REPLY:

In 2017 a new technical member of staff is to be employed by Limerick City & County Council in Cemeteries, part of their initial duties will be to conduct an up to date survey and audit of all 255 cemeteries in the ownership of the Council.

This will incorporate burial plot title, headstone condition, the preparation of accurate up to date drawings of cemeteries and accurately quantifying burial plots available within cemeteries. This data will all be input into a modern electronic database and graphical information system for ease of access.

I will move at the next Meeting that the Council establishes a second lay-by area on the entrance to the rear of the Anderson Ireland Factory to facilitate the expected traffic due to the commercial identity of the proposed business that is to be established there.

REPLY:

Innovate Limerick are currently carrying out substantial upgrade works at the former Andersen Plant which we are confident will result in employment at that location increasing from 70 persons at present to well over 100 by 2018. As part of these works, which were subject to Part 8 planning application in 2016 and agreed with the business concerned, we included a lay by on the road which runs parallel to the front of the Enterprise Centre and have secured a right of way along that road and permission for a separate entrance off that road to their part of the site.

I am confident that Innovate Limerick have fulfilled our agreement in full and have informed the client that they would have to pay for any additional works that they may wish to have provided for them.
