

Supplementary information relating to EIC soldiers in the presidency and embarkation lists*, gleaned from a variety of sources.

(*and one or two extras stumbled across)

The information here is about the Limerick soldiers in the East India Company Armies who appear in the lists which may be found at <https://www.limerick.ie/research-aids-people-and-places> and should be read in conjunction with these, because it is supplementary information taken from other sources. I do not repeat information in the presidency/embarkation lists other than name, presidency, service and date of entry, i.e the basic detail to correctly identify the right person.

Notes

1) in this list there are a few people who I stumbled across by accident who, for unknown reasons, I cannot find in the other lists.

2) this is a work in progress and will be updated as more information is accessed; dated 04/11/20.

Please note all National Archive and British Library references quoted are taken from the findmypast website; I have noticed occasional discrepancies between reference numbers in the NA and on the website. If you find two different references for a person, then I am advised by the National Archives it is theirs which should be quoted.

Those soldiers who moved from the Company to the Regular army were mostly awarded 2 yrs extra service for transferring to the regular service, those who formed part of the garrison of Lucknow during the Mutiny received an extra year, which gives rise to what appear to be anomalies between ages of entry and discharge; e.g 19 yrs service plus 2 boon years equals 21yrs service. These soldiers clearly had a choice between a regular army pension and Indian Regulations and almost all chose the latter, which was presumably, more generous. The East India Company had its own pension arrangements, known as Clive Pensions, paid through Chelsea in England and Kilmainham in Ireland.

Queen's Army discharge papers are signed by the soldier or he makes his mark; if you are looking for a man's signature you may find it there. Final discharge may be some time after the regimental board as it seems as though the soldiers had to be discharged from the depot if not staying on in India or wherever he was serving at the time; it is worth checking the original form for this. Additional service for travel time was added.

Many people in the presidency lists transferred in 1860-61 into the regular army, some of whom it is possible to trace further, others not. For those with further information it is largely gleaned from pension records; it is therefore assumed that those for whom there is no further record died while still in service. For this latter group it would be necessary to plough through muster lists for the various regiments etc (if such exist) to find out when their service terminated and how it did so. The records of those who were discharged from the regular army are in the NA. Those discharged 1859-61 from the Company are in the British Library, but reference is also made to the film number and page of the Latter Day Saints' extensive online resources available through their Family History Centres.

FORMAT

M Madras, Be Bengal, Bo Bombay, St.H St. Helena, followed by branch of service and year of attestation where known. Each chunk or snippet of information is then presented, followed by its reference. NI native infantry; HA horse artillery. *before an entry denotes wife mentioned.

Retired Company soldiers were entitled to claim a Clive pension. In order to locate someone in one of the extensive volumes, the easiest way in *findmypast* is to enter the name in the advanced search and the reference, e.g, L-AG-23-2-66 in the keyword search; this should bring you direct to the page. The dates in these registers are admission dates in UK.

Adams, John. Be Infantry 1842 and Be Artillery 1855. Discharge papers; Woolwich 2nd Oct 1863; 21 yrs service; exemplary conduct, medals for Sutlej, Burma and Indian Mutiny; twice in defaulters' book, one court martial; served term with Bengal Fusiliers and rejoined as artilleryman in India; in artillery rose to bombardier to be tried and reduced to gunner to rise again to sergeant at which level he ended his service; 2 boon years; elected Indian Pension rules; attested (2nd) at Dum Dum age 32.5yrs; age at discharge 45yrs; 5ft 8, blue eyes, dark brown hair; scars of wounds on right thigh and left knee; to reside in parish of St. John, St. John's Square, Limerick; WO97/1306/56.

Ahern, Bryan. Be Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers, Dum Dum 19th Oct. 1872; 21 yrs, end of 2nd engagement; Indian Pension Rules, four good conduct badges and Indian Mutiny Medal (not in Mutiny Medal list: five times in defaulters' book one court martial; chose local service in 1859 before joining 107th in Agra in 1861; promoted corporal in local service but demoted for drunkenness at which level he remained; 18 when entered, 39yrs and 5 mths when left; 5ft 7 blue eyes, brown hair; to live in Bury, Lancashire; WO97/1872/68.

Ahern, James. Bo artillery 1846. Batta roll; Date of death 14th August, next of kin unknown, no cause of death given; L/MIL/261; p. 214 of film.

Ahern, John. Be Infantry, 1849. Discharge papers, Aldershot 3rd August 1871; 24 years 30days service, 13 of which in India; termination of engagement; 3 good conduct badges, 9 times in defaulters' book and two courts martial; slight wound in throat at siege of Delhi (not mentioned in Tavender; Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny); private throughout service, 2yr boon; wo at entry, 42yrs 1mth at discharge; 5ft 9½ grey eyes, light brown hair; to reside in Limerick; WO97/1872/73.

Ahern, Maurice. Be Infantry, 1839. Clive pension; June 1848 at 9d rate, increased to 1/5d in November 1879; age 35, 8yrs 2mths service; 5ft 6½, fresh complexion, blue eyes, brown hair; ophthalmia; L-AG-23-2-65.

Ahern, Maurice. Bo Infantry, 1839. Clive pension; June 1846 at 9d rate; age 36, 6yrs 2mths service; 5ft 7½, sallow complexion, blue eyes, dark brown complexion; injury of right knee joint; L-AG-23-2-65.

Ahern, William. Be Artillery, 1847. Discharge papers; Woolwich 3rd Oct. 1862; 17yrs 175 days service, 14 yrs 7 mths in India; 3 good conduct badges, one court martial; rose to bombardier but reduced to private after court martial an "weakness and worn out" and found incapable of earning a livelihood; 39yrs 2mths at discharge; 5ft 6½, grey eyes grey hair; Cupped? On left breast; to reside at Kilfinnan WO97/1306/68.

Allen, Michael. Bo Infantry, 1828. Clive pension, July 1843 at 9d rate; age 34, 15yrs 2mths service; 5ft 5½, fresh complexion, brown eyes, light brown hair; chronic disease of the lungs; L-AG-23-2-65.

Arthur, John. M Infantry, 1839. Not in convict list; <https://convictrecords.com.au/convicts/a>

Barlow, Patrick. M Infantry, 1840. Labourer Limerick City. Clive Pension; 1/- rate; 5ft 5, blue eyes fair hair. Age 38. Private in Veterans. L-AG-23-2-66. July 1861 admitted to permanent pension in Limerick district WO 22/182. Admitted to pension 25th July 1861 WO 23/19. Pension ceased by death 29th Nov 1861 WO22/182. Indian Mutiny medal; (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Barrett, John. Bo Infantry, 1857. Discharge papers; 20 at discharge on 10th September 1859; 5ft 6½, fair hair, fresh complexion and blue eyes; L/MIL/12/286 (LDS 2029840, 40).

Barry, John. Be. In returned list, labourer, blind in both eyes Bengal. Lord Clive pension from 28th Sept 50. L-AG-23-2-66 Bengal 2ER.

Barry, John. M, in returned list, silk weaver, Madras. Admitted to pension 13/02/56; v. defective vision, now blind in right eye. Discharged from sick quarters in Gravesend 31/10/55. Clive pension; 5ft 6½, light brown hair, grey eyes, fair complexion; age 35, 15yrs service; residence Cork, L-AG-23-2-66.

Barry, John. M. Artillery, ? Clive pension; farrier; admitted Jan '59, at 1/- rate; 5ft 7, light brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; trade a farrier; 21yr service, left at own request. Residence Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. Does not fit easily with any of the Madras JB's

Bateman, Francis. M Infantry, 1847. Discharge papers 14th March 1866; appeared in defaulters' book 9 times for drunkenness, transferred to 105th Regt on disbandment of Madras Infantry; discharged with ulcers but "can to a certain degree contribute to his livelihood"; 19 when signed up, 5ft 5½ tall, blue eyes, brown hair; intending to live in Limerick; discharge from European Veterans. 21yrs service included 2 years' extra service; WO97/721/84.

Bennett, James. Bo Artillery, 1822. Infantry in embarkation list. Clive pension; August 1836, at 9d rate; age 35, 13yrs 4days service; 5ft 6½, fair complexion and hair, grey eyes; unfit for service, rupture; L-AG-23-2-65.

Benson, Michael. Be Infantry, 1829. Clive pension; July 1844 at 9d rate; age 33, 14yrs 2mths service; 5ft 5¼, fresh complexion, grey eyes, dark brown hair; debility and wasting of muscles; L-AG-23-2-65.

Blake, Michael. M Artillery, 1844. Promoted bombardier 1850, reduced after trial in 1851; corporal 1858, staff sergeant 1859; Vol to RA 61 as staff sergeant, reduced to gunner 1863 after trial; discharged 28/12/65 after 21 yrs; opted to take EIC pension rules in 1859; 5ft 7¾, hazel eyes, sandy hair; intended residence Crecora, Kilpeacon; to Kilmainham as out pension Feb 1892, as in pension July 1894, reverted to out Jan 1895, in again May 1898 and died 16/12/99; 42.5yrs at discharge WO97/1309/108.

Boland, Charles. Be Infantry, ? Not in presidential list. Clive pension; June 1847 at 9d rate; servant; age 28. 7yrs 3mths service; 5ft 5¼, fresh complexion, hazel eyes, brown hair; almost blind from ophthalmia; L-AG-23-2-65.

Boucher, John. M Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers 04/11/73; 21 years' service; chose Indian Pension regulations; good conduct medal and Indian Mutiny medal with clasp for Central India; transferred as private to 108th where he was twice promoted to corporal but reduced to ranks for drunkenness; age 18 at entry, blue eyes, brown hair, intending to live in Dublin WO97/1891/162.

Bouchier, Edward. M Artillery, 1849. Returned, time expired, 1861. Joined/ attested for reserve force 1868 for two yrs or what makes up 21 yrs service; signed up in N. London; discharged 3rd May 1887, when living at 15 Pimlico Rd. WO 97/2334/98. 1871 census m to Maria 27, kids, William H. 5, Emma, 2 and Kate A. 1; living in London https://search.ancestry.co.uk/cgi-bin/sse.dll?indiv=1&dbid=7619&gsfn=Edward&gsln=Bouchier&gsln_x=1&cp=0&msrpn_ftp=london%2c+london%2c+england%2c+united+kingdom&msrpn=85535&new=1&rank=1&uidh=ige&redir=false&msT=1&gss=angs-d&pcat=35&fh=0&h=7770195&recoff=&ml_rpos=1. 1881 census? Bouchier, James. M Artillery, 1849. Discharge papers; good character, Indian Mutiny medal, rose to Bombardier at which level he transferred to RA, but then reduced back down to Gunner; served until 16/09/68 when he had served 21 yrs; aged 20 when entered 39 on leaving; 5ft 8, grey eyes, brown hair; intending to live in Limerick. WO97/1309/179. Death record of a JB who seems to fit, in Limerick District 1885; vol. 5 p. 327.

Bourke, Michael. M Artillery, 1841. Started in 2nd batt but changed to 1st then 4th; conduct good at all times; Kilmurry; WO97/1209/120.

Bourke, Stephen. Bo Artillery `847. Clive pension; entered May 1861 at 9d rate; 5ft 8½, brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 34, 14years service; unfit for further service; to reside in Pallaskenry; L-AG-23-2-66.

Boyle, Michael. M Infantry 1840. Clive pension; entered December 1860, at 1/- rate; 5ft 5, brown hair, hazel eyes, fresh complexion; age 38, 21yrs 8mths service; time expired; to reside in Shanagolden; L-AG-23-2-66.

Boyle, William. Bo Infantry, 1855. 1861, discharge papers from 2/25th Foot; served 18th Jan 1860 to 10th Oct 1861, contains note that he claimed to have served 4yrs in Bombay Fusiliers and discharged Jan 1860; good character, one entry in defaulters' book; unfit for further service with phthisis (TB); 28yrs 8mths on discharge, 5ft 8¾, grey eyes, dark brown hair; cut scar on forehead; to reside in Limerick; WO90/1476/167. Nov. 1861, entered in Limerick pension book as new arrival; WO22/192 Limerick. Discharge papers from Bombay; age 30; 5ft 8½, dark brown hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes; discharged 10th January 1860; made his mark; L/MIL/12/284 (LDS 2029782, 262).

Bradish, Patrick. Be Artillery, 1860. Discharge papers, Ballincollig 23rd sept 1879; discharged unfit, after 19yrs 105 days' service; conduct fair, 24 times in defaulters' book; 334 days in local Indian Artillery before joining RA, 5ft 10, brown hair vaccination mark on right arm, 21 when joined; medical history with, a lot of ague 9 malaria) treated with quinine; reason for discharge chronic hepatitis; 40 yrs 3 mths at discharge; 5ft 7½ (sic) at discharge, blue eyes; vaccination mark on left (sic) arm, to live in Dublin; WO97/1770/124.

Brazil, Patrick. Be Cavalry, 1858. Discharge papers, Colchester 25th Feb. 1878; unfit for further service after 22 yrs 51 days, 15yrs in India; 2 good conduct badges, 7 times in defaulters' book; to 20th Hussars in Feb. 1861 and to 11th Hussars in Sept. 1872; 2 boon years; discharged with bronchitis; born St John's; 24 yrs 9 months at entry, 46 yrs 11 months at discharge; 5ft 4, hazel eyes, brown hair; to reside at Collyhurst Road, Manchester; medical history with; WO97/1725/106.

Brohan, Michael. M Infantry, 1840. Not in list of convicts in Australia;

Brown, John. Does not appear in presidency list. Be. Artillery, labourer, from St. Michael's, attested at Limerick, 5 February 1845, age 25; at discharge 5ft 7¾, fresh complexion, grey eyes, grey hair, to reside in Limerick; rose gradually to sergeant by 1854; transferred to Royal Artillery 1865 and discharged 29 May 1866; conduct 'exemplary': Indian pension rules; no mention of field medals; WO97/1310/196

Brown, Michael. Bo. Artillery, 1830. Clive pension; entered July 1852 at 1/- rate; 5ft 8, light brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; servant; age 40, 21yrs 6 mths service; at own request; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Brown, Thomas. Bo Infantry, 1839. Discharge papers; 38½; 5ft 5½. Sandy hair, fresh complexion, blue eyes; from St Mary's, made mark; pensioned at 1/- in Europe; papers signed 12th May 1860; L/MIL/12/286 (LDS2029840, 193). Clive pension; Thomas E. Brown; 20 yrs 6 months service; time expired; to live in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Brown, William. Be Infantry, 1847. Discharge papers; Cawnpore, Dec. 20th 1866; unfit for further service after 19 yrs 334 days' service 17 in India; Indian pension rules; 4 good conduct badges, Burma medal and Indian Mutiny Medal with two clasps (for defence and capture of Lucknow, as corporal); 4 times in defaulters' book and 3 courts martial; promoted to sergeant twice and reduced to private twice, finishing at that level; 2 boon years; unfit due to rheumatism, asthma and defective

vision; born Dromkeen parish, 21 yrs at entry, 40yrs 6mths at discharge; 5 ft 7¼, grey eyes, light brown hair; to reside in Birmingham; WO97/1678/31.

Brown, William. Be Artillery. Labourer from Abington, attested at Limerick 14 April 1847, age 21. No unit stated on papers. Rose to sergeant by 4 May 1854 and then transferred as sergeant to Town Major's List until 8 December 1857; he was then remanded to the artillery as sergeant and from 1859 to 181 was rough rider and farrier, when he transferred to the Royal Artillery as sergeant at which rank he remained until discharged 21st August 1866. Character 'very good', chose Indian pension rules after 21yrs service. He was wounded at Havelock's relief of Lucknow 24 September 1857, by a musket ball to the left hand; his papers marked 'no court of enquiry held' (suggestive of friendly fire?). His absence from the casualty roll is probably because he was on the Town Major's List at the time and not with a unit. 5ft 7¾, fresh complexion, grey eyes, light brown hair; to reside at Lahore. Mutiny Medal with defence and recapture clasps, WO97/1310/247.

Burke, Andrew. Be Cavalry, 1860. Discharge papers; 2ndEC; age 23yrs 10mths at discharge with 1yr 277days service; 5ft 1¾, fair hair, fresh complexion, blue eyes; signed papers; L/MIL/10/304 (LDS 1867086, 918).

Burke, James. Be Infantry. This man does not seem to be in presidency list. Letter about him to EIC. "Limerick Dec. 3rd '50; The Secretary Military Department. Hon'd Sir I humbly request an answer to my letter dated the 10th October regarding the amount of the effects of the late James Burke, private in the 2nd Bengal Fusilier Regt. who died on the 1st June 1849. Hon'd Sir I hope that I do not presume to trouble you too much. I assure you that my not receiving an answer to my former letter troubles my mind very much. Hon'd Sir I have enclosed your letter of the 21st June showing my punctuality to time. I am your honours most obedt. and very humble servant, James Burke, father of the deceased soldier. PS Please direct to Mr Andrew Caswell?, George's Quay". Marked, "mother Ellen Burke, Mary Street Limerick, see 14 August 492". NLI Ms13,686.

Burke, Thomas. M. Infantry, ? Not in presidential list. Clive pension; February 1840, at 9d rate; age 30, 12yrs 1mth service; fair complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; slater; loss of the use of 2 fingers of right hand; L-AG-23-2-65.

Burke, Thomas. Be Infantry, 1849. Discharge papers, Walmer? 20th April 1868; 21yrs 7 mths service, 13 years in India; Indian pension rules; 2 good conduct badges; Burma medal with clasp for Pegu and Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for Delhi and Lucknow; 5 times in defaulters' book and twice court martialled; rose to sergeant in company service at which rank he transferred to 101st; tried for absence and reduced to private, at which rank he saw out term; 2 boon years; 20 at entry, 39 at discharge; 5 ft 10½, blue eyes brown hair; 23½ Hampton Street, Birmingham; WO97/1678/35. Does not seem to be at that address in 1871 census.

Butler, James, M Artillery, 1847. Clive pension; entered August 1856 at 9d rate; 5ft 8, dark brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; 31yrs old; 8yrs 7months service; being unfit for any further service from loss of vision of the right eye and imperfect vision of the left; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

***Butler, James.** M Infantry, 1847. Discharge papers 23/11/66; good character, 2 good conduct medals, medal for Burma (14th Sept 1852 to end of war) and 2 medals for Lucknow (Defence and

Lucknow); 6mth imprisoned for unspecified crime; to Royal Artillery in 1862 as gunner; 1yr's boon service for time at Lucknow; married **Catherine Sands**, widow of Corporal Sands MF, at Bangalore 13/09/59; blue eyes, light brown hair; WO97/1721/86. Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for Defence of Lucknow and taking of Lucknow during the Indian Mutiny (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Buttermore/Buttimer, Maurice. Bo Infantry, 1827. Clive pension; July 1831 at 9d rate; age 24, 3yrs service; 5ft 8, pale complexion, blue eyes, light brown hair; loss of two fingers of left hand; L-Ag-23-2-65.

Byrnes, James. Be Infantry, 1854. A James Byrne won Indian Mutiny medal with clasp for Delhi.

Cagney, John. Be Infantry, 1852. Indian Mutiny Medal with clasp for Delhi, as private. Wounded in shoulder at Delhi (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny); invalided because of wounds. A man of this name and presumed to be him, but a corporal, is listed in the pension records as entering pension in Limerick district in Aug. 1858 at 9d rate; and moving to Jersey; see both WO22/182 Limerick & WO23/22 East India Company pensioners. In pension book in Jersey 1866-74; WO23/23 East India Company pensioners. 1861 census has him as EIC pensioner, age 31, at 15 Parade Place, St. Helier, Jersey, with wife Sarah, 30, a laundress and son John born 1860 <https://www.findmypast.co.uk/transcript?id=GBC%2F1861%2F0021447016>. 1871 census, with children George 4, William 1 and Patrick 0, John had presumably died, in Saville St., St. Helier, <https://www.findmypast.co.uk/transcript?id=GBC%2F1871%2F0022624036>. 1881, census, a widower and grocer, with two sons, both scholars, George and Patrick, 10 Parade Place, <https://www.findmypast.co.uk/transcript?id=GBC%2F1881%2F0026009600>. 1891 census, remarried to Louisa, age 50; son Patrick, unmarried, now a draper's assistant; two step daughters and stepson, Jessie, 20, Elsie 16, and William 18, surname Russell; at Balien Lodge, St Saviours Road, St. Helier <https://www.findmypast.co.uk/transcript?id=GBC%2F1891%2F0031690953>. 1901 census, pensioner again, with Louisa, son Leo C, single, 19, draper's assistant and Kathleen C, daughter, single, pupil teacher (neither appeared earlier), at 11 Simon Place, St. Helier; <https://www.findmypast.co.uk/transcript?id=GBC%2F1901%2F0033815913>. 1911 census John and Louisa only, still at Simon Place <https://www.findmypast.co.uk/transcript?id=GBC%2F1911%2FRG14%2F34895%2F0115%2F1>

Cahill, Maurice. M Infantry, 1846. Lord Clive Pension fund; admitted to pension 14th Dec 1860 at rate of 1/-; 5ft 5, fair hair blue eyes residing in Limerick, unfit for further service, loss of left arm; L-AG-23-2-66. Pension permanent WO23/19. Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for defence and capture of Lucknow during the Indian Mutiny; loss of arm (see Hodkinson, "Limerickmen")

Callaghan, Daniel. M Infantry, 1846. Pensioned in Limerick paid through Tralee District, 1/-, 8th April 1882, WO 22/224. Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for defence and capture of Lucknow (see Hodkinson, "Limerickmen").

Callaghan, Michael. Bo Infantry, 1838. Clive pension; September 1842 at 9d rate; age 26, 4yrs 1mth service; 5ft 7, fresh complexion, grey eyes, light brown hair; lameness from injury of loins;

Callaghan, Owen. M Artillery, 1825. 1840, Lord Clive Fund Pensioner L-AG-23-2-38. 1840, bombardier at discharge; age 33; 5ft 5½, dark grey eyes, brown hair; worn out. 9d rate, L-AG-23-2-65. 1849, transfer from Limerick to Tralee district WO 22/198. Payment book with year columns to

1858 and he is not marked as deceased WO 23/21. Seems to have been in Deptford in 1864 moved back in 1865 to Tralee WO 23/22. Died 03/03/71, WO 23/23.

Canavan, Thomas. Bo Artillery, 1840. Clive pension; entered August 1861 at 1/- rate; 5ft 8¾, black hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 42, 22yrs service; time expired; to retire to Glin; L-AG-23-2-66.

Caneen, Michael. (Recte Cunneen?) M Infantry, 1839. Seems to have immediately deserted, Army Deserters 1828-1840.

Cannon, Thomas. Be Artillery, 1859. Discharge papers; Woolwich, June 6th 1873; found unfit after 13yrs 67 days, 11yrs 2 days in India; fair conduct, 12 times in defaulters' book and 3 courts martial; at Simla in 1870 in order to complete 21 yrs; dismissed for insanity expressing itself as melancholia and listlessness, unlikely to be able to look after himself; born St. Michael's, 20yrs at entry, 33 yrs 6 mths at discharge; 5ft 4, blue eyes, light brown hair; mark of burn over lumbar region; to live in Limerick; WO97/1776/81.

Carey, Richard. Be Artillery, 1842. Clive Fund pension book; admitted on 1/- rate, 1st June 1862; 5ft 8¾, brown hair, grey eyes; age 42; 21.5yrs service; time expired; to reside in Mallow, Co. Cork; L-AG-23-2-66.

Cariver/Carver, Patrick. Bo Infantry, 1853; not in presidential list, surname difficult to make out;. Discharge papers; private in 3ER; age 23 when discharged 30th September 1859; 5ft 5¾ brown hair fresh complexion, hazel eyes; a labourer from Kilfinnan; made his mark; L/MIL/12/286 (LDS 2029840, 104).

Carmody/Carmoody, Patrick. M store sergeant, 1814. 1837 Lord Clive pension to, paid in Ireland, L-AG-23-2-37. I assume the next entry is the same man, though detail varies a bit. Clive pension; entered December 1835 at 2/- rate; age 39 21yrs 10mths service; 5ft 7, fair complexion, grey eyes and hair; currier; unfit for any service from habitual ulcers?; L-AG-23-2-65.

Carroll, Martin. Bo Artillery, 1852. Does not seem to be in presidency list (possibly given as Co.Kerry in that). Labourer, from Tarbert, enlisted Cork 23rd August 1852. Discharged 7th October 1859, age 27. 5ft 8¾, light brown hair, fresh complexion, hazel eyes. L/MIL/12/282 (LDS 2020780, 776).

Carroll, Michael. Bo Artillery, 1826. Clive pension; farrier 1st troop Bo HA; retired in India 1847, allowed to return to Europe; entered 7th March 1854 at 1/-; 6ft 3, brown hair, blue eyes, fair hair; 48 yrs old; 21yrs 3months service; discharged at own request; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Carroll, Thomas. Be Artillery, 1850. Discharge papers, Umballa 29th Nov 1870; 22yrs 255 days service, including 2yr boon; termination of 2nd enlistment; conduct good; in defaulters' book twice both of which ended in court martial; rose to battery Sergeant Major in company service, at which level he transferred to RA; survived 1st court martial but demoted on second to private, working his way back to sergeant by discharge; age 20 on entry, 41 on discharge; 5ft 11½, hazel eyes, brown hair; to reside in Calcutta; WO97/1776/41.

Casey, Charles. Be Infantry, 1860. Discharge papers; Dum Dum 12th December 1870; 21yrs 4mths service, 10yrs former service in 75th included; 4 good conduct badges, twice in defaulters' book and two courts martial; rose to colour sergeant before being reduced to private in 1865, rising again to

sergeant; discharged with completed service and invalided with chronic rheumatism, but able to support himself; 28yrs and 5mths at entry (to EIC), 39yrs 6 mths at discharge; 5ft 7¾, blue eyes, grey hair; to reside at Herbertstown Co. Limerick; marked increased to 1/9 16/05/71; WO97/1911/187. Pension book records entry 29th March 1871; sergeant, conduct v. good; WO121/0227. Certificate that an out pensioner of Chelsea Hospital 4th April 1871, at rate of 1/3; WO90/1687/22. April and July 1882, being paid from Tralee district at Bruff; but crossed out in July; WO22/224 Tralee; ditto Jan 1883; WO22/225 Tralee.

Casey, Joseph. Be Infantry, 1839. Lord Clive pension entry; Sergeant major on unattached list; admitted 20th May 1862 at 2/6 rate; 5ft 8, dark hair, brown eyes; v. good conduct; 24 yrs 5mths service (2yr boon presumed), time expired; residing in Dublin; L-AG-23-2-66 & WO23/19. Payment book 1866-76, seems to be in Limerick throughout; WO23/23 East India Company pensioners. Pension book 1882, in as EIC pensioner paid through Tralee payable at Limerick; WO224/224 Tralee.

Caulfield, John. Be Infantry 1839. Lord Clive pension book; entered 17th June 1856; private at 1/- rate; 5ft 6, brown hair, blue eyes; age 38 good conduct; 16yrs 5mth service; disability, wounded in the right arm in action; to live in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. Died Jan 2 1857, recorded in pension book; WO23/21 East India Company pensioners. Cannot identify which action he was wounded in; no 2nd ER in either Crimea or Burma which seem to be the only wars that fit; possibly a minor local policing action.

Chamberlain, James. BE Infantry, 1849. Pension book, Limerick district, new out pensioner admitted 11th Aug. 1858 at 9d rate; WO22/182 Limerick. Wounded at Delhi (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny). Awarded Indian Mutiny Medal with clasp for Delhi.

Cherry, Patrick. Be 2nd Cavalry, 1857. Discharge papers; tailor, enlisted in Limerick; 5ft 2¾, brown hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes; discharged 12/10/1859 at own request, age 21yrs 10mths; made mark; L/MIL/10/304 (LDS 1867086, 1113).

Christie, John. M.Arillery, 1824. Clive pension; September 1839 at 9d rate; age 40, 14yrs 9mths service; 5ft 8¾, sallow complexion, hazel eyes, brown hair; shopkeeper; broken down constitution; L-AG-23-2-65.

Clancy, Michael. M Infantry 1853? Clive pension; entered June 1859 at 6d rate; 5ft 5½, dark brown hair, dark eyes, sallow complexion; age 24 2yrs 6mths service; insanity; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. Dates do not tally properly with presidential list.

Clarke, Thomas. Be Artillery, 1851. Clive pension book; entered 14th Aug. 1862; 5ft 8¾, brown hair, grey eyes; age 36; conduct good; 11 yrs 11 months, permanent shortening of right leg; to reside at Laracan, Lucan, Dublin; L-AG-23-2-66. Seems to be with Horse Artillery 2t 1b when wounded at Delhi (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny). His name does not appear in Mutiny Medal list, but I suspect this may be because his unit is omitted from the online list; I tried two other names, gleaned from the casualty list, without success. Clive pension; to live at Laracan, Lucan, Dublin; L-AG-23-2-66.

Cleary, Matthew. Be Infantry 1817. Lord Clive pension book 1834; age 35; 5ft 7, 15yrs 11 months service; grey eyes, brown hair; shoemaker (=cordwainer); 9d rate; worn out; L-AG-23-2-65. May 1855, transferred to Ennis district from Limerick; WO22/172 Ennis. Died 16th March 1856; WO22/172 Ennis.

Cleary, Robert. Be Infantry, 1860. Discharge papers; originally with 53rd Regt, 1847-60, transferred as private to 6th ER, promoted corporal then transferred to 101st at that level; granted 1 yr boon service for relief of Lucknow; discharged at Cawnpore 24th Oct. 1867; found unfit for further service, after 21 yrs; good conduct badges, 4; defaulters' book 5 times, tried once; rheumatism which militates against him earning a living; born in parish of Ballylanders nr Kilfinnan; 18yrs 6 mths at entry; 5ft 10¼, hazel eyes, dark brown hair; place of residence, Limerick crossed out and Calcutta inserted; WO97/1678/53. Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for relief and capture of Lucknow (in 53rd). Pension being paid in Bengal to 1878; 1/4d; WO 22/230 Bengal.

Coleman, Thomas. Bo Artillery, 1857. Discharge papers; 4th July 1857, 23 yrs old, 5ft 9¼, brown hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes. L/MIL/12/282 (LDS 2020780, 838).

Collins, Andrew. Bo Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers; age 26 when discharged 10th September 1859; enlisted at Castleconnell; 5ft 6½, dark brown hair, fresh complexion, hazel eyes. L/MIL/12/286 (LDS 2029840, 130).

Collins, John. M Infantry, 1847 & 1859. Discharge papers show he originally served with the 2nd regiment, entered 1847, and in 1859 re-enlisted in India to the 1st, later 102nd; thus two entries in Madras list are for the same man; conduct very good, 6 times in defaulters book, final discharge 4th Oct 1869; Labourer, from White George parish Limerick (sic); 38yrs 9mths at discharge, 5ft 6½, grey eyes, brown hair, tattoo on right forearm; intending to reside at Cannanore, Madras Presidency WO97/1680/41. Record of pension 1868-70, WO22/270 Madras. Indian rules pension, WO23/152 Admission book: pensions payable in the colonies. Pension marked as paid quarterly 1871 to 3rd quarter 1874, WO 22/268 India Presidencies.

Collins, Michael. Be Artillery 1854. Discharge papers; Morar Gwalior, 9th Nov. 1863; 11yrs 146 days service, 9 yrs 4 months in India; recommended discharge by medical report; Pension Indian Regs; 2 good conduct badges and Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for Delhi and capture of Lucknow; twice in defaulters' book; "wounded at the storming of Delhi, 14th Sept. 1857, by a musket ball in left instep which has left a faint scar"; 2yr boon, promoted to bombardier in Company service and corporal in RA; Ophthalmia scrofulous; "he may assist in earning his livelihood"; 20 yrs at entry, 32 at discharge; 5ft 11, grey eyes, brown hair; Doon crossed out and Kilkenny inserted as residence; notes at bottom, 6d permanent June 1868, raised to 9d Feb. 1873, increased to 10d 1874, further notes to May 1890; WO90/1314/164.

Collins, Michael. Be Infantry, 1858. Discharge papers; Brighton 4th August 1877; engaged into Bengal European Cavalry, transferring to the 20th Hussars; termination of 2nd engagement; very good conduct, 4 badges, 6 times in defaulters' book; 2boon years; born in St John's; age 20 at entry, 39 at discharge; hazel eyes, brown hair; place to reside unclear; WO97/1728/217.

Collins, Thomas. Of Rathkeale. Attested to EIC infantry 1st Sept 1846 at Limerick. Served 212 days before transferring to the 76th Reg. where he served until discharged with lung disease 28 Nov 1854 aged 26 yrs, 5ft 8¾. Grey eyes, brown hair labourer. One court martial on Malta 1851 for leaving his post while on sentry duty, sentenced to 84 days hard labour, WO/97/872/114. Temporary out pension 1854, 6d to be paid until Dec 19th 1856, Limerick district. WO 22/182. Marked as deceased 8th Jan 1855 aged 26, WO 22/182.

Collins, Timothy. Be recruit. Shipwrecked on the Protector 1838 (see Hodkinson, Protector).

Connell, Denis/Dennis. Bo Infantry, 1824; Clive pension book; colour sergeant 2ER; pensioned in India 1841; entered June 1853 at 1/- rate; 5ft 5¾, grey hair, hazel eyes, fair complexion; 49 yrs old, 17yrs 11 months service; servant; sprained left knee; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Connell, Patrick. Bo Artillery, 1850. Discharge papers 27th June 1862; age 24 at enlistment; 13yrs service includes 2 boon years; discharged unfit having lost thumb of left hand by accidental discharge of a gun; served in the Persian expedition and present at the siege of Gwalior, so presumably held India General Service Medal with clasp for Persia and Indian Mutiny medal with clasp for Central India. L/MIL/12/282 (LDS 9751, 5-11). Clive pension; 5ft 9⅞, sandy hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; age 35, 14yrs service; unfit for further service; to reside in St Lukes?? L-AG-23-2-66.

Connell, Timothy. Bo Infantry, 1847. Discharge papers; from St. Mary's; 32 at discharge; 5ft 6½, black hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes; discharge 11th January 1860; L/MIL/12/284 (LDS 2029782, 440).

Connolly, Michael. Private, 1st M infantry. Discharged 15th Sept 1859 from EIC. For some unknown reason he is not in the presidency list. A labourer from Rathkeale, he enlisted at Nenagh 1st Sept 1856. 5ft 6¼, with fair hair, fresh complexion and blue eyes. Made his mark. L/MIL/11/279 (LDS1886125).

Connors, James. Be Artillery, 1823. Clive pension; gunner; May 1845 at 1/- rate; age 40, 21yrs 4mths service; 5ft 6½, fresh complexion, blue eyes, light brown hair; unfit for active service; L-AG-23-2-65.

Connors, John. Bo Infantry, 1841. Clive pension; 3ER; entered September 1860 at 1/- rate; 5ft 4½, dark brown hair, hazel eyes, fresh complexion; age 38, 19yrs 3mths service; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Connors, John. Be 1st Cavalry, 1858. Discharge papers; age 21 when attested 11 August 1858; 5ft 4, bron hair, dark complexion, grey eyes; 11th August 1859 discharged; signed form; L/MIL/10/303 (LDS1867085 /439).

Connors, Michael. Be Infantry, 1841. Clive pension; entered June 1856 at 9d rate; brown hair, grey eyes, swarthy complexion; listed as servant; 45yrs old, 14yrs 4months service; broken down constitution; to reside Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Connors, Patrick. Be Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers; Chichester 5th March 1874; 22yrs 269 days' service of which 16yrs 2mths in India; termination of 2nd period of engagement, pension under Indian Regs; Indian Mutiny medal, 4 times in defaulters' book, three courts martial; rose to corporal in Company service but tried and reduced; opted for local service in 1859, rising back to corporal; given 2 yr boon; transferred into 107th as corporal, rising to sergeant before reduction to private again; rose again ending as colour sergeant; born St. John's; age at entry 20, at discharge 40yrs 10 mths; 5ft 9¾, hazel eyes, brown hair; lost sight of right eye; to live in Cardiff; WO97/1923/6. In 1881 census at 113 Bedford St Cardiff, as Pensioner Colour Sergeant of the Royal Glamorgan Militia, married to Mary Anne age 26 from Limerick (very young to have an 11 yr old, 2nd marriage?); 6 children, William

Samuel, age 11, scholar born in India, Patrick Joseph, scholar, age 10 born Aldershot, Mary Anne Alice, age 8, born Chichester, Margaret M, 5, scholar, born Cardiff, Charles James, 3, born Cardiff and George Fergus, 2, born Cardiff.

Considine, Anthony. Be Artillery, 1826. Clive Fund pension book; admitted 4th July 1849, at 1/- rate; 5ft 6, sandy hair, grey eyes; age 44; good conduct; 21yr 2mths service; time expired; to reside in Ennistimon, Co. Clare; L-AG-23-2-66. 1849 entry to pension book Ennis district as new out pensioner; July & August; WO22/171 Ennis. Entered in pension book as deceased 20th June 1850; WO22/171 Ennis. Death also recorded at WO23/21 East India Company pensioners & L-AG-23-2-68.

Considine, Jeremiah. Be Infantry, 1826. Clive pension; 21st June 1848 admitted to pension; worn out; age 46, 5ft 5½, 21yrs 3 mths service; hazel eyes, dark brown hair; 1/- rate; L-AG-23-2-65, Lord Clive Fund: Register of admissions in the UK. A Lord Clive pensioner JC died 27th March 1849; L-AG-23-2-67. (An explanation of why he was invalided in 1841 in Bengal list and only entered pension in 1849, may be that he was invalided in India for several years).

Considine, Michael. M Infantry, 1852. Discharge papers from 102nd regiment, April 1870, chose India rules pension, good conduct, medals for Burma and Mutiny, in 1859 chose local service entering regular army in 1861; born St. John's parish, age 20 on entry; 5ft 6, hazel eyes, brown hair, tattoo on right forearm; intending to reside in Limerick, WO97/1923/99. Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for Defence of Lucknow and taking of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Conway, James. Be Artillery, 1826. Clive pension; corporal; May 1845 at 1/- rate; age 41, 21yrs 4mths service; 5ft 8, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; impaired constitution; L-AG-23-2-65.

Conway, James. Be Artillery, 1851. Discharge papers; Lucknow 24th Oct 1870; 20yrs 363 days service; at end of second period of engagement, Indian pension rules; 4 good conduct badges; three times in defaulters' book; gunner throughout; moved from 22nd to 24th brigade RA; 2yr boon; born in parish of Newport near Munfort? Co. Limerick; 20 when joined 39yrs 3 months at discharge; 5ft 10, hazel eyes, dark brown hair; to reside in Limerick; O97/1780/72.

Conway, Morgan. Be Infantry, 1846. Indian Mutiny medal with clasp for Delhi; his severe wound presumably precluded him from participation at Lucknow.

Corbett, John. Be Artillery, 1860. Discharge papers; Dublin, 10th Nov. 1868; medically unfit after 7yrs 266 days; bad conduct, no badges, 23 times in defaulters' book and three courts martial; to 24th brigade, then 16th, then depot then 9th; once transferred to 16th (1862-8) he spent much time awaiting trial and in garrison cells; I cannot make out his diagnosis, but he passes water constantly day and night; born St. John's; age 20 at entry, 28yrs 5mth at discharge; 5ft 10, light blue eyes, light brown hair; intending to live in Limerick; WO97/1315/222.

Costello, Andrew. M Infantry, 01/08/56. Discharged 15th Sept 1859 from EIC. Enlisted age 21, 5ft 5½, brown hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes. Made mark L/MIL/11/279 (LDS1886125)

Costolloe, Patrick. Be Artillery, 1847. Discharge papers; Moultan, 17th Nov 1865; 20yrs 169 yrs service, 18 in India; unfit for further service, choosing English rules; 3 good conduct badges and Indian Mutiny medal (but not in Medal Roll); 3 times in defaulters' book, one court martial; seems to sign himself Costelloe; bombardier and corporal by 1851, then back to gunner, and rising to corporal

again by 1861 at which rank he transferred to RA, then demoted back down to gunner at which rank he was discharged; discharged for Asthma, serious enough to not continue in service but capable of earning livelihood; born Kilrush parish, Kilrush, Co. Limerick; 20 at entry 39yrs 1 mth at discharge date 3rd July 1866; 5ft 6¾, blue eyes, brown hair; to live in Dublin; WO97/1315/191.

Cotter, William. Be 2nd Cavalry, 1858. Discharge papers; labourer from Newcastle; age 21; discharged August 1859, at own request; made mark; 5ft 4, fair hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; L/MIL/10/304 (LDS 1867086, 1348).

Coughlin/Coughlan, Patrick. M Artillery 1821. Clive pension; sergeant; entered June 1834 at 9d rate; age 37, 12yrs service; 5ft 7, fresh complexion, blue eyes, dark hair; unfit for any duty from rheumatism; L-Ag-23-2-65.

Cox, John. Be Artillery, 1860. Discharge papers; Lucknow 24th Oct 1864; 4yrs 155 days' service, 3 yrs 323 in India; unfit for further service; good conduct badge; enlisted in HM Indian Artillery, transferring to RA in 1861; bombardier then corporal to end of service; discharged with morbus val?? Cordis (heart disease); can engage in employment not requiring exertion; born St Mary's; 22 at entry; 27yrs 1 month at discharge; 5ft 5, grey eyes, dark brown hair; to reside in Limerick; annotated Dead but no date (I presume close to discharge); WO97/1315/ 123.

Creagan, John. Be Infantry, 1841. Discharge papers; Bareilly 9th Sept 1864, 104th Regt; 25yrs 125 days service, 22yrs 8 mths in India; 25yrs service with Indian pension; 5 good conduct badges; transferred as corporal to local service then 104th in 1861; 2 boon years; born St. John's; 19 at entry; 5ft 6, blue eyes, light brown hair; to reside in Calcutta; note at end suggest he might have returned to Limerick in 1879; WO97/1683/53. In pension book 1865 at 1/- rate, WO23/152 Admission book: pensions payable in the colonies. Pension book showing Calcutta to 1873 when he returned to Limerick; WO23/61. Pension book showing he was paid to 31/12/1872 and transferred to Limerick; WO22/168 Indian Presidencies. Pension book showing payment through Tralee pension district April 1882; WO22/224 Tralee, and Jan 1883; WO22/225 Tralee. Interestingly no Sikh War or Indian Mutiny medal noted, on his papers and medal roll, despite 2nd Bengals being in action. Muster roll for the regiment (not consulted) may explain where he was. A John Creagan is listed in the Mutiny Medal Roll with clasp for Delhi.

Creat, Michael. Be Infantry, 1850. Clive Pension fund; entry 11th Aug 1858, 9d rate; 5 ft 6, dark brown hair, hazel eyes; age 27, good conduct; 7yr 1 month; fracture of lower jaw by musket ball at Delhi; to reside at Dorchester; L-AG-23-2-66. Transfer from Salisbury district, to Jersey district 31/12/58; WO22/206 (Two one either end). 1864 from Jersey to Dorchester then back in 1865 WO 23/22 East India pensioners. Indian Mutiny medal with Delhi clasp, but does not figure in Casualty Roll (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny).

Cregan, John. Be Infantry, 1852. Indian Mutiny medal with clasp for Delhi.

Cremmin/Crimmins, John. Bo artillery, 1834. As Crimmins, killed at Multan 19th Jan 1849, next of kin unknown; L/MIL/261; p214 of film.

Cronin, Michael. Bo Infantry, 1837. Discharge papers; age 43½ at discharge; 5ft 6¾, brown hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes; 1/- a day pension in Europe; signed papers; discharge 30th April 1860;

L/MIL/12/284 (LDS 2029782, 488). Entered pension list 1st Nov 1860 in Limerick district WO22/182. & WO23/19 & Clive pension; L-AG-23-2-66.

Cronin, Timothy. Be Infantry, 1841. July 1846 admitted to Clive Pension, age 23, 5ft 5¼, blue eyes, brown hair; 9d rate; nearly blind from Ophthalmia; L-AG-23-2-65 UK admissions.

Crough, John. Be Infantry, 1842. Clive Pension June 1847 at 9d rate; 28yrs old; 3yrs 9mths service; 5ft 6½, grey eyes, brown hair; wound in right wrist and elbow; annotated that pension increase to 1/- 25th Feb 1885 and to 1/3 on 19th June 1894; L-AG-23-2-65. Presumed to have been wounded in the First Sikh War. Pension book covering 1849-58 places payments to him in London 1/5/52, Woolwich and 2nd London ¼ and 1/11/1856 and Clonmel 1/2/58; WO23/21 East India Company pensioners. April 1852 transfers from S. London to 2nd Western pension district; 9 d rate; pensioned from 9th June 1847; WO22/62 London South. 1855, W. London to Woolwich WO22/57 London 2nd W. Oct. 1856, from Woolwich to West London; WO22/65 Woolwich. Jan 1858, W. London to Clonmel; WO22/57 W. London. March 1858, to Limerick from Clonmel; WO22/182 Limerick. Jan 1859 transfer from Ennis to Limerick and also March; WO22/172 Ennis and WO22/182 Limerick (Twice). May 1860 Limerick to Waterford; WO22/182 Limerick. June 1860 Waterford to Manchester; WO22/203 Waterford. Pension book 1858-65 puts him in Clonmel at start to Limerick 1858, Ennis then Limerick in 1859, then Waterford and Manchester 1860; WO23/22 East India Company pensioners. Pension book 1867-75, moving back and forth from Limerick to Manchester; WO23/23 East India Company pensioners. 1882 in Clonmel district, payable at Tipperary; WO22/215 Clonmel. The 1861 Census has John Crough, 43, born 1818, at 9 Boscens Buildings Manchester, an out pensioner of Chelsea, born in Ireland, together with wife Margaret, 42, born Ireland; son, 13, a cotton dyer, born in London; and Margaret, 12, Mary, 10, Anne, 7 and Hannah 4, all born in London. The 1871 census has them John and Margaret, together with Margaret, Mary, Anne and Honora (sic) and Patrick O Crough, a nephew, age 23 born Ireland, all living at Delauney's Yard, Crumpsall, Manchester. Some of the entries in the Manchester rate books may pertain to this family; I have not gone into them in detail (available on findmypast).

Crow, John. Be Artillery, 1838. Clive Pension book; admitted at 9d rate, on 10th June 1857; 5ft 9, brown hair, grey eyes; age 51; 17 yrs 1 month service; disability and broken constitution; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. June 1857 newly entered out pensioner in Limerick district; WO22/182 Limerick. 1858-65 in pension book in Limerick WO23/22 East India Company pensioners. Pension record 1867-75; Limerick at start to Tralee district 1/11/67, back to Limerick 1/1/69 and still in Limerick 1875; WO 23/23 East India Company pensioners.

Crowe, James. Be Infantry, 1853. Letter; Soldier Inquiry 16th June 1859. EIC reply to Bridget Coffee enquiring about Private James Crowe, enclosing form to fill out; no address, NLI Ms13,686. 29th August 1859, letter from EIC to Bridget Coffee "The Under Secretary of State for India acquaints Bridget Coffee in reply to her letter of the 8th Inst that in order to prove that she alone is entitled to claim the effects of the late private James Crowe of the Bengal Establishment it will be necessary for her to forward to this office a certificate of her late husband's burial extracted from the parish register; private collection. Mortally wounded at Agra and died the same day (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny). Not in Indian Mutiny medal list.

Crowe, Michael. Bengal Artillery, 1859. There are two Michael Crowes in the Bengal list, both enlisting in 1859 at Dum Dum to separate companies of the Artillery; I suspect these are probably

one and the same person. Unfortunately the discharge papers are lacking the first 2 sides, which include his service record; on the 3rd side he is recorded as being discharged with Dementia (harmless), and on 4th side his home parish is given as Limerick near Limerick in Co. Clare, age 28 at entry; 33 possibly changed to 35 at discharge; 5ft 8½ grey eyes, brown hair; no indication as to where he will reside; WO97/1316/109. I further suspect, on the grounds that he was 28 enlisted in India, he may have served elsewhere, and there is a Michael Crow, enlisted 1849 in the Bombay Infantry, who is also from Limerick Clare, according to the Bombay presidency list, but there are discharge papers to match which show he continued in service into the 1860s . WO97/1316/108 discharge papers for same man, show he was allowed 10 yrs for service with the 5th Fusiliers and was entitled to the Mutiny Medal with clasp for Lucknow, and was discharged with dementia 25 September 1866.; these papers do not give place of origin.

Crowley, Patrick. Be Infantry, 1841. The camp where he died is in the Punjab so presumably with the regiment in 2nd Sikh War. Punjab batta roll gives his father's name as John; L/MIL/261; p208 of film.

Cunningham, Patrick. M Artillery, 1834. Clive Fund pension book; listed as Sergeant Major of 15th Madras Native Infantry, formerly of artillery; admitted to pension 11th August 1852; 5ft 10, brown hair, grey eyes; cause of discharge, leprosy; to reside in Tipperary L-AG-23-2-66. 1852, Tipp marked as Clonmel; WO23/17 Indian Army pensioners: registers of admission.

Curtin, James. M Artillery, 1837. Clive pension; entered April 1859 at 1/- rate; 5ft 7¾, dark brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 42, 21yrs service at own request born and retired to Shanagolden; L-AG-23-2-66.

Curtin, Michael. Be Infantry, 1853. Wounded at Futtehpoore Sikri; his name in this list is spelt Curtain (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny). Not in medal roll under either spelling.

Cusack, John. M Infantry, 1846. May 1861, admitted to pension, 5ft 5½, brown hair, blue eyes, 32 at discharge, unfit for further service; residence Limerick, WO23/19. Entered as permanent pensioner in Limerick District from June 1st 1861 at 8d rate, WO 22/182. Indian Mutiny medal, no clasps (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen"). Clive pension; L-AG-23-2-66.

Dailey, Michael. Be Infantry, 1849. Discharge papers, Meerut, 23rd Oct. 1862; age 20 at entry, 15 yrs 10 mths service; discharged for medical reasons, choosing British pension rules; two good conduct medals, 7 times in defaulters' book, one court martial; Indian Mutiny medal with clasp (for Delhi); Mallow Cork, at bottom of 1st page, residence?; re-engaged at Delhi, 29th June 1859 for 11 yrs; 2 boon years; page 3 where medical condition described is missing; WO97/1683/56.

Dalton, Michael. M Infantry 1827. Clive pension; thatcher; September 1842 at 9d rate; age 39, 14yrs 6mths service; 5ft 5, fair complexion, grey eyes, light hair; worn out constitution; L-AG-23-2-65.

Danaher, John. Be ?, 1860. A man of this name, private in the 101st, was paid a pension in Clonmel in Oct 1882 at 1/- rate; WO22/214 Clonmel. Ditto; see Jan 1883. The presidency list does not indicate a service, but with 21 yrs service he could just be a new pensioner.

Danaher, Joseph. Bo Artillery, 1847. Discharge papers, 5ft 7½, brown hair, fresh complexion, hazel eyes. Discharged 01/10/59 age 22. L/MIL/1282, (LDS 2029751, 125).

Dalton, Michael. M Infantry, 1827. 24th Nov 1842, transferred into Limerick pension district from Cork, WO22/181. 1855, May, a list has him back in Cork district, WO22/182.

De Lacy, Thomas. M Artillery, 1859. Discharge papers, Umballa, Nov 14th 1864; 5yrs 259 days' service, disabled by accident; good conduct no reprimands; once in RA became bombardier then corporal finishing as sergeant; lost his left hand by the bursting of a fowling piece while out shooting for his own amusement; 20 when enlisted, 26yrs 4 mths on discharge; 5ft 8, grey eyes, light hair; to reside in Limerick; WO97/1317/184. In 1871 census, as Sergeant Corps of Commissionaires, living at Tower St., St Giles, London, with wife, Mary A from Ireland, son age 4, born in Middlesex, and daughter, Margaret, age 2, born in Ireland.

Desmond, William. Be Cavalry, 1859. 1871 pension book of 21st Hussars (former 3rd Bengal European Cavalry), applied for discharge 28th Dec 1871 and discharged Jan 4th 1872, after 11 yrs service; WO121/0228. British Army Worldwide Index places him at Muttra in India in 1861 and Lucknow in 1871.

Dillane, John. M Infantry, 1827. 1842, Lord Clive pension payment book, 5ft 6, light eyes, brown hair; 9d rate 28th June; discharged with liver complaint; L-AG-23-2-65. 1844 payment list; L-AG-23-2-39. 1846, ditto, L-AG-23-2-40.

Dillon, David. M Infantry. 1837. 21st Dec 1852 admitted to permanent out pension in Limerick district, 9d; WO22/181. 1853, 5ft 6½, brown hair, grey eyes; age 37, broken constitution, born in and residing at Newcastlewest; WO23/17. 1854 transfer to Tralee WO22/199. 1854 moved to Tralee, 1855 forfeited pension by re-enlisting in a false name WO23/21. 1855 register Tralee section; section pensions ceased by felony, "absented himself in May 54 and has never been heard of since"; WO22/199. 31 March 1855, struck off for non-appearance, L-AG-23-2-68. Clive pension; 14yrs 9 months service; entered Dec 1852; L-AG-23-2-66.

Dillon, Michael. Bo Infantry, 1822. Not in presidential list, but in embarkation list. Clive pension; July 1840, at 9d rate; age 37, 14yrs 10mths service; 5ft 6½, fresh complexion, brown eyes, dark brown hair; general debility; L-AG-23-2-65.

Dillon, Michael. Be 2nd Cavalry, 1858. Discharge papers; labourer from St. Munchin's; enlisted Castleconnell age 20; 1yr 118 days service; discharged 21/08/1859 age 21yrs 9mths, at own request; made his mark; 5ft 2½, brown hair, fresh complexion, blue eyes; L/MIL/10/304 (LDS 1867086, 1622).

Dinan, Matthew. M Infantry, 1840. Indian Mutiny medal (no clasp); (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen")

Dineen, John. M Artillery, 1849. Discharge papers 3rd Sept 1869; chose Indian pension regulations, indifferent character, 16 times in defaulter's book; court-martialled several times and imprisoned 3, age 22 when attested; 42 when discharged 5 ft 10, Grey hair, light brown eyes, to reside in Limerick town; WO97/1318/71. 1883, still receiving pension; WO22/24.

Dixon, Martin. M Infantry, 1854. Discharge papers, 5th March 1873, 21 yrs service after a reenlistment; good character, medal for Mutiny with Central India clasp; a sergeant at discharge; tried by court martial (no explanation) in 1867 reduced from sergeant to private and worked way back to sergeant; 43 at discharge, 5ft 7, hazel eyes, dark brown hair; WO97/1940/53. Entered pension 25/3/73, at rate of 1/5d in Limerick; seems to move to Tullamore in 1874, Liverpool 1875

and London 1877; WO23/61. 1874 Transfer from Dublin to Tullamore; WO22/299. 1875, Tullamore to Liverpool; WO22/299.

Donohoe/Donoghoe, John. Bo Infantry, 1825. Clive pension; July 1841 at 9d rate; age 34, 16yrs service; 5ft 5¼, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; loss of teeth; L-AG-23-2-65.

Donohoe, John. Be Infantry, 1839. Clive Pension Register, age 25, 5ft 5½; 6yrs 1 months service; grey eyes, brown hair; 9d rate marked raised to 1/5, Sept. '79; pensioned from 22nd July 1846; almost blind from ophthalmia; L-AG-23-2-65.

Donohoe, Richard. Be Artillery 1856. Discharge papers; Woolwich, 23rd March 1875; 21yrs service, 9 yrs 10mths in India; termination of second enlistment; 4 good conduct medals and Indian Mutiny medal with clasp (Not named in medal roll); twice in defaulters' book and one court martial; rose to bombardier and reduced pre RA; in RA returned to bombardier and held rank when transferred into RHA in 1863; then to depot in '73; 2 boon years; born St. Mary's; age 24 at enlistment 46 yrs 1 mth on discharge; 5ft 8½, blue eyes, sandy hair; to reside at 41 Back King Street, unclear plcname, Birmingham; WO97/1785/82.

Donovan, Daniel. Be Infantry, 1839. Clive pension, entered 31st March 1860 at 2/6 rate; 5ft 5½, brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; good conduct, 20yrs 6 mths service; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. June 1860, Limerick district pension book, increase from 2/- to 2/6 ; WO22/182 Limerick.

Donovan/Donolan, Michael. Bo Artillery 1854. **Donolan** in presidential list; transfer from 57th Regiment, attested 16/08/54; served 3yrs 333days in Europe and 2yrs 361 days in India; served in Crimea; discharged 10/04/61 age 25yrs and 395 days. 5ft 9, fair hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; to reside in Croom. L/MIL/1282, (LDS 2029751, 213).

Donovan, Patrick. Be Cavalry, 1857. Discharge papers; from St. Mary'; age 27; discharged 9th August 1859; 5ft 0½, black hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes; made mark; L/MIL/10/303 (LDS1867085 /631).

Dooley, John. M Infantry, 1826. 1852, S. London pension book; admitted to out pension 29/6/42; transferred to 1st Northern pension division WO22/62. Clive pension; June 1842 at 9d rate; age 36m 14yrs 5mths service; 5ft 6½, fair complexion, hazel eyes, fair hair; labourer; ill health; L-AG-23-2-65.

Doran, Patrick. Bo Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers; 23 at discharge 10th September 1859; from Caherconlish; 5ft 5½, brown eyes, fresh complexion, hazel eyes; made mark; L/MIL/12/286 (LDS 2029840, 215).

Doris, John. M Artillery, 1839. Pension payment book, admitted to pension 22/3/54. 9d rate, S. Dublin division; transfers 1855 Carlow, 1856 Manchester & London, 1857 Belfast & Carlow; WO23/21. 1854 newly admitted in S. Dublin WO22/170. 1855 Carlow to Dublin; WO22/154. 1855, Clive pensioner, Carlow to Kildare Militia WO22/154. 1856 August, to Belfast from Kildare Militia, WO22/148. 1856 Oct. from Kildare Militia to 2 East London; WO 22/52 & WO22/148. 1856, August to Manchester from Kildare Militia; WO22/71. 1857 Feb. Manchester to Belfast; WO22/71 & WO22/148. 1857, Carlow District, October, transfer Belfast to Carlow WO22/154. 1857 Belfast from Carlow WO22/148. 1858 transfer Carlow to Limerick WO22/154. 1858 Dec. Carlow to Limerick WO 22/182. 5ft 8, Dark brown hair, blue eyes, age 36 at discharge, 12.5 yrs service; discharged for "loss

of power in the right leg caused by a fall from his horse on duty," born Parteen Limerick residence Dublin, WO23/18. (I wonder if he was involved in militia training because in Belfast he is listed next to a group of Antrim Militia Artillerymen). Died 21/9/1860 in Limerick; WO223/22.

Discharge papers, Dinapore 8th March 1867; Sergeant, 21yrs service, elected for HM pension rather than Company; good conduct; never in defaulter book or court martialled; corporal in EIC service; twice in Effective Supernumeraries rising to sergeant in HM army; trade, servant, born Ballybrown; 5ft 8, blue eyes, brown hair; intending to reside in Colchester; WO97/1684/58.

Dowdell, John. M ? Clive pension; quartermaster sergeant, entered January 1860 at 2/3d rate; 5ft 8½, light brown hair, blue eyes, fair hair; age 47, 24yrs service; to reside in Limerick; 4d a day to be deducted for wife in India; L-AG-23-2-66. Not in presidency list. Jan 1860, new out pensioner in Limerick district, WO22/182. Sept 1861 transferred to Toronto; WO22/182. Definitely Madras; WO23/19. Unclear record in Canada to 1864 then Hamilton 1865; WO23/22. 1867-75 seems to be in Hamilton; WO23/23. Died 12/5/81 at Hamilton CW (Canada West); L-AG-23-2-69.

Dower, Patrick. M Infantry, 1839. 1st Oct. 1860, admitted to pension; 5ft 4¾, black hair blue eyes, 48 at discharge after 22yrs 4mth service, to reside at Cashel; Clive pension; at own request; L-AG-23-2-66. 1874 listed at Clonmel, died 5/6/76 WO23/23.

Doyle, John. Bo Artillery. 1837. Clive pension; entered June 1853 at 9d rate; 5ft 7, brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 39 after 16yrs service; chronic rheumatism and general disability; to live in Whitechapel; L-AG-23-2-66.

Doyle, Patrick. Be Artillery, 1851. Discharge papers; Meerut 27th Oct. 1870; 20 yrs 266 days' service; 18yrs 3 mths in India; Indian rules for pension; good conduct, no badges; Mutiny medal with clasp for Lucknow (Cannot locate him either in the casualty roll or medal roll); 15 times in defaulters' book, twice court martialled; severely wounded by explosion of gunpowder at siege of Lucknow on 13th March 1858- no record of any Board having been held; 2 boon years; gunner with Company, rising to bombardier in RA but reduced, ending as gunner; born St. Mary's, 20 yrs on entry; 40yrs 2mths at discharge, 5ft 9, hazel eyes, brown hair; scar from burn on inside of right leg; intended residence, Mary St. Limerick; WO97/1786/192.

Doyle, William. Bo Infantry, 1857. Discharge papers; private 1st Bombay ER; 21yrs at discharge; 5ft 6¾, darke brown hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes; enlisted at Cattleconnell; made mark; discharged 10 January 1860; L/MIL/12/284 (LDS2029782, 585).

Duhig, Patrick. Bo Artillery, 1856. Discharge papers; signed on 25/03/56 for 10yrs, discharged 04/07/59, making his mark. 5ft 8¾, brown hair, fresh complexion, blue eyes; L/MIL/1282 (LDS 2029751, 269) .

Duhigg, Martin. Be Artillery, 1847. Dangerously wounded at Lucknow 12/03/58. Died of Wounds. (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny). Not in Mutiny medal roll.

Dundon, James. Bo Artillery, 1825. Clive pension; July 1840 at 9d rate; 34yrs; 14yrs 10mths service; 5ft 7½, fair complexion, hazel eyes, dark brown hair; paralysis of left arm and leg; L-AG-23-2-65.

Dunn, William. Be Artillery, 1860. Discharge papers, Agra 26th Oct 1875; 21 yrs service; termination of 2nd engagement; 4 good conduct medals and Indian Mutiny Medal with clasp for capture of Lucknow (when with 10th); 3times in defaulters' book and 1 court martial; attested to 10th Foot Dec 28th 1854, transferring to 75th on March 1st 1859, to Bengal artillery 1st June 1860 and RA 18th Feb 1861; rose to bombardier and corporal before being reduced to gunner again, at which level he remained to discharge; born St. John's; 20 at entry, 41 yrs 1 moth at discharge; 5ft 6, grey eyes, brown hair; tattoos on both forearms; to reside at Woolwich crossed out, Dublin entered; WO97/1786/2.

Dwyer, Edmond. Be Infantry, 1849. Limerick District Pension book, March 1859; transferred permanently into district from Clonmel; 9d rate; WO22/182 Limerick. Clive pension; entered May 1854 at 9d rate; 5ft 9, light brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 26 with 4yrs 4 months service; gunshot wound of the upper head also wound of the left hand; from Oola to reside in Tipperary; L-AG-23-2-66.

Dwyer, John. M Artillery, 1860. Discharge papers Kamptee 7th July 1865; unfitness for further service; conduct indifferent; six times in defaulters' book and one court martial (c 1mth. in prison); syphilis; "able after a time to gain his livelihood" after discharge; 5ft 6½, blue eyes, dark brown hair; to reside in Dublin. WO97/1319/219.

Dwyer, Thomas. Be Artillery 1847 & 49. Bombardier Dwyer, wounded at Arrah 02/08/57, and again at Rooya 15/04/1858 (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny). Not in Mutiny Medal List. Slightly wounded at Arrah, contusion; Supplement to London Gazette, October 13th, 1857, 2420.

Enright, James. M Infantry, 1846. Discharge papers 14th Aug. 1866; 21yrs service (includes 2 boon years), chose Indian regulations for pension; good conduct badges (4) and medal, never court-martialled; never rose above private; 18 when joined, 37yrs 10mths when discharged; 5ft 5, grey eyes, light brown hair; intending to reside in Co. Limerick. Tralee district April & July 1882, on 1s rate, payable at Limerick; WO22/224. Jan & Oct. 1883, ditto; WO 22/225.

Enright, John. M Artillery, 1840. 1862, Store Sergeant Ordnance Dept, admitted to pension 2/- rate Dec 5th; 5ft 9¾, black hair, hazel eyes; age 43; time expired; to reside in Mauritius; Clive pension; L-AG-23-2-66. WO23/19 WO23/22.1866, receiving pension in Mauritius WO23/23.

Enright, John. M Artillery, 1847. Discharge papers Woolwich 21st Dec 1866; completed 21 yrs service (2boon years); 3 good conduct badges, 7 mentions in defaulters' book, and one court-martial; rose to sergeant in M Artillery before reduction to ranks after trial, rising to Bombardier in RA; born in St. Munchin's, attested age 20; 39 when discharged; 6ft 2½, grey eyes, brown hair; scars? In right groin; assistant gardener; intending to reside in Portsmouth; series of annotation below, suggest he was in Clonmel in 1884 and Admitted to Kilmainham May 1890 reverting to out pension in July the same year; WO97/1320/125.

Enright, John. M Artillery entered 1852. (Probably this man as he was pensioned before the other Madras John Enrights and dates seem to fit). Pension from 3/11/58. 9d rate; 5ft 8¾, dark brown hair, grey eyes; age 30; 6yrs 3 months service; discharged with "unsound mind" to reside in Limerick;

Clive Fund pensioner; L-AG-23-2-66. 1858, Dec. Limerick district; permanent pension; WO22/182. See also WO23/19.

Enright, Michael. Be Artillery 1837. Clive pension; entered November 1858 at 2/- rate; sergeant; 5ft 8½, brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 47, 21yrs service; time expired; to live in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Enright, Patrick. M infantry, 1846. Discharge papers 9th Jan 1866; 21 years including 2 boon years; good conduct, once in defaulters' book and once court-martialled; rose to Staff Sergeant in Madras, was with Effective Supernumeraries, transferred to RA as sergeant and tried and reduced to private in 1863 and served at that rank until discharge; born in parish of Lough Gur, Bruff, enlisted age 18; 37 at discharge, 5ft 8, grey eyes, brown hair; to reside in Vizagapatam, India; WO97/1684/68.

Evans, James. M Artillery, 1836. Admitted to pension 24th May 1852 on 1/- rate; age 40 on discharge; 5ft 8, brown hair grey eyes; 14 yrs 3 months service; discharged for injury to head in China and general disability; to reside in Limerick. WO 20/17. Sergeant, alias John; pension record; Clive pension fund L-AG-23-2-66. Limerick district pension book, June 1852, records the arrival of James or Jno; permanent pension; WO22/181.

Fahy/Fahey, Patrick. M. Infantry 1840. Clive pension; entered December 1860 at 1/- rate; 5ft 4½, brown hair, hazel eyes, fresh complexion; age 37, 21yrs service; time expired; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Fahy, William. M Artillery, 1846. Entered Lord Clive pension, 9d, 13th Oct 1858; 5ft 7¼, brown hair, blue eyes; age 31 at discharge; 9yr 8mths service; discharged for "impartial intellect of long standing"; to reside in Waterford; Lord Clive pension; L-AG-23-2-66. Pension book 1858-65, records Limerick under 1859; WO23/22. 1866 still in Limerick but book records return to Waterford in 1867 where he is through to 1875; WO23/23.

Fairservice, Thomas. St.H Artillery, 1826. Clive pension; 9d from September 1836; age 28, 9yrs 335 days service; 5ft 7¾, sallow complexion, grey eyes, dark brown hair; lost sight of right eyes from cataract and imperfect vision of left eye; L-AG-23-2-65. Signed discharge papers; WO97/1182/62.

Farmer, Bryan. M Infantry, 1840. 1860, Dec. entered as new permanent pensioner in Limerick district, 1/- rate; WO22/182. 5ft 5½, light hair, grey eyes, 38 at discharge; 21 yrs 4mth service; WO23/23/19. In Limerick, too 1865, WO23/22 East India Company pensioners. Limerick to 1875 WO 23/23 East India Company pensioners. 1882, Tralee district, but still in Limerick; WO22/224/Tralee. Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for Relief of Lucknow and taking of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen"). See also Clive pension; L-AG-23-2-66.

Farrell, Patrick. Bo Infantry, 1839. Discharge papers; sergeant major of 31st Native infantry; pensioned at 2/6d in Europe; signed papers; 5ft ½, brown hair, sallow complexion, blue eyes; L/MIL/12/284 (LDS2029782, 630). Clive pension; age 39, 20 yrs 1 month service; to reside in Clonmel; L-AG-23-2-66.

Farrell, William. Bo Infantry, 1846. Discharge papers; from St. Mary's, age 20 at entry; 16yrs 166 days service, incl. 2 boon years, 268 days in Europe 13yrs 263 days in India; rose to corporal in 1855 but reduced for conduct unbecoming an NCO; present at Multan and Goojerat; 34½yrs at discharge,

5ft 6, brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion, cupping marks on right side; discharged 19th February 1861; L/MIL/12/284 (LDS2029782, 632). Clive pension; 9d rate; unfit for further service; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Finn, Simon. Be Artillery, 1836. Clive Fund pension register; gunner 3rd troop 1st brigade (suggesting move to HA); admitted 2nd August 1854, 9d rate; 5ft 8 fair hair, blue eyes; 17 yrs service; discharged with hepatic condition and dysentery; to live in Kilmallock; L-AG-23-2-66. Payment book, records him to his death on 12th August 1857; WO23/21 East India Company pensioners. May 1855 pension book notes him transferring to paymaster of Co. Limerick Militia; and back again August 1856; both refs WO22/182 Limerick. Age 41 at decease, 12 Aug 1857; WO22/182 Limerick.

Finnity, Michael. Be Infantry, 1860. 1861 worldwide army index places him with 101st at Multan (but not in 1871 list).

Finucan, John. Be Infantry, 1859. Pension book for Nova Scotia records a JF of the 107th regiment , at 7d rate, without any record of payment; WO22/296 Nova Scotia. Another records him transferring from Tralee to St. John's 31/3/69; WO22/294 Nova Scotia.(Not 100% sure this is the correct man given discrepancy of regiment).

Fitzgerald, Denis. Bo Artillery, 1847. Discharge papers; attested 15/05/47 at Castleconnell age 20; 15yrs 164 days service inclusive of boon; 236 days in Europe 14yrs 293 days in India. Discharged unfit with varicose veins caused by a fall; in Persian campaign and Indian Mutiny at Kotal and Gwalior; signed his papers, 16/02/61. 5ft 11¼, sandy hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion. L/MIL/1282, (LDS 2029751, 395). Clive pension; at 9d rate increased to 1/3 in October 1878; unfit for further service; retired to Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Fitzgerald, Denis. Be Cavalry, 1859. Discharge papers; Colchester 4th May 1880; 20yrs 356days service of which 18yrs 3 mths in India; termination of 2nd enlistment; 4 good conduct medals; 7 times in defaulters' book, one court martial; transferred to 21st Hussars May 2nd 1861 then to 3rd Hussars in 1873; private throughout service; 20 at entry, 41 yrs 35 days at discharge; 5ft 3, blue eyes, brown hair; residence GPO Dublin, (presumably poste restante address); WO97/1734/8. April 1882 a DF collected pension in Limerick via Tralee district, but no regiment given so not 100% sure this is the man; WO22/224 Tralee.

Fitzgerald, Garrett. M Infantry, 1846. Discharge papers, 8th Sept. 1864, retiring after 21yrs service on Indian Regulations; two good conduct medals, twice in defaulters' book and twice court-martialled; Nov Dec 1852 drunkenness on duty, May June 1860 for drunkenness; local service 1859 British Army 1861; never rose above private; 3yrs boon service; 18 when signed on 36.5 when discharged; 5ft 6½, grey eyes, black hair; tattoos, pagoda and palm tree on right arm, a mermaid, rose, thistle and shamrock on right forearm; a Burmese man and woman on left arm, Company Coat of Arms and Burmese man on forearm; intending to live in Limerick; WO97/1680/28. Pension 1/- rate, spent part of 1865 in Clonmel, 1868 in Woolwich, S. London and Cork; died 18th Jan 1872; WO23/61 91-109

Foot. Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for Defence of Lucknow and taking of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Fitzgerald, John. Be Artillery 1830. Clive pension; entered May 1837 at 1/3d rate, bombardier; age 26, 6yrs service; 5ft 8, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; loss of right arm; L-AG-23-2-65.

Fitzgerald, John. Be Artillery 1857. Discharge papers; Coventry (unclear) 20th April 1871; 15yrs 278 days service, 8yrs 6 mths in India; discharged unfit for further service; two good conduct badges, four times in defaulters book two courts martial; transferred into RA as corporal and almost immediately promoted to sergeant and equally quickly demoted down to gunner at which rank his service ended; discharged with hiatus(?) cordis, caused by service and climate; unlikely to be able to support himself; born St John's; 20 at entry 34 at discharge; 5ft 9½, hazel eyes, red hair; to live in Limerick; WO97/1790/11.

Fitzgerald, Patrick. M Infantry, 1857. Discharge papers; 7th Nov 1876; 21 yrs service including 2 boon years, Indian pension regulations; 4 good conduct medals and Indian Mutiny Medal (no clasp, presumably because of late arrival), once in defaulters' book; although presidential list has him s corporal he is private throughout career (possibly corporal just for journey out?); saw out first term in 108th, then 1865 re-engaged in 1/18th RIR for 6 months then transferred to 108th; born in St. Michael's, enlisted 18.5yrs, 38.5 on discharge; 5ft 6¾, grey eyes, light brown hair; intending to reside in Westminster; WO97/1957/17. 1882, April, July and Oct., pension payable at Limerick office; WO22/224/and /225Tralee. Jan 1883, ditto WO22/225.

Fitzgerald, Thomas. Be Artillery, 1830. Clive pension; entered May 1838 at 1/3d rate; age 27, 7yrs service; 5ft 7, fresh complexion, grey eyes, dark hair; his arm being blown off at exercise; L-AG-23-2-65.

Fitzgibbon, John. Be Infantry, 1846. In 1861 Worldwide army list at Multan; but not in 1871 list.

Fitzgibbon, Michael. Bo Infantry, 1837. Clive pension; private 1ER; entered June 1855 at 9d rate; 5ft 6, brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; 41yrs old, 16yrs 10 months, service; fistula in ano; to live in Cork; L-AG-23-2-66.

Fitzgibbon, Thomas. Be Artillery, 1826. Clive pension; bombardier; May 1845 at 1/- rate; age 37, 17yrs 9mths service; 5ft 7½, sallow complexion, grey eyes, dark brown hair; injury of the loins from an accident on duty; L-AG-23-2-65.

Fitzpatrick, Edward. St. Helena Infantry. Cannot find elsewhere other than this. 1850, June 12th, entry to pension at 2/-; 5ft 8 grey hair, blue eyes; age 67 with 56yrs 2 mths service; 6yrs 137 days in St Helena Infantry, 24 yrs 34 days in Company's Veterans; previously 25yrs service in Royal Artillery, Limerick Militia and HM 66th reg; general ill health; born John's Gate Limerick; to reside at 2 Hertingfordbury Road, Hertford; WO 27/13 7 & L-AG-23-2-66

Fitzpatrick, Edward. Be Infantry, 1855. 1861 Worlwide army list places him at Multan as drummer/fifer; but not in 1871 list.

Fitzpatrick, Michael. M Artillery, ?. Clive pension; not in main list; sergeant 2nd Batt.; entered pension Oct 1850 at 1/- rate; 5ft 10, brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 42 at discharge

after 15yrs service; musician, discharged with paralysis; from Ashford, to reside in Cork; L-AG-23-2-66

Flaghery, Patrick. M Artillery, 1835. Discharge papers; 1849 promoted to bombardier then demoted again, to finish career as gunner, pensioned after 16yrs 141days; sandy hair, hazel eyes; character, in battalion indifferent, as pensioner bad; WO 97/1209/275.

Flanagan, John. Bo Infantry 1837. Clive pension; entered June 1860 at 1/- rate; 5ft 7½, brown hair, hazel eyes, fair complexion; age 45, 22yrs 4months service; pensioned; to reside at Liseardane? Newcastlewest; L-AG-23-2-66.

Flanigan, John. Letter to EIC Post marked Limerick Feb. 12 1850. "Honoured Sir I am the lawful brother of the late John Flanigan and who some short time ago died by a fall from one of the gun carriages while serving in the Honorable East India Company's service for nearly a period of ten years, consisting of nearly 5years in St. Helena and the remainder in the Bengal, Bombay and Madras station, and as I have heretofore received the amount of all his effects and arrears of pay coming to him at the time of his death, do most humbly implore you will forward to me an account of the arrears of prize money that may be due to him as I am his legal representative to receive same. I am Sir, your very humble servant, Patrick Flanigan PS Your Honour's answer is requested to be directed to Patrick Flanigan, 16 Upper William Street, Limerick"; marked replied 28/8/50; NLI Ms13,686. Difficult to ID this man; there are no Flanigans listed but 2 Flanagans, one of whom was artilleryman in Bombay, who entered 1836 and was killed in 1844. Company service in St Helena for that man seems odd because the Crown took over responsibility for the island in 1834. I cannot find him in the Ghuznee prize roll which was not paid out until 1848-9; the annexation of Scind and the Sikh Wars are other prize monies at the time but I have neither list nor date of payment.

Flynn, William. Be Infantry, 1845. Clive pension; entered September 1857 at 9d rate; 5ft 6, brown hair, blue eyes, pale complexion; age 32 10yrs service; insanity; to live in Limerick; discharged from asylum in Hackney Aug 5th; L-AG-23-2-66.

Foley, David. Bo Artillery 1857. Discharge papers, 6th August 1859 age 29; from St Mary's, attested at Castleconnell 05/08/57 for 10 yrs.; 5ft 11 ¾, It brown hair, fresh complexion, dark blue eyes; L/MIL/1282, (LDS 2029751, 492)

Foley, Michael. Be recruit. Shipwrecked on the Protector 1838 (see Hodkinson, Protector)

Foley, Thomas. M Infantry, 1856. Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for the defence and capture of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen")

Fox, David. M Infantry, 1856. 1860, Jul 2nd, entry to pension, 9d rate; 5ft 6½, brown hair, grey eyes; good character; 2yrs 10mths service; wounded right eye and left knee; to reside in Limerick; WO23/19 Indian Army pensioners: registers of admission. Strangely, given the nature of his wounds and that he was pensioned, he does not appear in the Mutiny Medal list or in the list casualties. To reside Limerick, Clive pension; L-AG-23-2-66.

Fox, John. Bencoolen, 1764. A muster roll of April 15th 1775 places matross (lowest rank of artillery) John Fox, at Nattal, an outstation of Bencoolen, further up the west coast of Sumatra. (See, Alan

Harfield; *Bencoolen: a History of the Honourable East India Company's Garrison on the West Coast of Sumatra 1685-1825*, Chippenham 1995).

Franklin, Patrick. M Infantry, entered 1846. Indian Mutiny medal (no clasp) (see Hodkinson, "Limerickmen ")

Frazer, Michael. Be Cavalry, 1857. Discharge papers; Rawalpindi 13th Dec 1876; 20yrs 246 days' service, 18yrs 7 months in India; conduct latterly good but no badges; 20 times in defaulters' book , 5 courts martial; born St John's; entered age 20; 39yrs 1 mth at final discharge; 5ft 1¼, hazel eyes, brown hair; Wickhamshaw? Middlesex, crossed out and Glasgow inserted; on medical height given as 5ft 3¾; normal service detail covered over, however other papers show he rose to Sergeant before being reduced to private on entering Royal cavalry; list of medical complaints with; actually discharged from 4th Hussars; WO97/1734/73.

Frazier/Fraser, Samuel. Bo Infantry, 1827. Clive pension; carpenter; June 1846 at 9d rate; age 28, 19yrs 3mths service; 5ft 5½, sallow complexion, brown eyes, dark brown hair; worn out; L-AG-23-2-65.

Galaher/Gallagher, Michael. Be. Artillery 1849. Service papers; from Dromcollogh, weaver, enlisted 8 May 1850, age 22; promoted bombardier May to September 1858 then remanded to gunner until he volunteered to RA, thereafter bombardier again but reduced to ranks until discharge 3 May 1870; Indian rules pension. 5ft 11¾, fresh complexion, hazel eyes, grey hair; to reside in Dublin. Note on papers that he entered Kilmainham Hospital 1 May 1872 and reverted to out patient on 1 September 1874; Indian Mutiny Medal, no mention of clasps; WO97/1792/33.

Gallagher, John. Bo Artillery, 1828. Clive pension book; admitted September 1849 at 1/- rate; store sergeant in Ordnance Dept.; 5ft 7¼, dark hair, blue eyes, sallow complexion; 41yrs at discharge after 19yrs 8months service; discharged insane; from Donoughmore to reside in Cork; L-AG-23-2-66.

Galvin, Henry. Be Cavalry, 1859. Attestation form 1859, signed by him with his medical form, 20 yr old, 5ft 3½, hazel eyes, black hair; served as private throughout, permitted to extend service on yearly basis from 1881; final discharge 21st August 1883, with 24 yrs 81days reckonable service; 13yrs in India, rest on Home service; next of kin father Thomas; not married; 5 good conduct badges; discharged at Sandhurst; medical record of a case of ague treated with quinine and a wound from a kick of a horse in Brighton; served in Newbridge and Cahir; WO97/2851/159.

Geary, John. Be Artillery, 1852. Although stated to have died at Delhi, in 1857, he is neither recorded in the casualty list nor in the Mutiny medal roll.

Geason, Patrick. Be Artillery, 1846. Clive Pension book; corporal, entered 24th June 1861 at 9d rate; 5ft 8, grey eyes, brown hair; age 37; 16yrs 7mth service; discharged unfit, with cough and hemoptysis (coughing blood); to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. New out pensioner in Limerick pension district, June 1861; WO22/182 Limerick.

Gilbertson, William. Be Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers, Aldershot, 16th April 1872; 21 yrs 60 days' service 18yrs 8 mths in India; termination of second engagement, Indian pension rules; two good conduct medals and Indian Mutiny medal (Though not in medal roll); 24 times in defaulters' book; remained private throughout service; 2 boon years; 20 yrs at entry, 39yrs 2 mths at discharge; 5ft 8,

grey eyes, light brown hair; to reside in Limerick; WO97/1968/62. 1882, April, July & Oct and Jan 1883, Tralee pension district, 1/- rate, payable at Limerick; WO22/224 & 225 Tralee.

Ginan/Ginnane, John. Bo Infantry, 1840. Clive pension; entered June 1857 at 9d rate; 5ft 6, dark brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; age 37, 16yrs service; general debility; to live in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Gleeson, Andrew. Bo Artillery, 1825. Clive pension; labourer; June 1847 at 1/- rate; age 40, 21yrs 4mths service; 5ft 7, sallow complexion, grey eyes, dark brown hair; own request; L-AG-23-2-65.

Gleeson, John. Bo Infantry. Letter, Limerick 10th? Jan 1848. "Sir Mary Gleeson mother of the late Corporal John Gleeson, 6th company 1 European Fusiliers in Bombay establishment and who died the 21st June 1846 Kurrachee received a letter dated East India Company House, Military Department, London first Nov. 1846 No.38469, the official returns had not then been received of a sufficient late date to enable court to give any information as to whether or not there was any sum due to the individual estate, Read letter from Secretary, Court Directors dated 21st May 1847 to apply in 4 or 5 months then read letter from same secretary dated 10th Sept (date excised but 1847) to apply in three months. That time being now expired I beg to renew the application Mary Gleeson her mark Direct to Mary Gleeson care of Matthew Duggan, King's Island, Limerick." Marked, "John Gleeson per Harmony 1842 died 21st June intestate, effects Rs 271-11-2"; "Reply approved 12 Jan 1848," and, "Mothers form and declaration sent 6 March 1848. Mother married twice", NLI Ms13,686.

Gleeson, Timothy. M Infantry, 1826. 1849, 27th June, entry to pension. 1/- rate; 5ft 5¼, brown hair, hazel eyes; good character; age 53, 21yrs service, time expired, to reside in Limerick; "6s 1½d per month out of this man's pension will be issued in India for the support of his wife. The monthly payments to him must therefore be short that amount"; WO27/13 Indian Army pensioners: registers of admission and L-AG-23-2-66.

Glinane, Stephen. Be Artillery, 1852. Discharge papers, Meerut 26th Oct. 1874; 24yrs 321 days' service, 22yrs 3 months in India; Indian pension rules; good conduct; long service and good conduct medal; Indian Mutiny medal (not in medal roll); rose to sergeant in Company service and to battery Sergeant Major; transferred to RHA on re-engagement in 1862; 2boon years; 20 at entry, 42 yrs 11 mths at discharge; 6ft 1, hazel eyes, brown hair; slight scar on right cheek; to reside Woolwich; WO90/1793/191. Despite an age discrepancy, but given the unusual name (only one in census and army) and birthplace of three children, it is very likely that he is the man in the 1881 census age 45, Barrack Sergeant, at Palace Sergeants Quarters, Hampton Court Palace, Middlesex, married to Maria, age 35, born in East Indies; father of Mabel B, 12, and Lena C, 9, both scholars and born in East Indies, and Stanislaus, 6, scholar, born at Woolwich, Francis B, 4, scholar, born London and Sidney B, 3, and Edmond S, 4mths, both born at Hampton Court. Married 1859, wife's name Wagstaff;

Discharge papers, Aldershot, 10th Jan., 1871; 22yrs 290 days' service, 18yrs 3mths in India; end of second engagement; once in defaulters' book and one court martial; rose to Sergeant in Company service but reverted to private on entering the 107th, then rising to Colour Sergeant at discharge; 2yr boon; born Dromkeen; 20 when entered, 41 yrs 3mths at discharge; 5ft 9½, grey eyes, brown hair; to reside in Omagh Co. Tyrone; widows pension applied for, undated note at bottom final page; WO 97/1971/209. Entered in Chelsea records; WO121/0227. July 1882 -Jan 1883, Omagh district pension book at 2/- rate; WO22/223 Omagh. Indian Mutiny Medal with clasps for Delhi and capture of Lucknow.

Gorman, Matthew. Be Infantry, 1839. Clive Pensioner; 9d rate; entered 2nd Aug. 1854; 5ft 6 grey hair, hazel eyes; 45yrs.; 14yrs 7 mths service; general health much impaired; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. Aug. 1854, new out pensioner in Limerick district; WO22/182 Limerick. In pension book 1858-65; WO23/22 East India Company pensioners. Ditto 1867-75; WO23/23 East India Company pensioners. April 1882 in Tralee pension book EIC payments in Limerick WO22/224 Tralee.

Grace, Patrick. M Artillery, 1849. Discharge papers, Sept. 5th 1868, after 21 yrs service including 2 boon years; at own request; 4 times in defaulters' book and twice court-martialled; promoted to bombardier in M Artillery, at which rank he re-enlisted for local service, during which time he was tried and demoted back to gunner at which rank he saw out his career, volunteered to British Army 1863; born Pallas Green, age 23 when joined, 42.5yrs when left; 5ft 8, grey eyes, brown hair; intended residence Tipperary. WO97/1327/294.

Grady, Michael. Be Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers, Ashton? 9th March 1872; 21 yrs 34 days' service, 15yrs 3mths in India; end of second period of enlistment; 4 good conduct badges; once in defaulters' book, 2 courts martial; 2 boon years; private through service; born Moron (Murroe?) parish; 20yrs at entry, 39 yrs 1 month at discharge; 5ft 9¾, hazel eyes, brown hair; cut under left eye; to reside at Ashton under Lyne Lancashire; WO97/1972/154. No Mutiny medal unless he is the MG listed in 1st Be Reg. 1881 census has an MG of about right age and from Limerick in Ashton-u-L, working as an iron labourer, married to Martha, 37, cotton blowing room worker, born Wickham, Hampshire and daughter Annie F. A cotton weaver age 16, born Fareham Hampshire; all at 6 Sun Alley.

Grady, Michael. M Infantry, 1857. Discharge papers 13th Oct. 1876; 21 yrs service (2 boon years), unfit for further service; conduct v. good, 4 good conduct medals Indian Mutiny medal (no clasps), long service and good conduct medal, no school certificate; never in default book; private throughout; re-engaged 1865 to complete his 21yrs; 5ft 6¾, 36½ inch chest, small pox marks, vaccinated in infancy, pulse 72, inspirations 18, muscular development very good; medical record quotidian fever, gonorrhoea, hepatitis and hernia, the hernia was got when accompanying a prisoner to the guard room who kicked him in the groin; 39 at discharge; intending to reside in Manchester; WO97/1972/45.

Green, John. M Infantry, 1841. Indian Mutiny medal (No Lucknow clasp) (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Griffin, James. M Infantry. 1827. Clive pension; labourer; July 1843 at 9d rate; age 37, 16yrs 1mth service; 5ft 5, ruddy complexion, hazel eyes, grey hair; unfit for duty; L-AG-23-2-65.

Griffin, John. Be Infantry, 1849. Killed in action at Narnaul (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny). Indian Mutiny Medal with clasp for Delhi. For a description of the action at Narnaul and a mention of his death see Blackwood's Magazine 1858; July-December p. 723.

Grimes, John. M Infantry. Discharge papers. From St. John's. Served 6yrs 3 mths, discharged 25/02/60, unwilling to serve in HM army. Conduct described as bad and good in different parts of papers. 5ft 5½, brown hair, fresh complexion, hazel eyes. Made mark. L/MIL/11/280 (LDS 1886141, 1434).

Guerin, Henry. Be Infantry, 1841. Clive pension; age 23, 5yrs 2mths service; June 1847 at 9d rate increased to 1/3d in September 1884; 5ft 8¾, fair complexion, hazel eyes, brown hair; wounded in both legs and body; L-AG-23-2-65. (Presidential list should probably read 1846 for 1856)

Guerin, John. Be Infantry, 1852. Discharge papers; Aldershot 20th Aug. 1872; unfit for further service after 18yrs 15 days, all served in India; Indian pension rules; bad conduct, no badges; Indian Mutiny Medal with clasp for Delhi; 22 times in defaulters' book and 5 times court martialled; offences include, taking a piece of metal, disgraceful conduct, drunkenness and many cases of absence without leave; private throughout service; discharged with general disability, worn out by combination of tropical service and drink; will be able to contribute to own support; 20yrs when entered; 5ft 7½, hazel eyes, dark brown hair; two scars on left elbow and two on left breast; to reside in Mary St. Limerick; WO97/1977/26.

Gunnell/Gunnill, Michael. Be Cavalry, 1857. Discharge papers; 26yrs 8mths; discharged 3rd September 1859; 5ft 1½, black hair, swarthy complexion, blue eyes; made mark; L/MIL/10/303 (LDS1867085 /877).

Guthrie, John. Be Infantry, 1839. Soldier Inquiry form 11 Feb. 1851; Jane Guthrie applying to the estate of late private John Guthrie Bengal Establishment, "died 3 Nov 1848" and enclosing form; no address in Limerick, NLI Ms13,686. Date differs from presidential list; not clear who Jane is, maybe mother of John.

Hacket, Michael. Be Infantry, 1839. July 1857 new permanent pensioner entering Limerick district, at 9d rate; WO22/182 Limerick. July 1857, pension book; 5ft 7 brown hair, grey eyes; age 39, cooper; 17yrs 52 days service; discharged with enlarged spleen and broken constitution; born Limerick to reside in Pallaskenry; WO23/19 Indian Army pensioners. It seems two people of same name might have been confused; he clearly did not die in 1841, but his trade as cooper here is different to labourer in Bengal list. See also L-AG-23-2-66.

Haher, Michael. Bo Artillery 1859. Discharge papers; from Boher, attested Limerick 06/12/59, 4yrs service 250 in Europe, 3yrs 111days in India; discharged with unstated disability 05/12/63; 5ft 5½, light hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion. L/MIL/1282, (LDS 2029751, 591).

Hallinan, Thomas. M. Infantry, entered 30/01/54. Discharge papers. From St. John's. Served 5 yrs 8 mths, unwilling to serve in HM Army. Discharged 96/12/59. 5ft 5¾, brown hair, fair complexion, grey eyes. L/MIL/11/280 (LDS 1886141, 1464)

Halloran, Edward. M Infantry, 1841. 1861 May 15th entry into pension book at 1/- rate; 5ft 4¾, light brown hair, blue eyes; 37 at discharge, conduct good; 21yrs service, time expired; to reside in Limerick; WO23/19 Indian Army pensioners: registers of admission. Clive pension; L-AG-23-2-66.

Halloran, James. Be Infantry, 1839. I think this might be the John Halloran in the main list as details conform. Clive pension; sergeant 2ER, entered August 1851 at 9d rate; 5ft 7, brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; age 31 after 11yrs 2months service; wounded in the head by a sabre received in action; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66

Halpin, Michael. Be Artillery, 1860. Hanley, John. Be Artillery, 1847. Labourer from Kilfinnan enlisted Cork 20 March 1847, age 23. Promoted bombardier in May 1857 and corporal in September 1857, then sergeant in June 1859;; tried and imprisoned 17-23 September 1859 his sentence was remitted and he entered the RA as sergeant at which rank he was discharged 26 June 1866 after 21yrs service. 1 year's extra service for the Alumbagh. 5ft 9¼ins, fair complexion, light blue eyes brown hair; to reside at Howrah (Calcutta). Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66 & WO23/19 Indian Army pensioners. Pension book ; new out-pensioner in Limerick district April 1857; WO22/182 Limerick. March 1860 moved from Limerick to Toronto, pension book entry; WO22/182 Limerick. Pension record, died Toronto district, 03/05/63; WO23/22 East India Company pensioners, or 21/05/63, L-AG-23-2-68 .

Harrigan, Patrick. Be Artillery, 1847. Aug 1851, new pensioner in Wales East; WO22/116 Wales. Pension book May 1852 records move from Wales to Cork; WO22/116 Wales East. May 1852 arrived in Cork; WO 22/163 Cork 2nd. Sept 1852 back to Wales; WO 22/163 Cork 2nd.

Hart, Charles. M Infantry, 1836. Born 1818; convicted for assault; 14yrs transportation (7 in Madras list) at court martial in Rangoon; sailed on Adele Marquard 10/12/40 (William Hammond on same ship) arrived 27/03/41 <https://convictrecords.com.au/convicts/hart/charles/131647>

Hart, Patrick. M Artillery, 1847. Discharge papers, 23rd April 1864, Secunderabad; 17yrs 44 days' service (2 boon years), unfit for further service; 2 good conduct medals, two courts martial and 16 times in defaulters' book; gunner throughout his career; surprisingly no medical assessment to say he is unfit; age 36 and 94 days on 15/04/54; 5ft 6½, grey eyes, brown hair; no intended place of residence noted; WO97/1326/88.

Hastings, Cornelius. Be Artillery,? Not in presidential list. Clive pension; entered August 1865 at 1/- rate; 5ft 7½, brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; labourer; age 43, 22yrs 2 months service; time expired; born Baron Moor? Limerick; to reside Shanagolden; L-AG-23-2-66

Hartigan, Maurice. M Infantry, 1846. Discharge papers; served in 105th, discharged Dec 23rd 1865; 21 yrs service (2 boon years); pension under India regulations; one good conduct badge, 5 times in defaulters' book, one court martial; rose to sergeant in Company service but demoted back to

private at which he continued throughout regular career, gaining and forfeiting good conduct badges; 20 on entry 39 yrs 3mth on leaving; 5ft 6½, light brown hair, blue eyes; intending to reside in Madras; WO97/1684/103.

Hartigan, Roger. Be Artillery, 1852. I am Sir, your very obedient and humble servant Mary Loughnane widow, Cornwallis St Limerick Addressed to M. Loughnane, Cornwall St, St Jno Sq. Limerick"; NLI Ms13,686. No indication of where he served. There is only one EH in the presidential lists a private of the Bengal Infantry, pensioned in 1850 in India and left a will to his son; the dates seem to fit.

Hayes, Martin. M Artillery, 1860. Discharge papers, 29th Jan. 1869; 8yrs 212 days service; unfit for further service; conduct good; three times in defaulters' book; gunner through career; selected Indian rates of pension; discharged with impaired vision; joined age 20, 29 on discharge; 6ft 2, grey eyes, light brown hair; to reside in St. John's Limerick. WO97/1326/219.

Hayes, Thomas. Be Artillery, 1850. Killed in action at Behagunge 2/8/57 (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny). Not in Indian Mutiny Medal Roll. Killed by ball through the neck; Supplement to London Gazette, October 13th, 1857, 2420.

Hayes, Thomas. Be Cavalry, 1858. Discharge papers; age 22; discharged 17th September 1859; from St. John's; 5ft 2½, black hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes; made mark; L/MIL/10/303 (LDS1867085, 931).

Healy, Michael. 1850 & 1861. Really should not be in this list because he was not in EIC service; 87th and 101st Regiments. Discharged from 87th 1859 after 9yrs 73 days service, leaving by purchase £15; during which he rose to corporal and was twice tried for drunkenness, being reduced to private. His service was allowed to count when he re-enlisted in the 101st in 1861, where he rose to sergeant, was reduced to private, and rose to colour sergeant; re-enlisted at Kurrachee (Karachi); clerk; born Glin, 44 yrs 9mths at discharge, 5ft 11, light blue eyes, grey hair; to reside at Uxbridge. Clive pension; time expired; retired to Newcastle Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Heffernan, Thomas. Bo Artillery, 1857. Discharge papers, age 22; enlisted London 29/07/57 for 12 yrs; discharge signed 26/01/60. 5ft 8, brown hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes. L/MIL/1282, (LDS 2029751, 653).

Hennessy, James. Bo Artillery, ? Not in presidential list. Clive pension; labourer; June 1847, at 9d rate; age 36, 15yrs 4mths service; 5ft 9¾, sallow complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; injury of right hand and foot; L-AG-23-2-65.

Hickey, James. M infantry, 1857. Discharged 26/01/60; 5ft 6, dark brown hair, fresh complexion and hazel eyes. L/MIL/11/281 (LDS 1886141, 1583).

Hickey, John. Bo Artillery, 1853. Discharge papers, age 26; enlisted 02/02/53 for 12yrs; discharge 04/08/59; 5ft 8½, brown hair, fresh complexion, hazel eyes. L/MIL/1282, (LDS 2029751, 682.)

Hickey, Michael. Be Infantry, 1839. Entry to pension book, 3rd Sept 1860; private in veterans battalion; 1/- rate; 5ft 5¼, black hair & eyes; 21yrs service; to reside in Limerick; WO23/19 Indian Army pensioners. Pension record to 1865 without change; WO23/22. Died 19/10/67; WO23/23. Clive pension; age 48, 21yrs service; admitted to pension; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Hickey, Thomas. Bo Artillery. 1827. Not in presidential list but in embarkation list. Clive pension; July 1843 at 9d rate; labourer; age 34, 17yrs 4mths service; 5ft 7¾, sallow complexion, grey eyes, dark brown hair; L-AG-23-2-65.

Hickey, Thomas. Be Infantry, 1839. Clive pension; entered July 1855 at 1/6 rate; 5ft 7, black hair, hazel eyes, sallow complexion; age 36, 15yrs 4 months service; total loss of vision of right eye, the left imperfect; to reside in Adare; L-AG-23-2-66.

Higgins, Thomas. B. Cavalry 1858. Discharge papers show he is a Clare man creeping in because Parteen is near Limerick; age 20 at entry; volunteered to 19th Hussars in 1861; transferred to 15th Hussars in 1870; served almost 18yrs in India; finally discharged at own request 10th July 1877, with 21yrs 52days service inclusive of 2 boon years; 5ft 3½, with fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; to reside in George St. Limerick, WO97/1738.

Hinchev, Thomas. Be Artillery, 1852. Discharge papers; age 20 at entry;; volunteered to Royal Artillery 1861; 21yrs 82 days service, inclusive of 2 boon years; left at end of second engagement; 18¼yrs in India; India General Service Medal with clasps for North West Frontier and Umbeyla; final discharge 28th March 1871; 5ft 8, with fresh complexion, blue eyes, brown hair; to reside in Newcastle; WO97/ 1800/71. 1882-3 receiving pension at Newcastle, via Tralee office WO22/224 & 225 Tralee.

Histen, John. Be Artillery, 1847. I assume this is the man with no first name in the presidential list. Pension book; 1/3d rate; from 12th June 1850; left leg useless because of gunshot wound in action (Sikh War?), born Kilfergus, shoemaker, to reside in Glin; 5ft 7¾, brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; WO23/17 Indian Army pensioners & L-AG-23-2-66.

Hogan, John. Be Infantry, 1841. New out pensioner in Limerick district, Sept 1858; WO22/182 Limerick.

Hogan, John. Be? Infantry, ? Clive pension; entered August 1858 at 9d rate (increased to 1/3d in May 1879); 5ft 6¼; brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 33, 11 yrs 11 months service; dislocation of ankle on service; from Loughmore to retire to Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. I assume this is probably the same man as previous entry though dates do not really tally.

Discharge papers; St. Mary's, age 18 at entry; discharged 30th August 1864; rose to sergeant in 3ER before reduced to private at which level he entered the 107th, rising to corporal at discharge; final discharge 30th August 1864, with 12yrs 347days service, including 2 boon years; entitled to Indian Mutiny medal; discharged unfit with non-syphilitic bubo which will probably heal with time and change of climate, opacity of eye; will probably be able to earn a living; 5ft 6½,

fair complexion, hazel eyes, dark brown hair; mermaid and soldier tattoo on left arm; scar in right eye; to live in Limerick; WO97/1687/70.

Hogan, Patrick. Be Infantry, 1839. Clive pension; October 1846 at 1/3d rate; age 27, 7yrs service; 5ft 5½, fresh complexion, grey eyes, fair hair; loss of left fore arm from wound in action; L-AG-23-2-65.

Hogan, Patrick. Bo infantry, 1840. Clive pension; entered May 1855 at 9d rate; 5ft 6 brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 35 service 14yrs 2 months; rupture; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Hogan, Walter. Be Infantry, 1855. Discharge papers; private 1st Bombay ER; 31 at discharge; 5ft 6½, brown hair, fresh complexion, blue eyes; signed papers; L/MIL/12/284 (LDS2029782, 857). Not in presidential list.

Horan, John. M Artillery, 1819. Not in embarkation list but in presidential list. Clive pension; October 1833 at 1/- rate; age 44, 14yrs service; 5ft 8, fair complexion, hazel eyes, brown hair; ruptured; L-AG-23-2-65.

Horneybrook, Richard. Be Artillery, 1851. Discharge papers; from St John's, age at entry 20; 21 yrs service, 12½ in India; Indian Mutiny Medal; discharged at end of end period of service; transferred to RA as sergeant but soon reduced to gunner, end in Horse Artillery; elected Indian pension rules; 2yr boon; final discharge 27th June 1871; 5ft 8, fresh complexion, hazel eyes, dark brown hair; intending to reside in Norwich; WO97/1801/100. 1/- a day, Chelsea out-patient 1871, in patient 1878 as hospital constable; dismissed for misconduct 1879; WO23/173 Index of admissions. 1881 Census has a Richard Horneybrook, labourer, at 60 Camera Square (a slum area then), Chelsea, married to Mary, age 37, a laundress from Ireland.

Horrigan, Matthew. Be Infantry, 1826. Admitted to Clive pension 2nd August 1848 at 1/- rate; described as worn out; age 41, 21yrs 3mths service, 5ft 5½, with swarthy complexion, grey eyes and dark brown hair; L-AG-23-2-65. Drawing pension 1858-65 at Limerick; WO23/22 East India Company pensioners. Died 30th January 1869 in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-68.

Howard, Michael. Bo Infantry, 1823. Clive pension; September 1842 at 9d rate; house painter; age 41, 19yrs 10mths service; 5ft 7, fair complexion, grey eyes, dark brown hair; general debility; L-AG-23-2-65.

Howley, John. M Infantry, 1828. Entry to pension book; shoemaker; age 33, 5ft 6, 14yrs 5mths service; grey eyes, light brown hair; shoemaker; 9d rate, from 5th July 1843; impaired constitution; L-AG-23-2-65. Seems to be right person, pensioned in Cork, died 11th October 1849; WO23/21 East India Company pensioners.

Hurley, Francis. M Infantry, 1859. Discharge papers 16th April 1874; 14yrs 236days service; discharged as corporal, unfit for service; 2 good conduct medals and 2nd class cert. of education; 3 times in defaulters' book; re-engaged 1869, promoted 1871; discharged with paralysis brought on by an attack of secondary syphilis; not likely to be able to support himself; not caused by vice or intemperance; born in St. Mary's parish, 20 yrs when entered 34 yrs 8mth on discharge, 5ft 8 tall, blue eyes, brown hair, intending to reside in Dublin.

Jordan, James. Be Infantry, 1856. Discharge papers; from St. John's, age 20 at entry; free discharge with pension after 21+yrs service, private throughout career; 2yr boon service; Indian Mutiny Medal (not in roll); re-engaged at Fermoy June 1865; discharged 25th April 1876; 5ft 8¾, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; to receive pension via Fermoy; WO97/2007/201.

Joyce, Thomas. Be Artillery, 1839. Clive pension book; has him as gunner 2c 1b; admitted 11th June 1856; 5ft 9¾, with brown hair, blue eyes and sallow complexion; tailor age 40; 14yrs 2mth service; rheumatism; pensioned in Dublin; L-AG-23-2-66.

Kean, John. M Artillery, 1817. Clive pension; sergeant; July 1840 at 1/- rate; age 47, 21yrs service; 5ft 9¾, dark complexion, hazel eyes, brown hair; labourer; impaired health; L-AG-23-2-65.

Kean/Kane, John. Bo Infantry, 1840. The variant spellings seem to be one and the same guy. Clive pension; June 1846 at 9d rate; age 23, 5yrs 5mths service; 5ft 7½, sallow complexion, hazel eyes, dark hair; injury of back; L-AG-23-2-65.

Keane, John. 1858 entry in Clive pension book has a Sergeant John Keane, on 2/-rate (1/- Clive, 1/- Company cash) from 13th July; 5ft 8, dark brown hair, brown eyes, age 44, weaver; 24yrs 11 months service; broken constitution, born Limerick residing Limerick; WO223/19 Indian Army pensioners: registers of admission. Cannot identify him in any presidency list; not same as next entry who was pensioned 1866. Same info. in L-AG-23-2-66.

Keane, Francis. M Infantry 1829. Clive pension; servant; July 1844 at 9d rate; age 34, 14yrs 3mths service; 5ft 5¾, fair complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; unfit for any further service from palpitations of the heart; L-AG-23-2-65.

Keane, John, M Infantry, 1846. Sgt Keane with Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for Defence of Lucknow and taking of Lucknow (Hodkinson, "Limerickmen in the 1st Madras Fusiliers during the Indian Mutiny of 1857-58", Old Limerick Journal 2019, Vol. 54.).

***Keane, Margaret.** Clive pension; Widow of a sergeant of Bengal Artillery; receiving 4½d; New Road Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Keane, Richard. M Infantry, 1839. Entry into pension book 17th Oct 1860, 1/- rate; 5ft 5½, brown hair, hazel eyes; age 46, 22yrs and 5½ months service; residence Limerick.; WO23/19 Indian Army pensioners: registers of admission. Clive pension; entry crossed out without explanation; but entered a couple of pages later; at own request; L-AG-23-2-66.

Kearney, John. Be Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers; age 22yrs 8mths at entry; remained private through career, served almost 22 yrs almost 19 in India; 2 yrs boon service; elected Indian Pension Rules; Indian Mutiny Medal (not in medal roll); discharged 28th April 1873 with general debility brought on by frequent bouts of fever; 5ft 6, with sallow complexion, blue eyes, sandy hair; to live in Cappamore.

Kelly, John. M Artillery, 1846. Document 1848, age 22 on enlistment, 5ft 9; enlisted Bruff 17th Sept 1846, received from Bolton 11th March 1847; 1yr 158 service to 21st Feb 1848; brown hair, brown eyes; document seems to be transfer to 3rd batt. WO97/1209/212.

Kerrigan, John. Be Infantry, 1839. Transfers from Limerick to Cardiff pension district Nov 1856; 9d a day pension; & March 1857 transfers back to Limerick from E. Wales district; & February 1861 struck off Limerick pension list as absent from district; all WO22/182 Limerick. Clive pension; June 1847 at 9d rate; age 31, 5yrs 10mths service; 5ft 5½, dark complexion, black eyes and hair; wound in left forearm.

Kerwick, John. M. artillery. Sergeant Major John Kerwick was born c.1819 in the Parish of St. Johns, Limerick, Ireland, and enlisted at Limerick for service with the H.E.I.C. Artillery on 26 September 1839, aged 20, having previously worked as a Weaver. Aside from 157 days spent in Britain, and during his passage to India, he spent his entire military career in India. He was promoted to Corporal on 6 March 1846; to Sergeant on 1 February 1849; and to Temporary Staff Brigade Sergeant on 19 October 1854. He took up a position in the Electric Telegraph Department on 29 July 1856, remaining there until 4 August 1857, after which he re-joined his unit on 5 August 1857. He was appointed Staff Brigade Sergeant on 1 September 1857, Acting Sergeant-Major on 14 August 1858, and Sergeant Major on 21 September 1858 (with an additional 2 years service for the Indian Mutiny). He then volunteered for additional service as Sergeant-Major with the Royal Artillery on 13 May 1861, and was eventually discharged on 17 April 1866 with 28 years and 204 days with conduct noted as exemplary with his stated intention to live in Madras. Dublin No 2 records death on 13th Sept; WO22/170. 1857 Clive Fund list of deceased pensioners; L-AG-23-2-68.

McCarthy, Timothy. M Infantry; 1846. Discharge papers, Cannanore Jan 27th 1866; 21 yrs 302 days; unfit for further service, opted for Indian Pension Regulations; bad conduct, 65 times in defaulters' book and 9 courts martial; interestingly states not wounded contradicting presidency list; private throughout, all misdemeanours seem to involve drink; 2 boon years; rheumatism, constant ain in joints, but capable of contributing to livelihood; 18 at entry 39 at discharge; 5ft 7, blue eyes, light brown hair; sear wound on left side of head; to reside in Queenstown (Cobh) Cork; annotated through to Nov. 1890; WO97/1680/136. 1882-3, pension book Cork district, 1/- rate; WO22/216 & 217 Cork. 1857, July 16th, slightly wounded in right hand at Cawnpore; Tavender, Casualty Roll for

the Indian Mutiny. Two men of this name in 1MF received the Indian Mutiny Medal; one got no clasp, the other got two clasps for the defence of Lucknow and the taking of Lucknow; while not certain the wound may have been sufficient for him not to be at Lucknow to win a clasp (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

McCarthy, William. Bo, private died 1849. 29/01/51, soldier inquiry-form for, from mother, no address, Mary O'Brien/McCarthy. NLI Ms 13,686.

McDermott, James. M Artillery, 1854. Discharge papers; Chichester 27th Jan. 1873; 20yrs 347 days service; discharged after termination of second enlistment; very good conduct, 4 good conduct medals and Indian Mutiny Medal with clasp for Central India; 3 times in defaulters' book, once court martialled; attested as infantry private but to artillery within 6 months; gunner for rest of career apart from 61-63 when corporal; 2yr boon; born St. Mary's, 18yr when enlisted; 5ft 9 , hazel eyes, brown hair; tattooed on right arm and sear on left heart; intended residence Crop Hays House, Malmesbury, Wilts.; signature; WO97/1812/20. Some pension payments into 1880s but not sure if these are the right man.

McDermott, Martin. M Artillery, 1854. Discharge papers, Woolich, 7th Oct 1868; 14 yrs service; unfit for further service; three good conduct badges, four times in defaulters' book, one court martial; joined as infantryman but within a month a gunner, rising to bombardier and corporal in Company service; re-engaged for 9 yrs March 1864; tried and demoted back down to gunner for rest of service; 2 boon years; asthemia and asthma not able to earn a living; born St Marys attested in Essex (Cork in pres. list); age 27 when enlisted, 41 yrs 6 mths on discharge; hazel eyes, black hair; to reside in Limerick, WO 97/1334/209.

McDonagh, Martin. M Infantry, 1853. 1874 a man of this name was pensioned from the Inniskilling Fusiliers/ 108th after 21 years, which would fit this man. WO121/0277.

McDonald, Patrick. Bo Artillery, 1822. Clive pension; entered June 1837 at 9d rate; age 33, 14yrs 1mth service; 5ft 7, fair complexion, blue eyes, light hair; syphilitic; L-AG-23-2-65.

McDonnell, Charles. Be Infantry, 1841. Clive pension book; entered March 1861,1/- rate; 5ft 5¾, brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; age 40, 21yrs service; time expired; L-AG-23-2-66.

McDonnell, James. Be Artillery, 1837. Clive pension; entered August 1856 at 9d rate; 5ft 7½, brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; down as farmer not farrier; age 39yrs; 18yrs 3 months service; hepatitis chronic; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

McDonnell, James. Bo Artillery, 1853. Discharge papers; 1859; gunner age 26; occupation listed here as farrier; 5ft 9½; L/MIL/12/282 (LDS 2029781, 76).

McDonnell, John. Be Artillery, 1833?. 1840 Clive admissions; dates seem to fit the 1833 entry but from Limerick not Ballingarry; 27yrs old, 5ft 7¾; 6yr 8months service; fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; quite a cripple from injury in the foot; 9d a day; L-AG-23-2-65.

McDonough, Martin. M Artillery,? Not in presidential list. Clive pension; brigade sergeant; June 1846 at 1/- rate; age 41, 21yrs 11mths service; 5ft 7½, brown complexion, hazel eyes, brown hair; own request; L-AG-23-2-65.

McGrath, Jeremiah. Be Infantry, 1855. Medal roll, Mutiny medal with Delhi Clasp.

McGrath, John. Be Artillery, 1837. Clive admissions book 1840, crossed out, deceased?; age 25 at admission; 5ft 8½; 2yrs 10mths service; fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; 9d a day; injury of left or vent(?) thumb; L-AG-23-2-65.

McGrath, John. M Infantry, 1840. Received Indian Mutiny Medal with clasps for the Defence and taking of Lucknow (see Hodkinson, "Limerickmen in the 1st Madras Fusiliers during the Indian Mutiny of 1857-58", Old Limerick Journal 2019, Vol. 54.).

McGrath, Patrick. M. Infantry, 1839. According to presidential list he died 2 August 1857; but according to the medal and casualty rolls he was slightly wounded at Ooano, 29 July 1857 and went on to receive the Mutiny medal with clasps for the defence and recapture of Lucknow.

McGrath, Thomas. Be Cavalry, 1860. Discharge papers from 21st Hussars; 5yrs 202days service in India; 300 days service with Dublin Militia prior to EIC allowed to count, together with time returning makes 6yrs 125 days service; discharged unfit 29th August 1865 with hepatitis and general chacexia (wasting disease); age 21 at entry; 5ft 4, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; intended to return to Bruff; WO97/1292/114.

McIniry, John. M Infantry, 1837. Indian Mutiny Medal, no clasp (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

McIssay/McIssey, Richard. Bo Infantry, 1827. Clive pension; QMS; July 1841 at 1/- rate, age 38, 6yrs 14mths service (this should probably be 14y 6m); sallow complexion, hazel eyes, dark brown hair; paralysis of both legs; L-AG-23-2-65.

McKeogh/Keough, Patrick. M. Infantry, 1840. Clive pension; entered November 1869 at 1/- rate; 5ft 10; black and grey hair, hazel eyes, dark complexion; age 47, 22 yrs 135 days service; to pension; to live in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. Discrepancy with presidential list but not if he spent time in India after retiring.

McMahon, James. Letter, soldier inquiry form, postmarked Limerick 27th Jan 1858, stating his father is dead, mother Honora, Brothers John, Michael and Thomas, sister Catherine; no uncles or aunts; NLI Ms13,686. No indication of unit; in presidency lists there are only 2 James McMahons, one in Bengal who died 1840 is unlikely; the other is given as private in the 2nd Madras European Regt., with no further information than he entered 1840, so is the best probability.

McMahon, John. Bo. Artillery, 1845. Discharge papers, age 36, 5ft 7¾, with light brown hair, fresh complexion and grey eyes; made mark 26th January 1860; L/MIL/12/282 (LDS 2029781, 125). Clive pension; 9d rate; age 36, 14yrs 6mths service; worn out from chronic cough; to reside Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

McMahon, John. Bo Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers; from St. John's, enlisted Limerick; age 26 when discharged 30th September 1859; 5ft 6¼, black hair, fresh complexion, hazel eyes; made mark; L/MIL/12/286 (LDS 2029840, 518).

McMahon, Patrick. Bo Artillery 1824. Clive pension; June 1839; 35 yrs, 15yrs 8mths service; 5ft 7½, sallow complexion, hazel eyes, brown hair; labourer; varix (varicose veins); L-AG-23-2-65.

McMahon, Patrick. M Infantry, 1841. Indian Mutiny Medal with clasps for the Defence and capture of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen"). Slightly wounded at Oonao; (Tavender, Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny).

McMahon, William. Bo Infantry, ? Not in Embarkation list. Clive pension entered July 1831 at 9d rate; age 31, 4yrs 6months service; 5ft 8, fair complexion, blue eyes, light brown hair; labourer; loss of use of left hand; L-Ag-23-2-65.

McNamara, James. M Infantry, 1841. 1861 entry into Clive Fund pension book, from 14th Dec 1860; 1/- rate; 5 ft 5½, brown hair, grey eyes, age 51; 21 yrs service; time expired; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66 & WO23/19 Indian Army pensioners: registers of admission. Indian Mutiny Medal with clasps for Defence and capture of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen")

McNamara, John. Be recruit. Shipwrecked on the Protector 1838 (see Hodkinson, Protector).

McNamara, John. M Infantry, entered 1856. Indian Mutiny Medal, no clasps (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

McNamara, Matthew. M Artillery, entered 1846. Service up to joining RA only; 21 at enlistment, 5ft 9; rose to sergeant by 1856 but demoted 1858 back to gunner; black hair, grey eyes, robust; WO/97/1209/262.

McNamara, Michael. M Infantry. Discharged by EIC 81th April 1860, as unfit for further service, with slight opacity of the cornea and granular conjunctiva. 5ft 6½, brown hair, grey eyes. L/MIL 11/280 (LDS1886141, 314)

McNamara, Patrick. Be recruit. Shipwrecked on the Protector 1838 (see Hodkinson, Protector).

McNamara, Thomas. Bo Artillery, 1835. Clive pension; entered June 1839 at 9d rate; age 25, 3yrs 5mths service; 5ft 7¼, sallow complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; carpenter; injury of the groin and enlargement of the testis; L-AG-23-2-65.

Meany, Gerald. M Artillery, 1830. Clive Fund pension book entry 12th May 1852; 1/- rate; 5ft 10, brown hair, hazel eyes; age 42 cooper; 21 years' service, discharged at own request; to reside in Limerick. May 1852; newly admitted in Dublin and transferring to Limerick where received WO22/169 Dublin/Limerick. In pension book to 1858 when in Dublin for part of year; WO23/21 East India Company pensioners. Oct 1857 Limerick to Dublin; WO22/170 Dublin. 1858-65 seems to be in Limerick WO23/22 East India Company pensioners. Limerick to 1874; WO23/23 East India Company pensioners. April 1882 recorded as in Limerick, paid through Tralee; WO22/224 Tralee.

Meany, James. Bo Infantry, 1840. Discharge papers; 38; 5ft 7¼; brown hair, fresh complexion, blue eyes; from St. John's; undated, but pensione at 1/- in Europe; L/MIL/12/286 (LDS2029840, 898).

Meany, Lawrence. Be Cavalry, 1858. Discharge papers; from Hospital; age 22 at enlistment, service 1½yrs; 23yrs 7mths at discharge; made mark; 5ft 9½, dark brown hair, fresh complexion, hazel eyes; L/MIL/10/303 (LDS 1867085, 1407).

Meany, Michael. Bo. Infantry, 1840. Discharge papers; 39yrs 6mths; 5ft 5¾; dark brown hair, fresh complexion, blue eyes; from St. John's; signed; discharged to pension of 1/- in Europe; 5th May 1860; L/MIL/12/286 (LDS2029840, 900). Clive pension; 19yrs 9 months service; time expired; L-AG-23-2-66.

Meany, Thomas. Bo Artillery, 1835. Age 20 seems to have started career by deserting; Army Deserters 1828-1840.

Mears, Henry. M Infantry, 1846. Indian Mutiny Medal, no clasps. (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen")

Meehan, Patrick. Be Infantry 1839. Clive pension, entered Sept 1860 at 1/- rate; 5ft 5¾, black hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 40, 20yrs 11mths service; time expired; to live in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. Australian file on website; emigrated to Australia, died 1871, holder of Mutiny medal.

Millan, John. M Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers, 4th Nov. 1873; 22yrs 27days service; after termination of 2nd term of limited service, choosing Indian Regulations; two good conduct medals and Indian Mutiny Medal with Central India clasp; 13 times in defaulters, book, one court martial; wounded in left hand during Mutiny 19th April 1857 (recte 1858); private throughout service; 19 when enlisted 41 and 4mths on discharge; 5ft 6½ blue eyes, brown hair; pock pitted; intending to reside in London; WO 97/2051/149. Pension book, 1873-75, listing him as being in the 105th (recte 108th) marked "cannot be found"; lists transfer to Toronto WO22/299 Transfer of pensions. Not listed in Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny, Tavender; but the three listed casualties of the 3rd were all on the same date as Millan at Banda. Pension book; entered 19th Jan 1874; WO121/0227.

Mitchell, John. Bo Infantry, 1840. Clive pension; June 1846 at 9d rate; age 28, 5yrs 6mths service; 5ft 6, sallow complexion, blue eyes, dark brown hair; injury to left hand; L-AG-23-2-65.

Molloy, Robert. M Infantry, 24/09/39. Discharged by EIC 16/05/59. Forfeited 1 yr 274 days service because of court martial. Character, incorrigible. 5ft 5½, dark hair, fair complexion, blue eyes. L/MIL 11/280 (LDS1886141, 413)

Moloney, James. M Infantry, 1856. Indian Mutiny Medal with clasps for Defence and capture of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Moloney, Mathew. M Artillery, 1860. Attestation papers, 20yrs old; makes his mark; description at discharge 41 years, 5ft 7, blue eyes, brown hair, intending to reside in Limerick; re-engaged 1869 for 12 yrs; never rose above gunner, several transfers; served at home June to Dec 1860, in India 60-71, home 71-73, Nova Scotia Halifax 73-76, Barbados 76-80, Halifax 80-81 finishing at home; next of kin his brother Edward; also listed as 5ft 5½; medical record; WO97/ 1817/178. April, July & Oct 1882, paid at Limerick through Tralee district; WO22/224 & 225 Tralee.

Moloney, Michael. Be Artillery, 1852. Lahore division; died of wounds received by the mutineers of the 10th Light Cavalry, on August 19, 1857; Edinburgh Gazette, May 25th 1858.

Moloney/Maloney, William. M Infantry 1856. Clive pension; July 1860, 9d rate; 5ft 5¾, brown hair, hazel eyes, fresh complexion; age 22 3yrs service; gunshot wound, loss of fore and third finger of left hand; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. Does not appear in either medal or casualty list.

Mongoon/Mongovin, James. Be Artillery, 1841. Clive pension; August 1858 entered at 9d rate; 5ft 7¼, dark brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; age 40, 16yrs service; partial loss of motion of

right arm (no cause given); to live in Aldgate; L-AG-23-2-66 & WO23/19. 1858, new out pensioner in 2nd E London district; WO22/52. 1858-65 in same district WO23/22. Died 16/12/1858, in E London district, L-AG-23-2-68. Cannot locate in 1861 census.

Moore, George. St H Infantry. 1847 entered into the Limerick district pension book as newly arrived temporary pensioner, Jan.; transferred to New London by June; WO22/181 Limerick.

Moore, Nicholas. Bo Artillery, 1847. Clive pension; entered October 1860 at 9d rate; 5ft 10½, brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; age 34, 11yrs 11mths service; unfit for further service; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Moore, George. M Infantry, entered 1846. On Indian Mutiny medal roll with clasps for Relief of Lucknow and Capture of Lucknow (see Hodkinson, (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen"); there is however a problem Moore is on the casualty list as having been killed in action on 25th September, while the clasp for the capture was only for soldiers there from November after the relief. Possibly there is a transcription error here in Tavender "Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny"; a possible misreading is making November the 9th month; if so this would fit.

Moran, Andrew. Bo Artillery, 1837. Clive pension; bombardier 2nd Battalion; entered June 1853, at 9d rate; 5ft 10½, dark brown hair, brown eyes, fresh complexion; age 36; 16yrs service; secondary syphilis and chronic rheumatism; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Morgan, James. M Infantry, 1850. Discharge papers; Camp Deesa 6th August, 1873; Sergeant Major; discharged at own request after 2nd period of service; chose Royal regulations for pension; 5 good conduct badges and medal for long service and good conduct; never in trouble; rose to sergeant by 1857; appointed Quarter master Sergeant to the 15th Reg NI from March 1859 to Oct 1860, then Sergeant Major to 39th Reg. NI during which time he re-engaged in Trichinopoly, at which point remanded to 2nd Europeans as private; granted 2yrs boon; promoted to sergeant in local company Aug 1863, then (acting?) sergeant major to 35th Reg NI, to Dec 1869, the SM to 25th NI to Aug 1873; transferred to HM 108th May 1873 for purposes of discharge; final discharge 28/05/74; 23yrs at entry 46 at discharge; 5ft 6¾, blue eyes, brown hair; intended residence Mangalore in Madras presidency; WO97/2056/127. Entered into pension book 26 May 1874; WO23/152 Admission book: pensions payable in the colonies.

Moroney, Daniel. M Infantry. Cannot locate in presidency list; this man appears in the admission to pension book; age 40, ELI (2nd Madras Europeans); Indian rules, 2 boon years; 21yrs service; born St. Michael's parish, a stuccoman?; pensioned in Madras; WO23/152 Admission book: pensions payable in the colonies.

Moroney, Daniel, entered 1853. 3rd Madras Fusiliers; Indian Mutiny Medal for Central India.

Clive pension; gunner at 9d rate; unfit for further service; retired to Croagh; L-AG-23-2-66.

Mulcahy, Jeremiah. Bo Infantry, 1827. Clive pension, July 1841 at 9d rate; age 34, 14yrs 4mths service; 5ft 5¼, fresh complexion, blue eyes, brown hair; chronic rheumatism; L-AG-23-2-65.

Mulcahy, William. M Artillery, entered 1850. Discharge papers; Secunderabad 20th Oct 1871; corporal; discharge at own request after 21 yrs; Indian regulations; 5 good conduct badges, medal for Pegu (clasp to Indian General Service medal) and Mutiny Medal with Central India clasp; once in defaulters' book; transferred to 4b in Jan 1858; reenlisted in Secunderabad; promoted Bombardier and Corporal in RA where served in 17th, 23rd and 6th brigades; 2 boon years; 20yrs at enlistment 41 yrs 4mths at discharge, grey eyes, light brown hair; to reside at Hyderabad in the Deccan; WO97/1819/36.

Mullins, James. Be Infantry, 1839. Clive pension book; admitted 18th June 1850 at 1/3d; 5ft 7, brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; age 30; 9yrs 2 months service; discharged with loss of right arm from a wound received at battle of Goojerat; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Mulquany, Francis. Be Infantry, 1842. Pension books 1850-65; show him on 9d rate; in 1853 moving to Liverpool, 1854 to Kilkenny, 1856 to Liverpool 1857 to Carlow 1959 to Liverpool and 1860 to Carlow and still alive in 1865; no indication of cause of invalidity; WO23/21, WO22/48 Liverpool & WO23/22. Clive pension; 9d rate; 5ft 6, brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; 35 at discharge after 11yrs 2months service; wounded in left thigh in action; L-AG-23-2-66.

Mulqueen, Michael. The Army deserters list 1833, lists an MM, labourer, age 20 from Kildrims(Kildimo?) as a deserter from the HEIC artillery; there is no indication as to which presidency.

Murphy, James, Bo Artillery, 1824. Changed from Infantry. Clive pension, June 1839 at 9d rate; age 34, 15yrs 4mths service; 5ft 7½, fair complexion, blue eyes, brown hair; labourer; chronic rheumatism; L-AG-23-2-65.

Murphy, John. M Infantry, entered 1841. Clive pension; 1861 May entered into pension book, from Madras European Veterans; 1/- rate; 5ft 4¾, brown hair, blue eyes; Age 38, hairdresser, very good conduct; 19yrs service; time expired to live in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. 1861, May, Limerick District listed as new pensioner; WO22/182 Limerick. Indian Mutiny medal; there were two John Murphys in the regiment and it is not clear which one this is; one had no clasp, the other had clasps for the Defence and Capture of Lucknow; (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Murphy, Patrick. M Infantry, 03/08/59. Discharged 15th Sept 1859 from EIC. Enlisted age 20, 5ft 6, light hair, hazel eyes. Made mark. L/MIL/11/279 (LDS1886125).

Murphy, Robert. M Artillery, 1826. Clive pension; labourer; December 1843 at 9d rate; age 37, 17yrs service; 5ft 5, florid complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; unfit for the service; L-AG-23-2-65.

Murphy, Timothy. M Infantry 1827. Clive pension; labourer; May 1848 at 1/- rate; age 46, 21yrs service; 5ft 7¼, dark complexion, brown eyes, dark brown hair; own request; L-AG-23-2-65.

Murray, Michael. Be Infantry, 1854. Discharge papers; moved from ER to 104th then in 1871 to 36th regiment of foot from which he was discharged at own request on termination of 2nd period of service on 26th May 1874; Indian Mutiny medal (clasp for Delhi; medal roll); 22yrs 15 days service of which over 19 in India, including 2 boon years; private throughout service; from Newcastle, enlisted age 19; 5ft 6, fresh complexion, hazel eyes, brown hair; to reside at St. Marin's P???, Woolwich Kent; WO97/2062/101.

Myers, William. Bo Artillery, 1829. Clive pension; entered June 1851 at 1/- rate; 5ft 7¾, brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 40, 21yrs service; gardener; time expired; from Kilflane? Kilmallock retired to Kilmallock; L-AG-23-2-66.

Nagle, David. M Artillery, entered 1833. 1852? service record; born Doonas Co. Limerick; 22 on enlistment, 5ft 10; served in 1b through 1st enlistment, rising to corporal; rejoined in 4b rising to sergeant; 187s 153 days service when invalided; brown hair, grey eyes; good conduct; no reason given for invalidity; WO97/1209/99.

Nash, James. Be Artillery, 1857. Discharge papers; enlisted in London,; labourer from Croom; 21 at entry; discharged unfit after 13yrs 331 days service (inclusive of 2 yr boon) 12th April 1870; volunteer to RA in 1861, transferring to Horse Artillery in 1862; Indian Mutiny medal without clasp; never rose above gunner; Indian pension rules; discharged with debility possibly aggravated by intemperance; injured at Rawalpindi when horse rolled on him, injuring right side; will be able to contribute to his livelihood; 5ft 8½, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; to reside in Croom; WO 97/1820/113.

Nash, Michael. M Infantry, entered 1847. Indian Mutiny Medal with clasp for capture of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen")

Neal, Cornelius. M Artillery, entered 1829. Reilly, James. Be Artillery, 1860. Discharge papers; discharge 29th January 1871 after 10½yrs all in India; unfit with heart problem; conduct poor often in cells; Indian pension rules; from St. Mary's, age 25 at entry; 5ft 9½, fresh complexion, blue eyes, brown hair; to reside 132 George St, Limerick, crossed out and Whitechapel London added; WO97/1828/152.

Reynolds, Patrick. Be Infantry, ? Not in presidency list. Clive pension; private; labourer; October 1846, at 1/3d rate; age 26, 7yrs service; 5ft 6½, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; loss of left arm from wound received in action; L-AG-23-2-65.

Riely, Patrick. Bo Artillery, 1849. Not in presidency list. Discharge papers; from Kilfinnan, a labourer, enlisted at Cork, 9th May 1849; age 30 at discharge; 5ft 8¾, brown hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes; discharged 10th October 1859; made mark; L/MIL/12/282 (LDS 2029781, 689).

Robinson, Thomas. Be Infantry, 1839. Clive pension; entered July 1857 at 9d rate; 5ft 6, black hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 42, 17yrs 50 days service; general debility from disease; L-AG-23-2-66.

Rought, Michael. Be Artillery, 1851. In Lahore division, slightly wounded by the mutineers of the 10th Light Cavalry on August 19th 1857; Edinburgh Gazette, May 25th 1858.

***Ruddle/Ruddell, John.** Be Artillery, 1832. Clive pension; sergeant major of 44th NI; entered May 1854 at 2/- rate; 5ft 8, brown hair, grey eyes, sallow complexion; age 43 with 21yrs 4months service;

left at own request; to reside at Loughil; *later entry **Mary Ruddell** his widow receiving 4½ rate, August 1861; birthplace (her?) Ballynagarde; L-AG-23-2-66.

Ryan, Daniel. Be Artillery, 1855/1860. Discharge papers; entered 89 in 1855, volunteered to Bengal Artillery and promoted corporal 1860, then to Royal Artillery 1861 where reduced to gunner and horse artillery 1862; discharged 7th August 1876 with 21 yrs service, in Malta, Crimea, Gibraltar, Cape of Good Hope and 18yrs in India; medal for Crimea with Sebastopol clasp and Turkish Crimean medal; discharged unfit, with debility; 21 at entry; 5ft 9½, fresh complexion, dark brown hair, hazel eyes; to reside in Limerick; WO97/1831/90.

Ryan, Edward. Neither Edwards in the Madras list match this man, who in March 1851 became an out pensioner of the Limerick District; he may, of course, have been born outside Limerick; WO22/181 Limerick.

Ryan, Edward. M Artillery, 1829. Clive pension; entered 19th March 1851, 1/- rate; 5ft 6¾, brown hair, grey eyes, florid complexion; age 42, left with 21yrs service at own request; to Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. 1856 in main list possibly misreading for 1850.

Ryan, John. Be Infantry,? Not in main list but in Clive pension book as Quarter Master Sergeant of 23rd NI; admitted to pension of 2/3d on 13th March 1861; 5ft 5⅞, dark brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; ropemaker; 19yrs 9 months service, time expired; age 37 at discharge; from St. John's; to live in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Ryan, John. M Infantry, entered 1856. Indian Mutiny medal with clasps for relief and capture of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Ryan, John. Bo Infantry, 1840. Discharge papers; sergeant; 37yrs 9mths; 5ft 6, light brown hair, fresh complexion, blue eyes; from St John's; discharged to pension of 2/- in Europe; L/MIL/12/286 (LDS2029840, 1110). Clive pension; entered October 1860; time expire; to live in Cork; L-AG-23-2-66.

Ryan, Michael. Be Infantry, 1809. Clive pension; quartermaster sergeant; entered September 1832 at 2/- rate; age 41, 22yrs 10 months service; 5ft 5, dark complexion, blue eyes, brown hair; length of service; L-Ag-23-2-65.

Ryan, Michael. M Artillery, entered 1825. Service record, 1846?; 12yrs for 1st enlistment and 3 for second, with extra service 21 yrs 61 days; invalided; rose to bombardier, corporal, then sergeant; born St. John's; weaver, enlisted Westminster age 20, 5ft 5¼, blue eyes, light brown hair; good conduct; WO97/120/97.

Ryan, Patrick. M. Infantry, 1830. Clive pension; May 1848 at 9d rate; age 37, 15yrs service; 5ft 7¼, fair complexion, blue eyes, brown hair; broken constitution and general debility; L-AG-23-2-65.

Ryan, Patrick. M Infantry, 1856? 1860 July 2nd; entry to Clive pension 9d; 5ft 6, fair hair, grey eyes, age 21; good conduct; 3yrs 2 mths service; very bad wound, loss of little finger of left hand; residence Nenagh; annotated increased to 1/3 from 2nd April 1895; L-AG-23-2-66. Indian Mutiny Medal with clasps for defence and capture of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen"). Wounded at Lucknow (Tavender; Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny). Does not seem to be in 1901 census in

Nenagh. No PR in 1MF entered that year; however one in 2MF discharged around right time; transfer?

Ryan, Patrick. Be Infantry, entered 1847 and Madras Infantry, entered 1860. Discharge papers, Dinapore 16th Nov 1867; joined European Light Infantry 1860 and in 1861 volunteered to British army; allowed 12 years' service for time in 2nd Bengal Infantry 1847-59 and 2 boon years; Indian rules pension; total service 20yrs 219 days; 4 good conduct medals, one long service medal; medal for Punjab (Indian Mutiny Crossed out), once in defaulters' book; discharged with asthemia; born St. John's, attested Limerick 1860 (suggesting he went home after Bengal Service) age 30; 38 yrs 118 days on May 5th 1868; 5ft 7½, grey eyes, sandy hair; to reside in Dublin; WO97/1684/207.

Ryan, Patrick. Be Artillery, 1852. Discharge papers; discharged time expired 27th June 1871, after 21 yrs service including 2 boon years; rough rider for 10 days in 1858, transfer to horse artillery in 1859, bombardier then corporal in 1860; volunteer to RA in 1861, to HA in 1863, promoted sergeant tried but sentence remitted; tried again and reduced to gunner 1864, then rose through ranks to become sergeant again by 1870 at which level discharged; 18½yrs in India; Indian Mutiny medal; 20 at enlistment; 5ft 10¼, fresh complexion, blue eyes, brown hair; to reside in Limerick; WO97/1831/119.

Ryan, Thomas. M Infantry. Discharge papers, Dinapore, 22nd March 1866; completed 21 yrs; 4 good conduct, in defaulters' book 4 times, court martial once; Indian rules; rose to corporal in Company service but reduced to private after court martial, at which rank he stayed; age 18 at entry 37 yrs 2 months on discharge, 5ft 6, blue eyes, brown hair; to reside at Doon; annotated that he claimed the loss of an eye in service, but claim dismissed; WO/1684/208.

Ryan, William. M Infantry, 1827. Clive pension; labourer; July 1843 at 9d rate; age 38, 15yrs 8mths service; 5ft 5½, fair complexion, hazel eyes, grey hair; unfit for further service; L-AG-23-2-65.

Ryan, William. Bo Infantry, 1863. Clive pension; sergeant in 103rd reg; September 1863, 2/- rate; 5ft 6½, black hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 44, 22yrs 7 months service; labourer; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. Does not seem to match the WRs in main list.

Scanlan, James. M infantry; entered 1853. Discharge record; Camp Deesa, 4th Oct. 1871; Quartermaster Sergeant; 20 years 176 days, claimed after end of 2nd engagement; India Rules; good conduct, Mutiny Medal with clasp for Central India; immediately into 3rd Regt, where rose quickly to sergeant, by 1858, at which rank he went into 108th; Colour sergeant 1862, OP B? (Brigade?) Sergeant 1863 to 1871, moved to unattached list as QMS "Aho?" Sanitarium to end career; born St. Johns, 20yrs and 4 mths at entry; 39.5 at discharge, grey eyes, light brown hair; to reside at, Limerick crossed out, Mayfield Factory, Portlaw, Co. Waterford; WO97/2097/12. For the cotton factory at Portlaw see

Scanlan, John. Be Artillery, 1826. The *Limerick Chronicle* of 10th May 1826 records the commitment to gaol of a John Scanlan, deserter from the EIC. If this is the same man as the one in the Embarkation list, then he was generously allowed to take his wife and child to India with him.

Scanlan, Thomas. Bo Infantry, 1842. Clive pension; June 1848 with notation that raise to 1/- in October 1878; age 30, 3yrs 10mths service; 5ft 6⁵/₈, pale complexion, grey yes, dark brown hair; loss of use of left leg; L-AG-23-2-65.

Shanahan, Michael. M Infantry, entered 1841. Indian Mutiny Medal with clasp for defence of Lucknow, where he was killed (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Shaney/Shanny, Richard. Be Infantry, 1839. Spelt Shanny here and nailer not sailor; Clive pension; entered July 1852 at 9d rate; 5ft 6, brown hair, blue eyes, sallow complexion; age 38, after 11yrs 6months service; gunshot wound of right leg on active service; to retire to Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

***Shaughnessy, James.** M Infantry, entered 1827. Entry of widow to pension book from 18/05/52; Clive Fund, widows in Madras; L-AG-23-2-53.

Shaughnessy, Michael. Be Artillery, c1828. Not in main presidency list but in embarkation list for 1827. Clive pension; corporal 4th co 2nd batt; entered August 1854; 5ft 7, grey hair, hazel eyes, brown complexion; age 50; labourer; 26yrs 7months service; unfit for active service; born Askeaton to live in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Shaughnessy, Simon. Be Artillery, 1811. Clive pension; gunner; 1834, 1/- rate; age 46; 5ft 8³/₄, fresh complexion, hazel eyes, fair hair; 22¹/₂yrs service; discharged as unfit for service; L-AG-23-2-65. Appears in alphabetical pension lists to 1848; L-AG-23-2-40

Shea, Timothy. M Artillery, entered 1830. Entry to pension list, Clive Fund; 1/- rate from 12th May 1852; 5ft 7 blue eyes, brown hair; harness maker; 22 yrs 2 months service; conduct good; discharged at own request; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66. Pension book, 1852, May, records his transfer to the Limerick District from Dublin No2; WO22/21 Limerick. 1852 June Limerick pension book notes transfer to District cancelled; WO22/21 Limerick.

Sheahan, John. Be Artillery, 1848. Pension records show a gunner JS entered pension September 1860 at 9d rate, dying in Tralee district 2nd March 61, age 34; WO22/199 Tralee. Clive pension; 5ft 11³/₄, brown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; age 33 10yrs 11 months service; broken constitution contracted on actual service; from Ardagh; to reside Ballymena? Tralee; L-AG-23-2-66.

Sheahan, John. M Infantry, 1853. According to presidency list he was dead when the following happened; discharged 6th January 1860, age 25; 5ft 5¹/₂, brown hair, fresh complexion, hazel eyes. Made his mark. L/MIL/11/281 (LDS1886142 1293).

Sheahan/Sheehan, Patrick. M Artillery, 1839. Clive pension; entered October 1860 at 2/- rate; 5ft 7³/₄, black hair, grey eyes, dark complexion; age 43, 22yrs 11mths service; at own request; to reside Kilrush Co. Clare; L-AG-23-2-66.

Sheahan, William. M Artillery, 1837. Clive pension; entered December 1856 at 1/- rate; 5ft 11³/₄, brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; age 42, 21yrs service, very bad conduct; at own request; to live in Tipperary; L-AG-23-2-66.

Sheehan, James. Be? Artillery, ? Clive pension; entered August 1858 at 1/3 rate; 5ft 11, fair hair, grey eyes, sallow complexion; age, 9yrs 1 month service; fracture of radii and ulnae from explosion of a gun at exercise; from Ardagh retired to Ballycummin; L-AG-23-2-66. Possibly the JS enlisted 1848 but details of birthplace different.

Sheehan, John. Be Infantry, 1849. Clive pensioner; entered 20th July 1859, 9d rate; 5ft 6, black hair, grey eyes, dark complexion; 9¼yrs service; discharged with disease of the liver & broken constitution; from Fenagh; L-AG-23-2-66.

Sheehan, Patrick. Bo Infantry, 1841. Clive pension; admitted June 1857 at 9d rate; 5ft 8, brown hair, grey eyes, fair complexion; age 34, 15 yrs 9months service; disease of the heart; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Sheehan/Shehan, Thomas. M Artillery, 1813. Clive pension; entered May 1837 at 2/- rate; age 41, 24yrs service; fair complexion, blue eyes, light hair; time expired, at own request; L-AG-23-2-65.

Sheehy, Denis. Be Artillery, 1854/60. Discharge papers; attested to 88th June 1854, transferred to Be artillery 1860, then to RA 1861; finally discharged October 1876 at end of second period of engagement; 10yrs 4mths in India; Mutiny Medal with clasp for Central India; gunner throughout service; attested at Rathkeale age 17; 5ft 8, fresh complexion, grey eyes, sandy hair; to reside at Gravesend; WO97/1833/77.

Sheehy, Edward. Be Artillery, 1854/60. Discharge papers; attested to 88th Spetember 1854, to Be Artillery 1860 then RA 1861; transferred to Be artillery as bombardier, rising to corporal, then with RA to sergeant before being reduced to gunner, rising again to bombardier before second reduction; served 1yr 5months in Crimea and 11 in India; Crimea medal with clasp for Sevastopol, Turkish Crimean medal and Indian Mutiny medal with clasp for Central India; discharged unfit 30th March 1869, with debility as a result of service; attested Rathkeale age 19; 5ft 8, fresh complexion, grey eyes, dark hair; to live in Ballingarry; WO97/1349/22

Sheehy, Patrick. M Artillery, entered 1835. Clive pension book entry 1857; 9d rate, 17th June; 6ft, brown hair, grey eyes; freckled complexion; age 46; indifferent conduct; unfit for further service, after 20yrs 6mths; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Shields/Shiels, John. Be Infantry, 1839. Clive pension, June 1847 at 9d rate; age 28, 7yrs 2mths service; 5ft 5½, sallow complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; almost blind from ophthalmia; L-AG-23-2-65.

Slattery, Thomas. Be Infantry, 1859. Worldwide army index 1871 places him at Mooltan; WO12/9881.

Smith, William. Bo. Artillery, 1845. Discharge papers; from St. John's, age 24 t entry; 16yrs service in India inclusive of 2 boon years; discharged with general disability; rose to bombardier 1846-7 but reduced; at siege and capture of Multan in 1848; 5ft 9, grey hair, hazel eyes and fresh complexion; discharged 24th December 1860; signed papers; L/MIL/12/282 (LDS 2029781, 922). Clive pension; to live in Enniskillen; L-AG-23-2-66.

Smithwick, John. Be? Not in presidency list. Clive pension; sub-conductor; June 1869 at 2/6 rate; 5ft 6, bown hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; labourer; age 43½, 21yrs 10 months service; to pension; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Spillane/Spellane, John. Be Artillery 1815. Clive pension; corporal; cooper; July 1842 at 1/- rate; age 43, 26yrs service; 5ft 6½, fair complexion, grey eyes, light hair; worn out; L-AG-23-2-65.

Stark, Henry, Be Artillery, 1852. Discharge papers; rose to Sergeant with Be Artillery and reduced before rising again to corporal, corporal on transfer to RA then reduced to gunner for rest of service; discharged 2nd April 1872, with 2 boon years, at end of 2nd period of service; 19 yrs in India; Indian Mutiny Medal with clasp for Lucknow; Indian rules pension; 20 years at enlistment; 5ft 8¾, fresh complexion, hazel eyes, light brown hair; to reside in Limerick; WO97/1836/194.

Steele, James. Bo. Infantry, ? Not in main list but Clive pension; sergeant in 1st European Reg.; 2/- rate from 8th August 1849; 5ft 7½, brown hair, hazel eyes, fair hair; age 43 at discharge; no trade; 21yrs 3 months' service; time expired; born in and retired to Rathkeale; L-AG-23-2-66.

Stewart, William. M Infantry, 1836. Clive pension; sub-conductor, originally Madras Fusiliers; entered April 1858 at 2/- rate; 5ft 7, light hair, hazel eyes, fair complexion; age 46, 21yrs service; own request as time expired; to reside in Limerick; not that he was taken off roll in 1872 for felony and readmitted 1879; L-AG-23-2-66.

Stokes, Michael. Farrier Be Artillery 1824. Clive pension; gunner; May 1846 at 1/- rate; age 42, 21yrs 1mth service; 5ft 9, dark complexion, blue eyes, brown hair; impaired constitution; L-AG-23-2-65. Emigrated to Australia, see Australia file on Limerick Museum website; https://www.limerick.ie/sites/default/files/atoms/files/some_limerick_and_clare_military_pensione_rs_in_australia.pdf

Stoman/Sloman, William T. Bo Infantry, 1856. Spelt Sloman here. Discharge papers; private 1st Bombay ER; 23 at discharge; 5ft 6½, brown hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes; enlisted in London; made mark; discharged 20th October 1859; L/MIL/12/284 (LDS2029782, 1371).

Storie, John. Be Artillery 1860. Attestation papers; St. Mary's, age 20; 5ft 8¾, sallow complexion, dark grey eyes, light brown hair; Presbyterian; discharged from Coastal Brigade, Guernsey and Alderney district 17th December 1889; to RA 1861; July 1881 to Coastal Brigade after 21yrs; elected Indian pension rules; 28yrs 229 days' service in total; served twice in India 1860-65 and 1873-81; medal for Afhanistan with clasp for Ahmed Khel, and long service and good conduct medal; next of kin Barbara his mother; several bouts of venereal disease and ague (malaria) in full medical history, vaccinated; WO97/3959/103.

Sullivan, James. M Artillery, entered 1846. Discharge papers Jan. 12th 1866, 20yrs 299 days; no good conduct medals, Mutiny medal with clasp for Central India; 27 times in defaulters' book and 2 courts martial; Indian rules for pension; gunner throughout, 2 years boon; on health side an entry for worn out is crossed out; age 20 at entry, 38 crossed out and 39yrs 8mths added faintly at exit; 5ft 6½, grey eyes, dark brown hair; to reside in Limerick; WO97/1351/169.

Sullivan, John. M Artillery, entered 1850. Discharge papers, Cannanore 17th Dec. 1870; 21 yrs 70 days; one good conduct medal, 48 times in defaulters' book, 9 courts martial; makes mark; Indian

pension rules; gunner throughout; born at Ferrybridge Kildimo; 20 when entered 40.5 on leaving; grey hair, brown eyes, 5ft 8; to reside in Dublin; not across bottom that convicted on 3rd Jn. 1887 at Southampton, before the Mayor, for deserting wife and children and sent to prison for 1 month and pension to be suspended and paid to wife; WO97/1838/97.

Sullivan John. Be Artillery, 1854/60. Discharge papers; enlisted to 14th foot 1854, transferred to 35th in 1857, to Bengal Artillery 1860 and to RA 1861; rose once to corporal but demoted; 21 yrs service, discharged June 1876, on completion of second term; served in Malta 8 months, Crimea 1½yrs and India 18½; Crimea Medal with unnamed clasp, Turkish Crimean medal and Indian Mutiny medal; wounded by bullet in hip in Crimea 18th June 1855; from Abbeyfeale, attested age 17 at Limerick; 5ft 8½, fair complexion, grey eyes, brown hair, to reside at Abbeyfeale; WO97/1838/98.

Sullivan, Patrick. M Artillery, entered 1856. Discharge papers, Bellary 13th Dec 1862; born Toornafulla nr Newcastle; entered age 21; 8yrs service, discharged unfit for further service; one good conduct medal; attested to 3rd Madras Infantry and then to artillery after 1yr 112 days; 2boon years; elected HM pension regulations; fell off a horse while on duty, suffered concussion, which lead to deafness; final discharge 11/08/63; 5ft 7¾, grey eyes, brown hair; to reside in Newcastlewest; annotated "one year provisional 08/08/65" (presumably pension) and "man went to America"; WO97/1351/189.

Sullivan, Thomas. Be Artillery, 1857. Discharge papers; tried 3 times before joining RA in 1860, including 50 lashes; discharged 7th April 1868, with 14yrs service, inclusive of 2 boon years; discharged unfit for further service with phthisis and feeble heart and other complaints; Indian pension rules; Indian Mutiny Medal which he has lost through carelessness; from St. Mary's age 21 at enlistment; 5ft 8, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; to reside in Limerick; WO97/1351/195.

Sullivan, William. Be Artillery, 1824. Clive pension, May 1846 at 1/- rate; age 47, 21yrs 5mths service; 5ft 6, dark complexion, blue eyes, dark hair; chronic rheumatism and general debility; L-AG-23-2-65.

Sweeney, John. Bo Infantry 1858. Discharge papers; private 1st Bombay ER; 22 at discharge, on 11th January 1860; made mark; 5ft 4¾, black hair, sallow complexion, hazel eyes; made mark; L/MIL/12/284 (LDS2029782, 1421).

Sweeney, Thomas. Bo Infantry 1823. Clive pension; labourer; May 1844 at 1/- rate; age 40 21yrs 5mths service; 5ft 5¼, fresh complexion, grey eyes, dark hair; length of service; L-AG-23-2-65

Switzer, Peter William. Be Artillery, 1852. Discharge papers; almost 19yrs in India; discharged at end of 2nd engagement; rose to sergeant in BE Artillery then moved to unattached list as carpenter sergeant; 1861 volunteered to RA but still unattached as Park Sergeant, returning to regular duty October 1871; discharged May 1873; age 20 at enlistment; 5ft 11, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; scar on forehead and mark of a burn above left ear; intending to live at Dharamsala, Punjab; WO97/1838/54. Synam/Synan, Robert. Be Artillery, 1844. Alternate spelling of name given in Edinburgh Gazette, April 20th 1858, 773.

Thomas, Maurice. M Artillery, 1840. Entry to pension book, Clive Fund, 29th Sept 1858 at 9d rate; 5ft 5, light brown hair, grey eyes; age 39, good conduct; worn out 17yrs service; from Galbally, to reside in Kilfinane; L-AG-23-2-66.

Thompson, John. Bo Infantry, 1853. Discharge papers; age 24; 5ft 6, brown hair, fresh complexion, hazel eyes; 26th January 1860; made mark; L/MIL/12/286 (LDS 2029840, 830).

Toohil, Patrick. M Infantry, 1846. Indian Mutiny medal no clasp (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen") Not in casualty list as he probably died, without seeing action, from disease or heatstroke (Tavender; Casualty Roll for the Indian Mutiny).

Toomey, Daniel. M Infantry. Discharge papers; 3rd September 1858, age 26 at discharge, 5ft 5¾, brown hair, fresh complexion, blue eyes. Unfit due to consumption. Made mark. L/MIL/11/281 (LDS1886142,1644)

Toomy, Patrick. Bo Infantry. Letter postmarked Limerick April 19th 1848, to EIC. Hon'd Sir. I do therefore return you the names of the names of the above mentioned deceased soldiers family who if required will and shall make their declaration before the magistrate along with me. The father of the deceased soldier's name is Jno. Toomey; Me his the deceased soldiers mothers name Catherine Toomey; and the deceased soldiers two sisters are Johanna Toomey and Mary Toomey; Unto whom I hope you will order an equal dividend. Please to direct to the care of Thomas Geary, Mary Street, Limerick, for Jno Toomey and wife"; marked replied 28/4/48. NLI Ms13,686.

Torpey/Torphey, Michael. Bo. Artillery, 1826. Clive pension; entered June 1834 at 6d rate; age 24, 5yrs service; 5ft 6, fresh complexion, grey eyes, black hair; loss of left leg; L-Ag-23-2-65. Pension book 1849-58 at Ennis; WO 23/21. Ditto 1858-65; WO23/22.

Torpy, Patrick. M Infantry, 1841. Indian Mutiny Medal with clasp for capture of Lucknow (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Tracy, Peter. Be Infantry, 1860. Discharge papers; discharged 1881 after 21yrs service on termination of 2nd engagement; born St John's, age 22 at enlistment; corporal 1865, sergeant 1868. Reduced 1870 and back to sergeant by discharge; medical history with papers, with several occurrences of ague (malaria); 2nd batt. Royal Munster Fusiliers at discharge; 5ft 8, fresh complexion, grey eyes, brown hair; slightly pock pitted; to live at Ashton Under Lyne; WO97/2124/18.

Treahy, John. Be Artillery, 1840. Clive pension; entered June 1856 at 9d rate; 5ft 8, fair hair, blue eyes, fresh complexion; 41yrs old 15yrs 5months service; varicose veins and loss of right eye; retired to Shanagolden; L-AG-23-2-66.

Tubbs, William. M Infantry, 1857. A late arrival to the action, who got the Indian Mutiny Medal without clasp (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen").

Tully, Stephen. Be Infantry, 1841. Clive pension book; 2/- rate, 5ft 8; 19yrs service, time expired; to live in Listowel; L-AG-23-2-66.

Tuthil, Richard. Be recruit. Shipwrecked on the Protector 1838 (see Hodkinson, Protector).

Twohey, John. M Artillery, ? Not in embarkation list; but in returned list; Clive pension; gunner; June 1833 at 1/- rate; age 37, 15yrs service; 5ft 8, fair complexion, hazel eyes, light hair; unfit for duty from a rupture; L-Ag-23-2-65.

Twohy, Michael. M Artillery, 1847. Discharge papers; Woolwich Sept 1st 1866; 21yrs service, medically unfit for further service; conduct exemplary; makes mark; 2yr boon, gunner throughout service; pulmonary condition, little chance of earning a livelihood; 21 at entry, 40yrs 8mths on final discharge 18th Sept; 5ft 7, grey eyes, brown hair; to reside in Castleconnell; WO97/1353/235.

Ural, James. M Infantry, 1856. Discharge papers, Portland 29th April 1875; 21 yrs service 13 in India; termination of 2nd term of service; good conduct, Indian Mutiny Medal with clasps for defence and capture of Lucknow; 4 times in defaulters book, one court martial; 2yr boon; rose to corporal in Company service, sergeant in local forces at which level he transferred to the regular HM army, rising to sergeant instructor of musketry, then colour sergeant before being reduced to private for drunkenness in 1870, working his way back to sergeant at discharge; born St. Michael's, 18 at entry 36yrs 8mths at discharge; 5ft 11, grey eyes, brown hair; to reside at Hartington Derbyshire; WO97/2127/70.

Vaughan, John. Bo Infantry 1824. Clive pension; July 1841 at 9d rate; age 37, 17yrs 6mths service; 5ft 7. Fresh complexion, grey eyes, dark hair; labourer; enlargement of testicles; L-AG-23-2-65.

Vaughan, John. Be Artillery, 1824. Clive pension; July 1840; age 38, 15yrs service; 5ft 10½, fresh complexion, blue eyes, brown hair; loss of use of left hand and incurable deafness; L-AG-23-2-65.

Wall, James. Be Artillery. Not in main list but Clive pension; gunner 6th batt; 1/- a day; entered pension 27th June 1849; 5ft 9, dark brown hair, grey eyes, callow complexion; 46yrs at discharge; blacksmith; 21yr 4months service; born Ardcanry, to live in Pallaskenry; L-AG-23-2-66.

Wallace, John. Be Artillery, 1845. Discharge papers; from Ballinbana, Kilmallock; attested Dublin age 24; 18yrs 295days in India including 2 boon years; elected Indian pension rules; Punjab medal with 2 clasps; promoted twice to bombardier and reduced to gunner then rose to sergeant; final discharge 23rd June 1863, with c20yrs service; discharged with chronic hepatitis from RHA; 5ft 9. Brown hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; retired to Kilmallock; WO97/1354/158.

Walsh, Edward. Be recruit. Shipwrecked on the Protector 1838 (see Hodkinson, Protector).

Ward, James. Be recruit. Shipwrecked on the Protector 1838 (see Hodkinson, Protector),

Walsh, John. Bo Artillery, 1844. Discharge papers; invalid gunner, age 37 at discharge, 5ft 7½, brown hair, fresh complexion, grey eyes; signed papers; discharged 10th January 1860; L/MIL/12/282 (LDS 2029781, 1151). Clive pension at 9d rate increased to 1/- in 1896; heart affection; L-AG-23-2-66.

Walsh, John. Bo Infantry, 1846. Discharge papers; 18 at entry; 15yrs 54 days service inclusive of boon, 232days in Europe 13yrs in India; present at the surrender of Multan and battle of Goojerat;

5ft 7¼, light brown hair, grey eyes, sallow complexion; made mark; discharged unfit; L/MIL/12/284 (LDS2029782, 1509). Clive pension; 9d rate; unfit for further service; L-AG-23-2-66. In batta list; L/MIL/261; p224 of film.

Walsh, Thomas. Bo Infantry, 1840. This man is listed as dead in the presidency list! Discharge papers; 38yrs 5 months at discharge; 5ft 4¾, light brown hair, fair complexion, blue eyes; discharged 13th April 1860 pensioned at 1/- a day in Europe; signed; L/MIL/12/284 (LDS2029782, 1515).

Ware, Robert. M Infantry, 1859. Discharge papers, Colombo, 31st August, 1883; 20yrs 353 day's service, India, Gibraltar and Ceylon; end of 2nd term of engagement; conduct very good, 3times in defaulters' book; private throughout service; 20yrs at entry 41yrs 1mth at discharge; 5 ft 5, grey eyes, brown hair; to reside at 419 Strand, London; WO97/2132/127.

Welsh, John. M Artillery, ? The only JW in the presidential list whose dates more or less fit, died in 1836. Clive pension; sergeant; labourer; July 1845 at 2/- rate; age 44, 21yrs 150 days service; 5ft 6¾, fair complexion, hazel eyes, light brown hair; own request; L-AG-23-2-65.

Whealan, James. Bo. Artillery, ? Not in presidential list. Clive pension; sergeant Bo. Horse Artillery; entered July 1867 at 2/- rate; 5ft 8, grey hair, grey eyes, fresh complexion; cooper; age 40, 22yrs 4 months service; time expired; born and returned to Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Whelan, John. Bo Artillery 1840. Discharge papers; invalid gunner, age 36 at discharge; 5ft 5, black hair, fresh complexion and blue eyes; pension of 1/6d a day, wound pension, to be paid in Europe; discharged 10th February 1859; L/MIL/12/282 (LDS 2029781, 1196).

Whelan, Michael. Bo Infantry and Artillery, 1840. Clive pension; gunner; entered July 1859 at 1/6 rate; 5ft 5, black hair, blue eyes, fair complexion; age 36, 19yrs service; wounded in back; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Wingle, Patrick. Be Infantry, 1822. In pre 1830 list as joining 1822 and in returned list for 1825, where he is stated to have lost his right leg above the knee. His disability must have arisen in 1824, (possibly when the regiment was serving in Burma) because he received a payment from Sept. 1824 to Xmas, L-AG-23-2-33. Received Lord Clive Pension from 1825 to 30. 15th Oct 1825 admitted to pension, L-AG-23-2-16. Makes mark for 1825 pension L-AG-23-2-62. Reported dead in 1830 by his widow L-AG-23-2-67. Last payment seems to be third quarter 1830 L-AG-23-2-35. His last payment is marked as in Ireland and several of the earlier ones are assumed to be the same; however it is not clear when he returned to Ireland.

Worrell, Edward. Be Infantry, 1839. Clive Pension; pension from Oct 1850 at 1/- rate; 5ft 5½, brown hair, hazel eyes, fresh complexion; age 28 after 10yrs service; paralysis; to reside in Limerick; L-AG-23-2-66.

Woulfe, Patrick. M Infantry, 1847. Indian Mutiny Medal, no clasp (see Hodkinson: "Limerickmen")

Wright, Michael. Be recruit. Shipwrecked on the Protector 1838 (see Hodkinson, Protector).

Extras;

John Cole, gunner in M. artillery, confectioner, born in the West Indies, retired to Limerick in 1861; in Clive pension book L-AG-23-2-66. No indication of Limerick connection but possibly son of a serving Limerick soldier?

Patrick O'Shaughnessy from Senegal is the only (listed) black man I have come across in the EIC lists; L-AG-23-2-65. No Limerick connection I know of but added out of interest.
