- The Public Interest Development (PID) was set up in September 2016 in order to stimulate and strengthen Limerick's historic towns and city centre through built environment development projects which are in the public interest.
- The office is headed up by Rosie Webb, Senior Architect at Limerick City and County Council (LC&CC) and is supported by an interdisciplinary team of 3 with niche technical and administrative skills.
