"I will move at the next meeting of the Cappamore/Kilmallock Municipal District that Limerick City & County Council coordinate an agreed traffic management plan and social area for Deebert Close Estate, Kilmallock.

REPLY:

The Estate Management Unit of the Council has been engaging with the residents of Deebert Close and Deebert Park over the past two years with a view to effecting improvements within the area to improve the quality of life of everybody living there, with a particular emphasis on safety issues. As a result, some minor improvement works were undertaken, such as fencing, installation of speed ramp etc. Further safety measures in the form of signage will be installed in the very near future.

The biggest issue identified by residents is the car park opposite and adjacent to their houses, as well as traffic generated by mourners visiting nearby funeral home, and callers to health centre at top of the estate. Various suggestions have been put forward by them as to what measures should be taken in respect of same but it has not been possible to achieve consensus on a preferred option. As a result, following recent consultation with relevant staff in the Kilmallock office, it has been decided that the Council will work on possible concepts/designs that could then be presented to residents.
