I will move at the next meeting of the Cappamore-Kilmallock Municipal District that the next phase of the roll out of CCTV to the towns and villages of the District, that were not included in the first phase, include the following locations: Hospital, Bruff, Knocklong, Knockainey, Killeely, Herbertstown, Galbally, Ballylanders, Martinstown, Bulgaden, Meanus, Grange, Bruff, Garrydoolis and Templebraden.

**Reply:**

While we have noted the need to roll-out CCTV in the communities mentioned above no new CCTV projects are proceeding until funding for installations and maintenance is made available. Wave 2 of the Smart CCTV Pilot Project in the Hinterlands is currently in progress as it has already been financed, procured and contracted. This cannot be extended to include other areas due to planning, scoping, legal requirements and limited funding.

We will continue to monitor and inform the Council if any funding streams or other opportunities will arise in the future.

I will move at the next meeting of the Cappamore-Kilmallock Municipal District that the Municipal District request the Environment Section of Limerick City and County Council to engage in a publicity campaign through local media, social media, etc. to focus attention and awareness on the unacceptable anti-social behaviour of illegal dumping that has blighted the roads and fields of County Limerick.

**Reply**

Limerick City and County Council commissioned a short social media video in December 2019, urging people to use licensed operators **only** to remove their rubbish. On the Limerick Council Twitter account, it gained 1,659 impressions, 226 views, and 7 engagements. This was accompanied by a cinema campaign covering all screenings across Limerick cinemas for a 6 week period from December 2019 to Jan 2020. In addition, the Council has run similar short adverts on Live 95 during the year.
