Domestic Waste Refuse Waiver Scheme

Total number of waivers issued for Limerick City and County Council for August is 23 waivers, 7 were refused.

2. HAP Shared Services

- HAP Shared Services Centre has been shortlisted for a Chambers Ireland Excellence in Local Government Award for 2017 in the Joint Local Authority Initiative category. Limerick City and County Council operates the Housing Assistance Payment Shared Services Centre (HAP SSC) on behalf of 31 Local Authorities and the Dublin Regional Homeless Executive.
- Overall a total 29,705 HAP tenancies have been setup since project commencement in 2014. There are currently 26,102 active HAP tenancies.
- To date in 2017, 11,475 HAP tenancies have been set-up, at a weekly average of 338.
- The HAP SSC will handle circa €230m in financial transactions in 2017, rising to over €600m in 2021, involving at that stage, 84,000 tenancies.
- There are currently 45 people employed by the HAP SSC with new colleagues joining in the coming weeks.

3. Social Development

Outdoor Recreation Scheme

Limerick was approved for funding of €135,270 under Measure 1 of the Outdoor Recreation Scheme. This funding is for the upkeep and maintenance of already established trails, walkways, cycle ways, blue ways, improved access to leisure or recreational facilities, and the promotion and marketing of such infrastructure.

Fifteen projects have now been approved and the work will be carried out in co-operation with local communities and/or other local stakeholders.

Clár 2017

CLÁR is a targeted investment scheme for rural areas which have suffered the greatest level of population decline. Limerick was approved for funding of €161,730 for the following eight projects under CLÁR Measure 1: Support for Schools and Community Safety.

Healthy Ireland

The Local Community Development Committee (LCDC) received a Healthy Ireland fund call and expressions of Interest were invited from all Local Economic Plan stakeholders. 30 applications were subsequently received, with 16 selected for consideration.

At the last Healthy Limerick Interagency Meeting, Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board (LCETB), West Limerick Resources, the Department of Social Protection and Local Link have agreed to pilot a transport initiative for the duration of an upcoming training programme in the Hospitality Education and Training Centre in Limerick. This is in response to the opening of a new hotel in Newcastle West later this year and the proposed training of approximately 50 people to up skill them to apply for positions in the new facility.

Three Healthy Limerick presentations were delivered in August on the social determinants of health, the role of the Council and Local Economic and Community Plan stakeholders – two were given to Local Authority staff and one to staff from the Health Service Executive (HSE), LECTB and Paul Partnership.

Regeneration

The Regeneration Programme has been shortlisted for a Chambers Ireland Excellence in Local Government Award 2017 in the Promoting Economic Development category.

The project nominated is Model of pathways to employment in the hospitality and catering industry. Limerick City and County Council has been working in conjunction with Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board and the hospitality sector to establish the Hospitality Education and Training Centre in the Innovation Hub in Roxboro. It develops courses specifically tailored to industry needs, resulting in teaching students who are readily able to take up jobs in the sector.

4. Customer Services

- For the month of August, the Customer Services Department supported the Council in delivering services and supporting citizens, customers, councillors, communities and businesses who lodged 2,438 requests for service (cases).
- The customer footfall through Reception and Customer Services in Dooradoyle and Merchant's Quay in August was 3,363.
- Customer Services (CS) was also involved with training other departments on SugarCRM, some of these departments included: Cappamore-Kilmallock Municipal District; Physical; Property; Social Development and Regeneration Department.

Limerick ie has been shortlisted for a Chambers Ireland Excellence in Local Government Award for Outstanding Customer Service. Limerick.ie site is central to building a new 'Digital Limerick' by providing citizens with all information about services the local authority requires and will also act as an official guide for those visiting the city and county and for people and organisations, including inward investors who want to do business in or with Limerick. The 'My Limerick' section allows customers to log cases with the local authority and check on their progress, along with creating itineraries about what to see and do in Limerick.



5. Library Services

- Abbeyfeale Library hosted a free digital skills computer training course during the month of August aimed at enabling people to do basic tasks online such as email, banking and Skype etc. The course was provided free of charge and was tutored by Enda O'Callaghan of IOLAR Training.
- Watch House Cross Library continued to promote the Summer Stars Reading Programme with storytelling and arts and crafts sessions weekly.
- On the 3rd August the Granary Library was delighted to welcome back The Modern Irish Quartet (MIQ) who performed to a large enthusiastic audience. It was the group's third visit to the library and they gave a wonderful performance of Jazz and Classical Rock music. Once again, performing as part of M.I.Q. was renowned vibes player, Tony Miceli and special guest on this tour the highly regarded Sax player, Michael Buckley.
- Also on the 28th August the branch hosted a "Dog Safety" workshop for children. Dawn Kavanagh from Dogs Trust instructed the children on what to do if frightened of dogs, how to keep safe around dogs at home and out and about! Dawn was accompanied by her dog "Odie".
- In Dooradoyle Library "Inis Artists" launched their summer exhibition on 1st August. This group of artists is well established and exhibit widely. Paintings were on view throughout the month. Story time sessions for four to six year olds were held weekly this was very well attended each Wednesday. An art & craft activity was incorporated into the story-time and a new nursery rhyme was learned for each session. Meditation classes continued on the first and third Thursday of the month.
- As part of National Heritage Week, Newcastle
 West Library, in association with St. Kieran's
 Heritage Association, Ardagh, hosted an exhibition
 celebrating the Fenian Uprising in Ardagh in 1867.
- West Limerick Resources in conjunction with the Newcastle West Library held "Story Rhyme Time", free interactive stories and nursery rhymes for young children, plus fun with arts and crafts. The library hopes to continue to work with West Limerick Resources and provide more activities for preschoolers in the future as part of the Literacy and Reading campaign in Public Libraries.

- To celebrate the achievements of over 300 children that enrolled for the Summer Stars Reading programme, acclaimed Limerick Author Donal Ryan visited the Newcastle West Library on Tuesday evening 29th August and presented medals and certificates to all involved.
- Digital skills for all citizens has taken place in the Newcastle West Library, providing free training for those with little or no experience on the internet, helping people to explore the wealth of opportunities the online world has to offer. Further classes are arranged for the autumn.

6. Limerick Arts Office

- A new artists' support scheme 'International Mobility Award' was devised and an open call is now in place. The objective of this scheme is to encourage international mobility and opportunities for Limerick artists and creative practitioners who wish to:
 - Pursue professional opportunities.
 - Tour work they have created.
 - Develop collaborative relationships and projects
 - Network for the purpose of developing capacity, knowledge and skills.
 - Attend training opportunities which support the development of their practice and provide for knowledge transfer within the cultural sector.
- The Cross Party Culture and Arts Working Group along with the Limerick City and County Council Culture and Arts Office and members of the sector have agreed to strategically invest in Festivals and Events in 2017/2018. A competitive, transparent open call was launched, offering the opportunity for funding for festivals, events and heritage events under three strands:
 - Delivery and Programming of Small and Community focused Festivals and Events.
 - Delivery and Programming of Medium and Large Scale Festivals and Events.
 - Festival Development and Sustainability.
- All Saints Church in Castleconnell is once again the venue for the 12th edition of the Castleconnell



Autumn Concert Series. The aim in presenting these concerts is to give the people of Limerick the opportunity to enjoy live classical music, performed by highly skilled Irish and international musicians at a wonderful venue that is both intimate and local. We are delighted to welcome Liz Nolan of RTE LyricFM on board as a collaborator on the programme and as the presenter of the series. The first concert was well attended on 26th August and the performers Mairead Hickey and Yoko Ono received a warm welcome from the audience.

- Culture Night returns across Limerick bringing with it the energy, creativity and civic pride of all who participate and attend. As a national annual event Culture Night has become an evening when we leave behind our desks, televisions and couches to come together to celebrate our culture in and with our communities, wherever they may be. In Limerick our culture is as multiple and diverse as its citizens and landscape, and culture night visitors can experience this by visiting some of the 90 events programmed. - Riverfest has been shortlisted for a Chambers
 Ireland Excellence in Local Government Award
 in the Festival of the Year category. Riverfest, is
 the biggest attraction for the May Bank Holiday
 Weekend in Ireland. Since it began 13 years ago,
 the festival has grown into one of the biggest
 family-friendly events in Ireland, attracting tens of
 thousands of visitors every year. Just recently the
 five day family festival claimed the 'Best Live Event'
 award for spectacular live events and the overall
 award for Best Event at the Event Industry Awards.

7. Limerick Museum

- The number of visitors to Limerick Museum in its new location at the Franciscan Friary continues to increase with 1,849 visitors during August.
- This month the museum acquired some very interesting artefacts including: A collection of children's toys from the 1960s and 1970s, a toolbox from Irish Wire Products, and a nineteenth-century Limerick manufactured long case clock.
- For Heritage Week there were: tours of Mount St Lawrence Cemetery and of Limerick Museum;

a joint project with Ormston House on the treasures of the Shannon entitled, "The Museum of Mythological Water Beasts #5: Treasures", and a group of lace-makers viewed some of the museum's magnificent lace patterns.

8. Forward Planning

As part of Heritage Week activities Tom O'Neill, Heritage Officer, lead a nature walk in Mungret Park and afterwards presented a slide show in Mungret College to both residents in the area and the Mungret Historical Society. The event was well received with over 80 in attendance.

9. Planning and Environment

3. Dangerous Structures

4. Investment

Between 30 to 50 high end software jobs are to be created in the city after Limerick-based company Teckro raised further international funding. The life sciences technology company, which operates out of the Bank Building in the city centre, has secured financing of \$10m - approximately €8.4m.

- Limerick agricultural firm Samco is set to invest €2m in an expansion plan, with 10 new staff members to be employed in Adare.
- Danish retailer, Søstrene Grene, unveiled plans to open in Bedford Row in the city centre with the creation of 5 new jobs.
- 35 new jobs are being created in Limerick with the opening of two Gala stores. Joe's Gala – Butchery & Food Hall has opened at Ashdown Centre in Courtbrack, and is employing 20 staff members. While 15 people will be employed at the second Gala store based on the Ballysimon Road.

5. Innovate Limerick

Innovate Limerick have met with the NBC production team at Troy Studios and have briefed them on the range of local services and product providers available to them in the Mid West. As a result of this, the design team met with a cluster of 14 precision engineering and fabrication businesses from the mid west and discussions are ongoing. They are keen to source as much as they can locally and have also been using film.limerick.ie which is managed by Innovate Limerick as a key information source.

 The proposed 18 unit housing project for Cliona Park Phase 3, Moyross, was granted Part 8 Planning Consent at the July Meeting of the Metropolitan District of Limerick.

New District Play Area and Park for St. Mary's Park/King's Island

Funding for a new District Play Area and Park for St. Mary's Park/King's Island, Limerick was approved by the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government in August 2017.

The new park and playground is in accordance with the objectives of the adopted Limerick Regeneration Framework Implementation Plan and aims to improve the quality of life in St. Mary's Park through the promotion of play and fitness.

Cunnane Stratton Reynolds, landscape architects have been appointed to design the project to Part 8 planning stage.



Rebuilding Ireland Submission

Limerick City and County Council prepared a submission to the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government on the Rebuilding Ireland Action Plan for Housing and Homelessness in August 2017. LCCC suggested key additional policy tools to help address Rebuilding Ireland's main objectives as follows:

- Addressing the unacceptable level of households and families in emergency accommodation
- Moderating rental and purchase price inflation
- Addressing the affordability gap for prospective purchasers
- Maturing the rental sector
- Enabling housing to make a steady, supportive and sustainable contribution to economy, and
- Ensuring a housing delivery model, which meets current needs while contributing to sustainable urban and rural development

12. Limerick Smarter Travel

Limerick Smarter Travel Route 2 - City to the University of Limerick Walking/Cycle way has been nominated for the Chambers Ireland Excellence in Local Government Awards 2017. The flagship project for Limerick Smarter Travel - the Limerick City Centre to UL and Corbally shared walk and cycle way. The River Shannon has always been one of the jewels in Limerick's crown and now it can be enjoyed by everyone. There have been extensive renovations carried out on the existing masonry arch bridges along the original route. One of the bridges was rebuilt with the original stone and reinforced to cater for the expected footfall, while two others have been repointed and widened is some cases. All improvements have been carried out with the needs of people with differing abilities in mind.


