Dear Ms. Butler,

Arising from a conversation with Councillor Adam Teskey re the National Ambulance Service affiliated Cardiac First Responder group that has just been established in Adare, he suggested that I contact you re arranging a presentation to a meeting of the Adare - Rathkeale Area councillors in the new year. The aim of the scheme is to have a group of volunteer responders trained in CPR and defibrillator use in local communities to be able to provide a rapid response to a cardiac or stroke victim while an ambulance is on its way to the scene. The scheme is run by the Natural Ambulance Service so that groups are linked to the NAS emergency centre and can be alerted to an emergency in their local area so as to be able to provide CPR and defibrillator within minutes of a 999 call being received. It is now established in some 200 communities around the country, including Athea, Pallaskenry and the Ennis Road in Limerick. As the number of communities participating in the scheme continues to increase, the purpose of the presentation is brief councillors on how it operates and its potential to save lives in communities across the county.

Local schemes are funded by fund raising by each group, including any grants that might be available from the county Council or other sources.

Subject to his availability, the presentation will be given by Professor Cathal O'Donnell, Medical Director, National Ambulance Service. Professor O'Donnell lives in Adare and is a volunteer with the Adare CFR Group.
