

MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS AT MEETING OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CAPPAMORE-KILMALLOCK HELD IN ÁRAS MAINCHÍN SEOIGE, MILLMOUNT, KILMALLOCK, CO. LIMERICK, ON THURSDAY 17th SEPTEMBER, 2015 AT 3.30 P.M.

1. Adoption of Minutes

Circulated, copy of draft Minutes of Meeting of the Municipal District of Cappamore-Kilmallock held on 16th July, 2015.

Proposed by Councillor Ryan;
Seconded by Councillor Mitchell:

At the outset and with the Cathaoirleach's permission, it was agreed to receive an update on the Old School House, Grange from the Administrative Officer, Economic Development & Planning. The Administrative Officer informed the Meeting that the Licence Agreements had been signed by the 3 groups and that all 3 groups had nominated 2 representatives to the Management Committee as requested. He further stated that the works to the building were now substantially complete and the building should reopen within a week. The Members welcomed the progress made.

The Members were invited to e-mail the Director of Service, Community Leisure & Emergency Services if they were interested in being nominated to the Management Committee. The Administrative Officer, Economic Development & Planning agreed to circulate the Members details on the role of the Management Committee.

QUESTION

Reply to the following Question on the Agenda was circulated to all Members prior to the Meeting and the Question was therefore considered as having been dealt with:

2. Question submitted by Councillor O' Donnell

I will ask at the next meeting for an update on the following agreed works:

- (a) Renewal of road markings at Patrickswell, Holycross*
- (b) Provision of appropriate road markings and signage at The Pike, Bruff*

REPLY: Once the roadmarking contractor is appointed within the next two weeks, Limerick City and County Council will include these agreed lining works in his contract. The signs will be erected by the local roads crew shortly.

NOTICES OF MOTION

3. Notice of Motion submitted by Councillor O' Donnell

I will move at the next Meeting of Cappamore-Kilmallock Municipal District that Limerick City and County Council carry out road repair works at The Bridge, Bruff in the interest of road safety of vehicles.

The Motion was proposed by Councillor O' Donnell and seconded by Councillor Donegan.

REPLY: Under an active road opening licence, the contractor was instructed last March to repair the failing road reinstatement near The Bridge, Bruff. He carried out the repair works during the last week of August.

4. Notice of Motion submitted by Councillor Sheehy

I will move at the next Meeting that the Municipal District of Cappamore-Kilmallock invest €10,000 into community based youth initiatives to be organised by Limerick Youth Service. This fund was allocated for a Special Innovation Project as part of the 2015 General Municipal Allocation Discretionary Budget.

The Motion was proposed by Councillor Sheehy and seconded by Councillor Mitchell.

In proposing the Motion Councillor Sheehy outlined what would be involved by Limerick Youth Service. Limerick Youth Service would create a Youth Bank for the constituency area incorporating all towns and villages. A Youth Bank would be a youth lead bank comprising of a group of 10-12 young people. The aim of the Youth Bank would be to support youth lead endeavours in the County. The group would be trained, supported and guided by the Limerick Youth Service. At the request of the Members, the Director of Service, Community Leisure & Emergency Services agreed to evaluate the proposal contained in the Motion.

The Members agreed to invite Limerick Youth Service to make a presentation at a future Meeting.

5. Notice of Motion submitted by Councillor Gleeson

I will move at the next meeting that safety measures be put in place at Abington Enterprise Centre, Murroe in the interest of safety.

The Motion was proposed by Councillor Gleeson and seconded by Councillor Teefy.

In proposing the Motion Councillor Gleeson indicated that the current speed limit needed to be reviewed on the LP1124 on approach to the Abington Enterprise Centre.

REPLY: Limerick City & County Council will place road markings on the LP1124 on both approaches to the Abington Enterprise Centre, to warn drivers to reduce their speed.

The following items were raised at the completion of the Agenda:

The Executive Engineer, Mr. Nash, gave an update on the Road Works Scheme Area Expenditure.

On the proposal of Councillor Sheehy, seconded by Councillor Ryan it was agreed by the Members to host a Municipal Reception for Ballylanders Ladies Senior Football Club on winning the County Final coinciding with the November Monthly Meeting.

On the proposal of Councillor Teefy, seconded by Councillor Mitchell it was agreed by the Members to host a Municipal Reception for Paul Hedderman, John Ryan and Paudie Quish, from Hospital Handball Club following their recent success in the World Championship coinciding with the November Monthly Meeting.

The Members thanked Mr. Lehane for all his hard work, courtesy and co-operation during his time as Director of the Municipal District. They also welcomed the new Director Ms. Cotter Coughlan adding that they were looking forward to working with her.
