

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1. Councillor Requested Reports

1.1 Fedamore Traffic Calming

An application has been made for a Low Cost Safety Scheme in Fedamore. This incorporates raised tables and driver feedback signs.

1.2 Banogue Traffic Calming Scheme

MWRDO have received TII Approval for the preferred tenderer and are currently in the process of awarding the contract.

1.3 Ballysteen Directional Signage

This signage has been ordered and will be erected in the coming weeks.

1.4 Church Road, Croom

A Speed survey will be carried out on this road in the coming weeks and, should the survey prove a warrant, traffic calming designs will be considred.

1.5 Blossom Hill Cross

Central Services are awaiting a meeting with the TII Road Safety Engineer in relation to lining at this junction.

3 Village Updates

3.1 Foynes

Foynes Yacht Club

Works Commenced on the 17th of August, this was a Design and Build contract, the Contractor gave an additional price for the rock armouring, this was considered good value, approved by the OPW and consequently the entire spit of land is now protected. The works are now substantially complete, fencing and final topsoiling to be completed.

Marine Cove Culvert

Preliminary report received. Final documentation for tendering purposes is currently underway. The consultant is checking the final design against predicted storm surge tides prior to finalising documents.

Monument Hill Walkway

We have been advised that only one ORIS project will be accepted from the District this year, as this project conflicts with the Marine Cove Culvert, we will wait and apply when the Culvert works are complete.

3.2 Croom

Croom Traffic Management Project



Extensive consultation has been held with Community and Business Interests in relation to the Croom Traffic Management Plan. The main points raised by these interests are:

1. Additional Parking in Town Centre Area required due to removal of parking at one side of the street.

The Municipal District is currently surveying the areas adjacent to the old bank building and adjacent to the post office to design additional parking in these areas. An application has made to fund these from the Town and Village Renewal Scheme.

- 2. 2 Hour parking required in the Town Centre Area
 Byelaws have been drafted for this and will be advertised shortly. The adoption of these Bye
 Laws is a reserved function of the District Members.
- 3. Disabled Parking Spaces required.

 The final design includes Disabled Parking Spaces at the recommended rate of 1 in 20.

Croom Distributor Road

Works are progressing on the Croom Distributor road (see update from Design and Delivery)

3.3 Adare

Walkway Dunraven to the River Maigue

A Usage Survey on this walkway was conducted recently, a copy of which is attached to this report. The average usage of this walkway was just under 60 a day prior to the works and was measured at just under 382 per day after the works, which was a 639.6% increase.

Pope's Quay

Solicitors for Limerick City and County Council are currently in negotiations with the Dunraven Estate to secure ownership of the lands required for this development.

LCCC are currently in negotiations with a landowner which will provide the required lands for a substantial amount of this walkway.

Contactless Water Font, Adare Heritage Centre

A contactless water fountain is to be installed at the Adare Heritage Centre in the coming few weeks.

3.4 Rathkeale

Traffic Management

A meeting was held with the Gardaí in relation to required Traffic Management changes for Rathkeale. The following changes are proposed:

- 1. Introduction of a one way street on Pound Lane, in the direction away from Main Street.
- 2. Reversal of direction on the one way street between Bank Place and the Square.
- 3. Additional Double Yellow Lines at the upper end of Bank Place, Loading Bay at the Plumbing Supplies Shop.
- 4. Removal of single yellow lines throughout the town and replacement with Double Yellow Lines or marked parking spaces where space permits.
- 5. Introduction of double yellow lines on both sides of Lower Main Street between the junctions of New Road and New Line Road.


A drawing of the proposed changes has now been completed and will be circulated to the members for their input before implementation.

It was also agreed to close the Pepperd's Lane/ Main Street Junction to traffic from the 16th of November 2020 to the 15th of January 2021.

Discussions were held with the Physical Development Directorate earlier this year in relation to the required inner relief road through the Mart Site. Proposals in relation to this have now been sent to the Department of Transport.

Footpath links

An application has been made to the Town and Village Renewal Scheme to fund the refurbishment of the Riverside Walkway. This was successful and works will commence here in the coming weeks.



Rathkeale Library Pedestrian Crossing

This pedestrian crossing is now complete. (awaiting white lining)

Ballywilliam Road and Footpath Scheme

Kerbing, Drainage, Road reconstruction and Boundary Set Back Works are now complete. The footpaths will be completed before the end of the month.

Footpath link Library to Tadhg O'Connors

Works on this are likely to proceed in the final quarter of the year.

Rathkeale Promotion

Meetings have been held with Community Groups to promote a positive message about Rathkeale.

3.5 Ballingarry

The Mall TVR Project

The flood study on the Ballingarry stream has been received, final design on this area is now progressing.

Road and Footpath Reconstruction Rylanes to the Grotto

Footpath work is completed in Rylanes, new footpaths have been installed to the church. This area is has now been resurfaced and the footpaths are due for completion this week.

Footpath link to Playground

An application has been made under TVRS to connect the playground to the town centre. This was unsuccessful.

3.6 Askeaton

Askeaton Town Centre TVR Project

A Consultant has been appointed to conduct a Public Realm Study in Askeaton. The results from this study will determine the Town Centre Improvement works in the town. A Briefing Document for the appointment of Consultants to Design and Construct the Undergrounding of Services in Prominent areas of the town as well as enhancing Public Lighting is currently being drafted.


Askeaton Riverside Looped Walk

An application will be made this year under ORIS to fund the River Walk extension to the Slí na Sláinte and to loop this to existing footpaths on the Quay.

3.7 Shanagolden

Shanagolden Low Cost Safety Works

Kerbing, Drainage and Boundary Setback Works are now largely complete and the footpaths are expected to be completed by the end of the month.



3.8 Fedamore

A meeting was held with representatives of Fedamore village in relation to a request for Traffic Calming in the village. This is currently being considered under the Low Cost Safety Scheme.

5 Update from Central Services

Grass and Hedge cutting on National Roads commenced 12th October 2020. This is the 3rd and final cut of the year. This is largely complete, with some outstanding works on the N20.

Overlay works have been completed in Ballingarry, Rathkeale-Ballywilliam, Kinscannel Bends and Croom Concrete Junction as part of this year's overlays contract.

6 Update from Design and Delivery

There was no update from Design and Delivery, last month's update was as follows:

Croom Distributor Road

The contractor is progressing well with the road project and the road is at capping level with kerbing and footpaths to commence in mid-October 2020. The Council is working closely with Limerick Clare Education Training Board to have road access available when Colaiste Chiarain is complete. The current date for completion of the school is 18th December 2020 with students to move into the new school immediately in the new year. The road project is scheduled to have the section of road from old Limerick road to new school open on 18th December 2020.

Kildimo

The landowner has agreed the land take, monies and accommodation works but his solicitor has not engaged with Council solicitor to transfer the lands.

7 Update from Housing Development

Housing Development produce a Housing Newsletter Monthly which Councillors have received.

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Adare Survey Part 2 Thursday 15th Friday 16th and Saturday 17th of October 2020

The purpose of the survey was to measure the number of parked cars and the amount of pedestrian traffic on the route between the village of Adare the entry point of the river Maigue walk, which is located between the entrance to St Nicholas School and the riverbank and then to measure the same traffic after the upgrade to the walking route was completed.

The first part of this survey was carried out over three days in February 2020 precommencement of works on new footpath and also pre Covid-19 lockdowns and the second part was carried out in October 2020 just prior Ireland moving into Phase 5 of COVID-19 restrictions (the second lockdown)


At the time of the first survey there were cars parked along the route both outside the goods entrance of the Dunraven Arms hotel and along the roadside leading up to St Nicholas School and in the second survey the new footpath is in place and there is no parking along the route and during the survey time there were absolutely no cars parked there at any time.

There was another change which is that as part of COVID-19 restrictions foot traffic going from the village to the river walk towards Limerick was discouraged to enable a one-way walking system around the river route and out onto the new foot part beside the School.

In the first survey there was an even amount of pedestrian traffic in both directions with a considerable number of elderly walkers arriving by car to take dogs along the river walk. In the second survey almost all the traffic was one way in a clockwise direction which took walkers out along the road towards Kildimo, enter the river path near the old railway crossing, travel along the river and exit onto the main road at St Nicholas Church and then continue along the new footpath and back to the village.

As well as the new direction of flow there was a major increase in the amount of people walking the route.

The results of the survey are presented at the end of this report.

Conclusion

The first part of the survey was done in February and there was a small but steady flow of walkers and cars parked up along the route.

We observed that all of the cars parked in location 2 (Near the entrance to the river walk) were associated with walkers.

In the second part of the survey there was a major increase in the pedestrian traffic with an average of 41 people doing the circuit every hour.


Observation

The layout and signage of the river walk seems to be designed for locals and it is being very well utilised. Visitors might not be aware that by walking down the road towards Kildimo for a few hundred meters they can enter the river walk and meanwhile visitors who venture out the main road towards Limerick are met with a no entry sign if they want to enter the river walk from that side.

Report for October Meeting of Adare Rathkeale Municipal District Restoration of Countess Dunraven Fountain, Adare



HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The Countess Dunraven Fountain, as pictured below is located between the Holy Trinity Church and the Adare Heritage Centre.



As its inscription indicates, this monument was 'erected by Caroline Countess of Dunraven in grateful memory of the zeal shown by the people of this village in quenching fire at the offices Adare Manor on 1st April 1844'. The fountain therefore adds much historical and artistic interest to the town. Its site, next to the Holy Trinity Church, is a prominent one and it contributes significantly to the streetscape of the village. It was designed by Charles Hardwick who also restored the church. Fine stonemasonry and artistic skill are evident throughout the monument, with the lettering and carving to the base of the cross being particularly fine examples.

CONDITION REPORT

The Adare Tidy Towns Development Association commissioned ACP – Architectural Conservation Professionals to prepare a structural condition report on the Countess Dunraven Statue. The report was issued to the group on 14th February 2020. The report concluded:

Generally the fountain has all the characteristics of the original fabric e.g. pointing, failing due to poor maintenance along with inappropriate repairs e.g. cementitious pointing. The hidden water pipe system within the base is no longer operational and has timber plugs hammered into the outlets which would indicate long term failure.

Overall the condition of the fountain masonry is poor and it will continue to deteriorate due to the water ingress. Repointing is only a very short term option and will not address the underlying fabric deterioration due to the water ingress. The decorative base of the cross should be monitored and inspected on a regular basis for deterioration of the crack.

The surrounding railing and landscaping is of a modern design and serious consideration should be given to restoring the surrounding steps and paved area to a more traditional Victorian style setting that is in keeping with this important historic structure.

TOWN AND VILLAGE RENEWAL SCHEME

The Council issued a call for Expressions of Interest under the Accelerated Town and Village Renewal Scheme in June 2020. The Accelerated Town and Village Renewal Scheme was introduced this year and is focused on immediate responses to the COVID-19 pandemic and medium term interventions to assist rural towns and villages to recover from the impact of the virus. The maximum amount of grant funding available under the Accelerated Town and Village Scheme was €40,000.

The Adare Tidy Towns Development Association submitted an EOI to the Council on 26th June 2020 in relation to the restoration of the Countess Dunraven Statue. The proposed works outlined in the EOI are noted below:

- Dismantle and rebuild the monument to rectify the structural deficiency
- · Recondition the monument façade through sand blasting and re-grouting
- Refurbish the water supply to and drain from the fountain
- Install lighting in the area
- Remove the plants, shrubbery and soil surrounding the monument
- Compact the cleared ground and pour a concrete subfloor as a base for installing limestone slabs
- Create a limestone plinth (170 m2) surrounding the monument on the cleared area
- Install stone slabs on the limestone plinth to act as seat bases
- Fix hardwood seating to the stone slabs

The EOI was selected to take forward to a full application and the Community Development Directorate worked with the group to develop the application and the final application form was submitted to the Department on the 3rd July 2020.

Grant funding of €40,000 was applied for and a cost estimate of €80,000 was noted in the application.


Match funding for the project is as follows:

€20,000 Adare Rathkeale MD GMA €6,225 Built Heritage Investment Scheme Grant €13,775 Council own resources

The Council were notified on 4th August 2020 that the grant application was successful.

Following a tender process ACP were appointed as consultants for the design and monitoring of the works as outlined in the application form.

ACP have been collaborating with the Adare Tidy Towns Development Association in developing the design for space around the fountain – one of the early concept plans for the fountain and associated space is shown below.



The project has now gone out to tender with an anticipated start date of December and a finish date of February 2021.
