Dear Ms. Karen Butler,

I acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 11th May 2018 in relation to ongoing concerns with the waste water treatment facilities at Askeaton, Co. Limerick, with thanks.

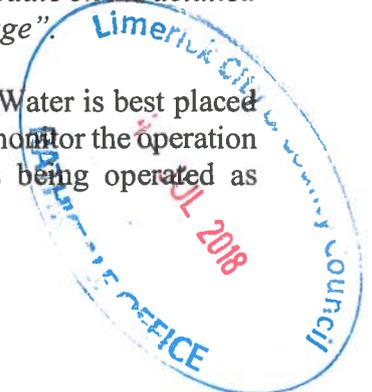
The EPA can confirm that Askeaton agglomeration is served by an Imhoff tank which provides primary treatment. It is Irish Water's responsibility to construct a new waste water treatment plant (WWTP) and ancillary works at this site. Irish Water has provided the following update on progress with this work on 27th June 2018;

"Irish Water wish to advise the Agency that we are currently assessing the Askeaton SS WWTP Upgrade. It was approved for progression for Gate 2 approval however construction funding was not included in the CIP '17-'21 and availability of funding will need to be reviewed during the ongoing process.

An Engineering Service Provider has been appointed by IW and is working on the detailed design of the upgrade of the Askeaton plant.

At this stage IW are unable to provide a definitive programme dateline around the delivery of the Askeaton project until late 2018/early 2019 as there will be an update on the detailed design process at that time and the project will be reviewed at this stage".

The management of this work is under Irish Water's control, so Irish Water is best placed to outline the specific reasons for any delay. The EPA will continue to monitor the operation of the existing WWTP to ensure that the current infrastructure is being operated as efficiently as possible.



In relation to your concerns regarding odour nuisances and network issues, please ensure that these issues are reported to Irish Water in the first instance. The following information outlines how you can log a complaint with Irish Water:
