submission for funding under the NDS

In 2006 the SIU prepared application to the Department of Environment, Heritage and Local Government for funding under the National Disability Strategy. The aim of this fund is to assist local authorities provide universal access to its services.

Establishing a Disability Advisory Group (DAG) for Limerick City Council

In late 2006 the SIU established a DAG to assist in providing a coordinated approach to the delivery of services for people with a disability. The group is composed of senior staff from LCC as well as people with disabilities and representative organisations. One of the main objectives of the group for 2007 is to develop a Disability Action Plan which will set out the actions LCC proposes to undertake over the next three years to improve services for people with disabilities.

Community Safety

During 2006 the SIU worked closely with the Housing Department and with experienced practitioners in community safety from the UK to develop a Community Coordinator Scheme for Limerick City's local authority estates. The aim of the Community Coordinator Scheme is to address antisocial behaviour in the city's local authority estates and to promote safer communities. It is the culmination of extensive desk research conducted by the SIU into International Best Practice in Community Regeneration and will be the first scheme of its kind in Ireland to specifically focus on community safety.

Interagency Traveller Strategy

Since the publication of Limerick City's Interagency Traveller Strategy the SIU has worked with the Interagency Group to advance the actions prioritised as part of the strategy.

ROADS

Limerick City Centre remodelling of streets and public open spaces

The Limerick City Centre pedestrianisation project is an ambitious initiative which aims to make the city centre a pedestrian friendly environment and a more attractive place in which to shop, visit, do business and to pass the time of day. The development of the strategy has entailed extensive ongoing consultation with key stakeholders and the local community whose valued input is very important to Limerick City Council. The roll out of this strategy has also required a review of city centre traffic management measures as an integrate part of the Urban Traffic Control System and during 2006 Limerick City Council carried out a study to identify an inner city orbital route that would facilitate the remodelling of O'Connell Street to give priority back to pedestrians.

The following schemes were progressed during 2006:

Bedford Row

The pedestrianisation of Bedford Row was completed during 2006 at a cost of €2.8 million and provides an important open space link between the main shopping areas of the City Centre, the regenerated River Shannon waterfront and multi-storey car parks. Improvements include restricting traffic to essential service vehicles only, resurfacing of the street in high quality French and Irish limestone paving, improved street lighting and signage, under grounding of services and the provision of distinctive street furniture and new trees. These improvements to the streetscape have been a catalyst for significant private sector investment in new building on the street.

Thomas Street/Little Catherine Street

A contract (value €2.5million) for streetscape improvement works on Thomas Street was awarded during 2006 to pedestrianise Thomas Street between O'Connell Street and Augustinian Lane and pedestrianise Little Catherine Street. Pedestrian priority works includes widening footpaths under grounding of services, installation of high quality limestone paving and the provision of distinctive street furniture and public lighting.

Clancy Strand/O'Callaghan Strand

Designs for the upgrade of the streetscape on Clancy Strand and O'Callaghan. Strand were completed during 2006 and these schemes were advanced through the Part 8 public consultation phase. These schemes will be advanced to tender and construction in 2007.

Corbally Link Road

The site of the Corbally Link road lies to the east of Kings Island and this vital piece of road infrastructure will link the existing R463 Corbally Road at the Grove Island Centre with the R445 Dublin Road at the Park Road junction.

A contract (value €4.5m) for the construction of the Corbally Link Road was awarded during 2006 and work commenced in August. Works involve the construction of a new bridge over the Park Canal and the construction of over 1km of roadway with high quality pedestrian and cycle paths.

Cycling

During 2006 Limerick City Council completed construction of over 1500 metres of high quality cycle paths along the Childers Road between the Parkway roundabout and Kilmallock roundabout. These works also involved upgrading the pedestrian footpaths, enhancement of walls and provision of safety railings and cost approx. €800k.

Road Maintenance

Limerick City Council received the following road maintenance grants during the year.

Limerick City Council used these grants and their own resources to maintain the road and footpath network in the city and to manage traffic. Major road improvement schemes were carried out at the following locations during the year.

Park Magic

During 2006 Limerick City Council carried out a detailed tendering process to secure a provider of electronically enabled parking payment system in Limerick City. Park Magic were the successful company and a mobile phone parking payment system was introduced during 2006. This system can be used for the payment of parking charges in Limerick City Council on street car parking spaces and at some of the private car parks.

WATER SERVICES

Waste Water

All contracts under the Limerick Main Drainage Scheme are complete. The Limerick Main Drainage Project, which has involved the carrying out of 19 major engineering contracts over the last 5 years, has been promoted by Limerick City Council as lead authority in association with Limerick and Clare County Councils. Funding for the Project was provided by the Department of the Environment, Heritage and Local Government under the National Development Plan and by the E.U. Cohesion Fund.

The Waste Water Treatment Plant, Sludge Plant and the new Pumping Stations continue to operate satisfactorily. The Report on an EPA audit carried out in 2005 was received in 2006 and was complimentary on all aspects of the Waste Water Treatment and Sludge Plants. The Sludge Drying Plant was upgraded in 2006 to comply with ATEX requirements as outlined in SI 238.

This project will enable the sustainable growth and development of Limerick City and its Environs well into the future whilst protecting the river environment and enhancing the amenity value of the Abbey and Shannon Rivers for the benefit of Limerick residents and visitors.



Water

Water Treatment

The contract for the refurbishment of the Clareville Water treatment Plant was awarded in 2006. This sees a DBO type contract in place for 20 years. The Local Authority will see its function change from a service provider to a service monitor.

New Mains

New Water Mains were laid at the following locations:

- Monaleen Road Trunk main - 1km of 1000mm diameter pipe.
- Clancy Strand and river crossing - 550meters of 300mm diameter ductile iron watermain in O'Callaghan Strand and 216meters of main in the river crossing.
- Bedford Road - 75meters of 300mm diameter and 75meters of 150mm diameter water mains

New Connections

Over 70 new properties were provided with water service connections during the year.

Water Main Bursts

There were over 20 major water main bursts in the city during 2006. All water main bursts were repaired immediately with effects, generally confined to period not exceeding 12 hours.

Leak Detection

Over 220 leaks on the distribution system were located and fixed by our water conservation crews during 2006. Unaccounted for water in the city distribution system was reduced by an average of 1500 m³/ day.

Rae Bedford

Minimise the risk of fire and other emergencies to life, property and environment and providing an integrated organisational response to fire and major emergencies.

- Attended 2117 incidents with 1346 of these incidents being fires and 323 of these incidents being special service incidents such as road traffic accidents, water pumping/flooding etc.
- Provision of a B.A. Recovery Room
- Refurbishment of Muster Bay area and station officers' rooms within the Fire Station
- Replacement of overhead appliance doors with a safe modern system
- All hydraulic cutting equipment converted to the more efficient and safer Core System

Training courses were provided for staff in the following areas:

- First Responder, Block Training, Senior and Junior Officers Courses in conjunction with Fire Services Council, Swift Water Technician, BA Refresher
- Average mobilising time was 1 minute and 26 seconds.

Fire Prevention, Building Control and Dangerous Structures

Ensuring the health, safety and welfare of people who occupy or use buildings, through ensuring the reduction of fire risk, ensuring a proper means of escape, ensuring access for people with disabilities along with the conservation of fuel and energy.

MUNSTER REGIONAL COMMUNICATIONS CENTRE

In 1992, Limerick City Council, as lead Authority, initiated a project to establish a regional mobilisation and communications system on behalf of the Fire Authorities in Munster. This project was completed in 1993 and has been improved upon and expanded up to present time. The Munster Regional Communications Centre (MRCC) is now part of a national network of three fire service mobilisation and communications centres, and reflects current best practice in all aspects of its activities, including its operational response, technology and management. The Centre currently provides emergency call-taking and mobilisation services for all 10 Local Authority

Fire Services in the Munster Region; Clare County Council, Cork City Council, Cork County Council, Kerry County Council, Limerick City Council, Limerick County Council, North Tipperary County Council, South Tipperary County Council, Waterford City Council, and Waterford County Council.

Since its inception in 1992, the Centre has processed in excess of 200,000 calls, and now mobilises 66 retained and 4 full-time Fire Stations in Munster. The Centre itself is a 24x7x365 operation, and employs a system of procedures to ensure that it operates to the highest possible standard. Approximately 20,000 999/112 emergency calls are answered and processed per annum in a prompt and efficient manner, so that the correct Fire Brigade is mobilised to an emergency incident as quickly as possible. The Centre also provides a mobilising service for Limerick Marine Search and Rescue.

Project Implementation

A tenth partner Fire Service joined the Regional Mobilising System in 2006. In July Waterford City Council Fire Service began working with the Munster Regional Communications Centre, and in doing so placed the centre in the position of being the first national Fire Service Regional Control Centre to have 100% participation from the Fire Services within its area of operations.

ISO 9001:2000

The Munster Regional Communications System was awarded certification to the prestigious, internationally recognised ISO9001:2000 quality award by the National Standards Authority of Ireland in 2005. This certification was awarded across all areas of the Centre's operations, including operational incident processing, finance, training, management information systems, project management etc. In 2006 the Centre underwent its first re-certification audit and successfully achieved recertification to the ISO9001:2000 quality management standard.

In 2006 the Centre's quality management project was nominated for the European UDITE award for performance improvement. (UDITE is a European body made up of local Authority/Local Government organisations.) Following an intensive national and European audit process the project finally finished in the top four UDITE European projects and received an award at the UDITE Congress in Malta. The project was also presented at the LGMSB's 'Excellence in Public Service' conference in Dublin in 2006.

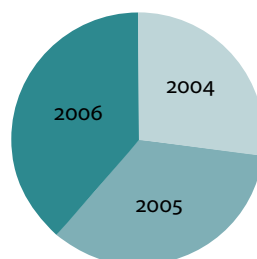

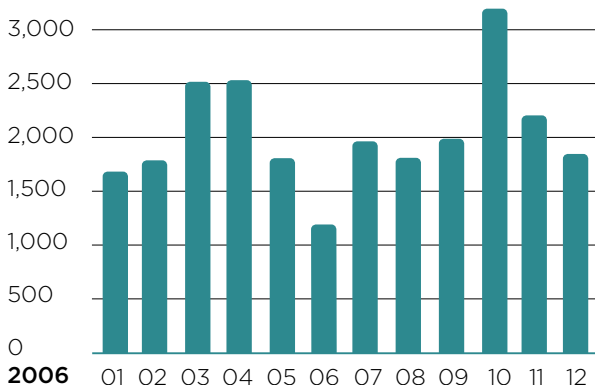

LIBRARY SERVICES

Highlights in 2006

The publication of 'The Government and the People of Limerick: The History of Limerick Corporation/City Council 1197-2006' is perhaps the greatest highlight of 2006. It is the first account of the entire history of an Irish municipal authority ever written. This book was researched and written by Dr. Matthew Potter, who is an employee of Limerick City Council.

New Library at Watch House Cross

The fit out of this new purpose built library commenced in August and it is expected that the library will open to the community in the Spring of 2007.

Social Inclusion

A sum of money was made available by the Social Inclusion Unit to give greater access to people with disabilities. A new signage system with Braille was purchased. Induction loops were also purchased to facilitate those people who are hard of hearing.

Children's Book Festival

For the entire month of October, children were entertained with a variety of activities and events. The most notable were author visits by Catherine Forde, Susie Minto, Marie-Louise Fitzpatrick and Judi Curtin. 'Poddi & Jacko's Misadventure' Puppet Show was enjoyed by children from junior infants to third class. Other events included storytelling, poetry workshops, talks and annual inter-schools quiz.

Library Ireland Week

Library Ireland Week, the second year since its inception, provided a number of events to promote the library service to children and adults alike. Events ranged from a talk on Irish Gardening to Creative Writing and Energy Workshops for schools.

Ordnance Survey Mapping Series

In co-operation with Ordnance Survey Ireland and the Irish Library Council, the early years of the Mapping Series are available in the Local Studies Department.

Lectures & Launches

Limerick City Library hosted nine lectures throughout the year. Some of the topics covered were, '*History of Cinema in Limerick*', '*Marching Bands and Political unrest in Limerick*', '*The Life & Career of Richard Harris*', '*Rudolph, Bing and the Edinburgh Festival*', and '*What does America mean to you? Ireland and Emigration in the 20th Century*'. In addition the library hosted 5 Book Launches from '*Stories of Limerick*', '*Their name liveth for ever more: Memorial Record of the Limerick Casualties of World War II*' to '*Limerick Nature Walks*' and '*Collection of Poetry*' by Desmond O'Grady.

Limerick City Council Arts Service Events 2006 UnFringed

UnFringed 2006 launched its exciting and varied theatre programme at the Belltable Arts Centre, January 19th. Within the comprehensive programme were three stellar international shows. Each of these very different productions garnered accolades from critics and audiences alike at international Fringe Festivals, in Edinburgh, Canada and Prague. First up, was *'The Ugly Duchess'*, written by esteemed Canadian playwright Janet Munsil, an hour-long monologue performed by the actor Paul Terry, *AmerWrecka*, described as 'Moulin Rouge Meets Fahrenheit 911'. An original play written and directed by J.D. Lewis. *Breakfast at Audrey's*, winner of a coveted Scotsman Fringe First at this year's Edinburgh Fringe Festival. *Mamuska Night* with Daghdha Dance Company, dance, video, poetry, installation and performance, *Karl Spain* performed the closing act for this years Unfringed Festival.

The 22nd Kate O'Brien Weekend

The Kate O'Brien Weekend kicked off the Spring Cultural Calendar in February. In it's 22 year the weekend honoured the city's most famous deceased author. *'Creative Impulse'* was this years theme, appropriate for a city which is fast gaining a reputation as a creative and vibrant cultural location was delivered by Dorothy Cross, best known in Ireland for her 'Ghost Ship' which was moored in Dun Laoghaire harbour. Juxtaposed to Dorothy Cross in Subadassi, a Buddhist poet and writer who spoke on 'Creativity as a Art Form' from a spiritual perspective.

Island Theatre Company - Under Milkwood by Dylan Thomas

Under Milk Wood tells the story of a Welsh seaside village with its vivid and colourful characters and is in turn funny, touching and delightful. In this Island production, Myles Breen and Irish Times Theatre Awards 'Best Actor' nominee Jon Kenny played more than 50 characters between them, as they celebrate life, living and loving in this wonderful feast for senses.

Fresh Film Festival

Limerick's annual film festival for young people returned for its ninth year of film fun. This years programme included workshops and both feature and short film screenings. The Irish Schools Film Competition changed to Ireland's Young Film-maker of the Year reflecting the growing interest from individual young film-makers and Fresh Film's position as Ireland's largest film festival for under 18's.

ev*a, exhibition of visual* art 2006

ev*a 2006 was based on ideas of generosity, sharing, communication, social interaction and exchange. It was an exhibition *for* the city and maybe *about* the city, although not exclusively so.

Cuisle, Limerick City International Poetry Festival

2006 marked the tenth Cuisle Festival in Limerick City, celebrating local, national and international excellence in poetry. The festival took place in October with 20 poets from five different countries visiting.

The national and international line up of poets included Adrian Mitchell, Naomi Foyle, Imtiaz Dharker, Christopher Meredith, Saeid Hooshangi, George Szirtes, Brendan Kennelly and Maria Jaztrębska.

Four book launches took place during the festival, each title an exciting new presence in the literary Irish writing scene, REVIVAL, The Stony Thursday, Surreal Man, Chapbook by Ciaran O'Driscoll and Brendan Kennelly's new 'When Then is Now'. To celebrate the achievements of Limerick poets, a series of lunchtime readings at Impact Theatre Company in O'Connell Street celebrated the work of Tom Henihan, and Tim Cunningham whose new book Unequal Truths was also launched during the festival.

Another Limerick son returned to our shores for the festival. Irish composer/violinist Colm O'Riain teamed up with Sri Lankan poet Pireeni Sundaralingam to weave together poetry and music in a series of duets exploring the rich interconnections between a host of lyric traditions, including Irish ballad and Indian raag.

Susie Minto enthralled children in Limerick City Library during the festival with her unique style of story telling. Her deep love for stories and their energy was evident kinds of tales - traditional stories and legends from her Scottish roots and from many world cultures, as well as personal anecdotes and spontaneous stories straight from her imagination.

For those of us who are sometimes daunted by the range of styles in poetry, Gerry Hanberry lead a workshop on 'How to Read Contemporary Poetry'.

Limerick celebrated 25 years of twinning with the French City Quimper and to honour this relationship the Quimper poet Lionel Poiradeau was invited to Cuisle and teamed up with an Irish poet living in Paris, Derry O'Sullivan.

Educational Projects

Irish Chamber Orchestra

The Irish Chamber Orchestra in association with the Arts Office of Limerick City Council worked in three southside city schools. The composer Elaine Agnew, who likes to write music which is direct: sudden disruptive jolts contrasting with ritualistic still textures and whispers, worked with Galvone National School, Our Lady Queen of Peace, and Our Lady of Lourdes.

Young ev*a

Anna Sherbany is a visual artist and leading community photographer with many years of educational experience developing photography projects in partnership with community organisations and educational institutions in Britain and internationally. She spent 8 weeks in Limerick working with Gaelscoil Sairseal and Corpus Christi National Schools on a project entitled 'Photoworks'.

Writer in Residence

The writer Susie Minto began a 2 month residency in Corpus Christi National School in Moyross. Inspired by the artwork in the Permanent Collection at Limerick City Art Gallery, Susie stimulated storymaking with the 5th class children culminating in a storytelling performance by the pupils and a showcase in the form of a publication of their completed work. Corpus Christi National School is a designated disadvantaged school with 307 pupils and a total of 28 teachers on staff.

Two per cent for art projects will proceed in 2006. These are Grove Island with the artist Andrew Kearney and Moyross Library with the artist Sean Lynch.

Jim Kemmy Municipal Museum

There were 181 additions to the museum collection during the year. Notable among them were: an RIC officer's Webley pistol taken at the Dromkeen ambush, 1921; four nineteenth century Limerick pocket watches by C. Cromer, Moser Brothers, R. Wallace and Edward Moser; the flag used by Mayor Casey to start the first Limerick road motor race, 1935; the Civil Articles of Limerick, printed in 1692; eighteenth century prints of William, Lord Blakeney of Co. Limerick, MP for Kilmallock 1727-56 and of St. Mary's Cathedral, a photograph by O'Brien & Doyle, Thomas St., of Limerick Rovers cricket team, 1885, an edition of the Illustrated London News reporting the trial of William Smith O'Brien, 1848, and a collection of memorabilia of the Harrison Lee foundry, including a silver medal for the best production of agricultural implements.

There were 972,720 hits on the online catalogue during the year, totalling over two million since the launch in June 2004, and email enquiries and comments were received from all over the world.

A grant was received from the Heritage Council towards the restoration of the painting, The New Bridge at Limerick by Samuel Brocas, c.1820. Visitor numbers were 13,775.

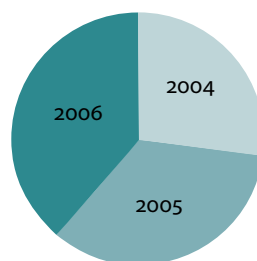

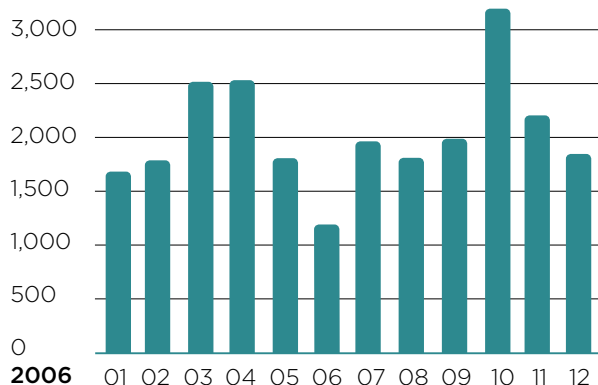

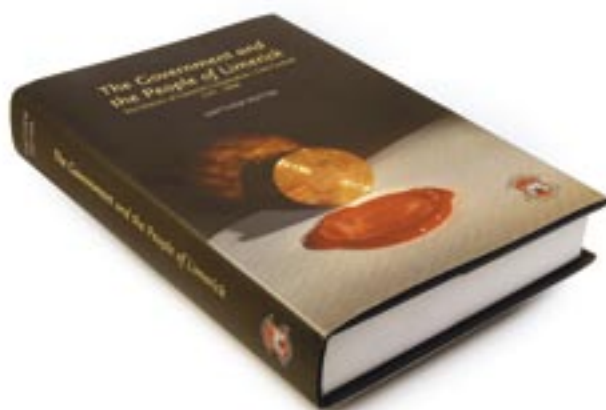

Limerick City Development Board

Following extensive technical development over the past eighteen months, the Social Inclusion Measures (SIM) Database www.limericksim.com was launched. The database is a web-based directory that furnishes key information about local social inclusion measures, including the wide range of services and target groups provided by community and voluntary organisations throughout the city.

As part of the City Development Board's responsibility in endorsing the work plans of community and local development agencies, the Social Inclusion Measures Group initiated a process involving three phases in 2006. Each agency submitted a written reply to a questionnaire based on six progress indicators such as employment, service delivery, transparency, coordination, facilities/infrastructure, and participation. Contact teams met with the ten local development agencies involved to detail actions implemented during the previous twelve months. Feedback from the joint measures was collated by the SIM Group and recommendations in turn presented to the City Development Board for endorsement.

A *Comhairle na Nóg* event was organised in February at Limerick Institute of Technology and during November in City Hall. Over eleven schools and youth organisations participated. Six delegates were selected to represent Limerick City nationally.

As part of the *European Year of Citizenship through Education* a local awards event was held in City Hall, where Mayor Diarmuid Scully presented the Limerick City nominees with certificates in recognition of active citizenship projects such as environmental work, caring for people with disabilities or special needs, or affirming diversity. Group certificates were presented to the 'Green Schools Committee' in Laurel Hill Secondary School and the 'Junior Leadership Group' from Ballinacurra Weston, Southill and Garryowen. Individual awards were presented to Jacinta Kelly, Louise Hayes, Stephanie McKnight, Suzanne Dillon and Stephanie Bourke.

In March the City Development Board in cooperation with Limerick County Development Board hosted a *Race Against Waste* environmental awareness seminar in the Castletroy Park Hotel. The seminar provided

representatives with a guide on how to reduce reuse and recycle their waste and how to manage waste better.

Limerick's tradition of volunteerism was further recognised with the launch of the volunteering website www.volunteerlimerick.com by Mr Eamon O Cuív, Minister for Community, Rural and Gaeltacht Affairs. In association with the Limerick City Community Forum, planning stages for a 'Volunteer Fair' event to promote the achievements of volunteerism in Limerick were advanced during the year. The Fair is an opportunity for voluntary groups to raise their profile and showcase their activities. As part of the '*Where Credit is Due*' volunteering initiative a grants scheme was also initiated for the first time in 2006 and awards were approved for over thirty applications.

Funding was secured by the City Development Board and the VEC to further develop Limerick as a *City of Learning*. A brief for a facilitator was drafted and terms were agreed during the latter part of the year.

A grant of €78,596 was received from DCRGA towards the appointment of a Co-ordinator to implement the Limerick City Local Anti-Poverty Strategy. In September the Board agreed that the appointment would be facilitated by PAUL Partnership as the employer.

An operational review of the Limerick City Community Forum was completed during the year which resulted in a radical overhaul of existing structures and the bolstering of key linkages with local decision-making bodies, including the Strategic Policy Committees. A fulltime Development Worker for the Limerick City Community Forum was appointed during the summer.

Following the establishment by the Government of a Task Force on *Active Citizenship*, a local consultation process led by the Community Forum on behalf of the City Development Board was undertaken to elicit views on what measures might be undertaken to support, encourage and promote citizenship in Ireland. Some of the issues highlighted included the need for greater consultation and meaningful opportunities for civic participation.

Limerick City Childcare Committee

2006 saw the conclusion of the Limerick City Childcare Committee Strategy developed for the period from 2000-2006. While continuing to implement the Committee's core actions throughout 2006 in the areas of Social Inclusion, Equality and Diversity, Information, Training, Networking, Capacity Building and Childminding the Childcare Committee turned its attention to the development of a post 2006 city wide childcare strategy.

To this end two major pieces of research were commissioned. The first initiative – a Childcare Supply and Demand Audit followed on directly from work undertaken by the Limerick City Childcare Committee, in partnership with the Limerick City Enterprise Board, during 2005 to identify the difficulties, barriers and obstacles faced by childcare providers in developing, delivering and sustaining a childcare service.

The final report draws together four pieces of work:

- A Review of Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) Policy within Ireland, which considers key legislative, and policy initiatives over the last decade and their impact on childcare development.
- An overview of the results of a Parent's Survey undertaken in early summer 2006, to which 83 parents responded, reasonably evenly distributed across the City, and with an even split between those accessing private sector and community-based provision.
- Details from a Provider's Survey distributed to 64 childcare providers (community and private) offering a childcare service in Limerick City during the first week in June 2006. A full response (completed questionnaire) was received from 76% of providers with partial information provided by another seven.

- Addresses interviews with members of Limerick City Childcare Committee conducted by SIS in the summer of 2006.

In addition, following the launch of the National Childcare Investment Programme (NCIP) 2006-2010 as a successor to the Equal Opportunities Childcare Programme (EOCP) 2000-2006, the Childcare Committee undertook a strategic mapping exercise specifically to

- Identify any gaps in childcare provision and to ensure that proposed childcare development is located within areas of need and in accordance with any gaps identified

A primary objective of the Limerick City Childcare Strategy 2000-2006 has been to ensure that childcare is accessible to all sectors of the community. A major success of EOCP has been an increase in childcare places in Limerick City and County. The Childcare Committees are anxious that these childcare services will survive into the future and from the perspective of LCCC that:

- The level of childcare provision matches the need for childcare within the city and county.
- All parents can access affordable quality childcare services.
- Children have access to quality childcare provision.

It is hoped that these initiatives will inform the development of a comprehensive, need lead Childcare Strategy for Limerick City spanning the period from 2007 to 2010.

Key Highlights of 2006

- Additional floral stands placed in O' Connell Street and Lower Shelbourne Road.
- Restoration of the second shelter in the Peoples Park completed, in conjunction with Limerick Civic Trust, and the surrounding area landscaped.
- Landscaping scheme commenced on all major approach roads to the city.
- Tree planting in Mayorstone Park completed.
- Substantial quantity of plants raised in the Mill Road Nursery for subsequent planting out in the city.
- Annual grass cutting, tree planting and pruning programme completed.

Thinning and clearance of invasive scrub, additional tree planting, and construction of path completed at Corbally Woods. This work was grant aided by the Forest Service, Department of Agriculture and Food.

New wet pour safety surfacing installed in the Peoples Park Playground, Pery Square. This was grant aided under the Local Authorities Playground Grants Scheme 2005.

Third *Limerick Looking Good* Environment Competition held. Main categories were Best Residential Area, Best Urban Village, Best City Street and Best Kept Residential Front Garden.

Three Special Category winners in the National City Neighbourhoods 2006 Competition; Eves, Roches Street; Crossagalla Business Park & Enterprise Centre and the Woodfield House Hotel.

33 groups/organisations allocated grants under the Environmental Improvement Initiatives Grants Scheme, 2006.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

BAINISTÍOCHT MAOINE

The Property Management Section manages Limerick City Council's property portfolio. This involves acquisition of property for various uses by Limerick City Council including houses for the housing stock, compulsory purchase orders for capital schemes and the acquisition of properties required by other Council Departments. The Section is also responsible for the sale of land and dealing with the freehold interests held on leased property.

During 2006, €12.79 million was generated from the sale of council lands. The revenue income for 2006 was €161,404.00. Thirty properties were purchased for the housing stock and several CPO claims were settled.

Management and maintenance of the Council's Property Register is also a responsibility of this Section. The register contains details of all properties owned/leased by the City Council. During 2006 there was on going work relating to the perfection of existing titles and registering them with the Property Registration Authority. During 2006 we brought 41 S183's to Council.

The Property Management Section works closely with the Planning and Economic Development Department in trying to promote the City as a place for inward investment. During 2006 Property Management played an important role in negotiations for the proposed IRFU development and have continued their work with the representatives of the Opera Centre at Patrick Street/Michael Street. This Section also monitors properties for sale and identifies other opportunities which may prove to be key acquisitions.

Freagracht eile atá ar an Rannóg seo is ea Clár Maoine na Comhairle a bhainistiú agus a chothabháil. Tá sonraí na maoine uile faoi úinéireacht/ar léas ag an gComhairle Cathrach le fáil sa chlár. Bhí saothar leanúnach ar bhun le linn na bliana 2006 d'fhoirfiú na dteideal dá bhfuil ann agus iad a chlárú leis an Udarás Clárúcháin Mhaoine. Thugamar 41 S183 don Chomhairle le linn na bliana 2006.

Oibríonn an Rannóg Bainistithe Maoine i gcomhar leis an Rannóg um Fhorbairt Pleanála agus Eacnamaíoch mar iarracht an Chathair a chur chun cinn mar áit a mheallann infheistíocht isteach. D'fheidhmigh Bainistiú Maoine ról tábhachtach le linn na bliana 2006 sna caibidlíochtaí don fhorbairt mholta de chuid an IRFU, agus lean siad ar aghaidh lena gcuid saothair le hionadaithe an Ionaid Opera ag Sráid Phádraig/Sráid Mhichíl. Income and Expenditure Account Review

Revenue Expenditure Review

Revenue expenditure for the year amounted to €71,785,153 before transfers. Transfer to reserves amounted to €6,016,848 giving a total expenditure figure for 2006 of €77,802,001. This total expenditure figure exceeded the budgeted expenditure by €3,926,690.

Payroll continues to be the most significant cost with a total payroll cost in 2006 of €35,218,311. This represented an increase of 8.12% on the payroll cost in 2005 (the increase excluding the increase in VEC Pensions in 2006 is 4.35%). National Wage Agreements and benchmarking were expected to increase pay costs by 2.5% on 1st June 2006, and by a further 3% on 1st December 2006. In 2005 payroll costs represented 47.2% of total expenditure. This reduced to 45.27% in 2006. This highlights the need for City Council to continue its focus on realigning the pay/non pay balance, and highlights its continued success in doing so.

A number of income areas performed ahead of budget in 2006 resulting in a surplus income over budget. In particular fire charges, fire safety certificates, parking fines, road opening licences, housing rents, planning fees and taxi licences contributed to a favourable outturn versus budget. The benefit of other increases in income such as VEC Pensions, Road Design Office salaries, Recycling Subsidies would be cancelled by similar increase in expenditure.

Balance Sheet Review

Balance Sheet Review

The Balance Sheet presented shows that Limerick City Council has Fixed Assets of €904,802,245 and Work In Progress of €78,224,719 as at 31 December 2006. A full breakdown of these figures is set out in notes 1 & 2 to the Annual Financial Statement 2006.

The City Council has had a welcome increase in its Net Current Assets with a balance of €12,042,117 as at 31 December 2006 compared to net current assets of €5,931,348 as at 31 December 2005.

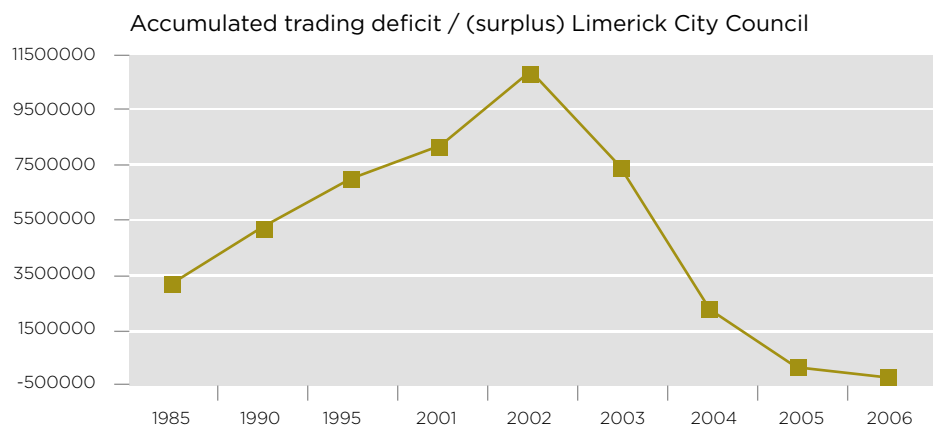

The achievement of excess income over budget gives rise to an excess of income over expenditure in 2006 of €298,390. The accumulated revenue surplus at the end of 2006 amounted to €323,872. This represents the second time since 1979 that Limerick City Council has had a cumulative surplus and it is a welcome improvement in the city's finances.
