

SAVE THE DATE – Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week 21st – 27th September 2015

Dear Conn,

I am writing to inform you of the upcoming 4th annual Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week which takes place in Ireland from September 21st to September 27th 2015.

On average, six people in Ireland die every year as a result of unintentional carbon monoxide poisoning. As you may already be aware, Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week promotes the dangers associated with carbon monoxide and aims to educate the general public on how to prevent it. This public safety initiative is supported by organisations across the energy sector and related industries as well as safety and public health bodies including the Commission for Energy Regulation (CER), Gas Networks Ireland, the Register of Gas Installers of Ireland (RGII), Oil Firing Technical Association (OFTEC), National Standards Authority of Ireland (NSAI) and major Irish energy retailers.

Extensive advertising will be broadcast and published in the run-up to, and throughout the awareness week, supported by PR activities. The Minister for Communications, Energy and Natural Resources will launch the initiative at a press event on the 14th of September in Dublin city centre and industry experts as well as people with first-hand experience of the devastating effects of carbon monoxide poisoning will be interviewed by national and regional media throughout the week.

As a result of the campaign, awareness of carbon monoxide as well as the need for audible carbon monoxide alarms in homes and businesses increases thus, based on our experience, it becomes a talking point throughout the week. We wanted to ensure you are fully aware of the activity and equipped with the relevant information needed should you receive any inquiries.

We have enclosed with this letter information leaflets and posters that you may wish to put in libraries and civic buildings across the county. In addition, we would ask you to highlight the awareness week at your upcoming county meetings in September. You will also find additional information at www.carbonmonoxide.ie, including safety precautions to take in your home, how to install a CO alarm and much, much more.
