<u>Summary Report / Main Issues</u>

In budget 2019, an amount of €450,000 was allocated for the delivery of the eight objectives of the Limerick Cultural Strategy. As in previous years, a workshop was held to assist members in making recommendations to go forward to the full council. During the workshop held in January 2019, it was agreed to reallocate €47,000 from 2018 investment towards 2019.

Ms. S. Deegan, Culture and Arts Officer, responded:

We have written to the area manager in ESB in Limerick and are awaiting a response around permission for use of their utility boxes. In the interim based on research and information from similar projects, we have gathered and begun to design a process for Expressions of Interest from artists and groups who would like to engage in this creative community enhancement project, once the approval for funding has been approved by full council.
