

N21 Newcastle West Road Scheme N21 Abbeyfeale Road Scheme

Traffic Survey 1 - 12/04/2021 to 26/04/2021

Limerick City and County Council is conducting a traffic survey to support the design of the N21 Newcastle West and N21 Abbeyfeale bypasses from 12/04/2021 to the 26/04/2021

Nationwide Data Collection Ltd. (NDC) have been engaged by the council to carry out the survey. The survey involves:

Automatic Traffic Counts at 14 locations around Newcastle West and Abbeyfeale. These surveys do not collect any personal data.

Video surveying of pedestrian and vehicle movements at one junction in Abbeyfeale for a single period of 24 hours. The video footage is captured from above and it is not generally possible to recognise individuals from the footage.

All data is used for the statistical purpose of quantifying vehicle and pedestrian movements only. Once the data has been processed to provide the required information the raw data is deleted.

Purpose of the processing:

To provide traffic data to support the design of the N21 Newcastle West and N21 Abbeyfeale bypasses.

Legal basis for the processing:

Article 6.1e of the GDPR, whereby processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller; in conjunction with the Roads Act 1993.

In accordance with the Roads Act 1993.

19.—(1) The Authority may, in relation to national roads, do all or any of the following—

(a) prepare, or arrange for the preparation of, designs for construction or improvement works.

78.—(1) In this section “authorised person” means a person authorised for the purposes of this section by the Minister, the Authority or a road authority.

(2) Any authorised person shall be entitled to enter at all reasonable times (subject to his producing, if so required, his authority in writing as such

person) and inspect any land or any thing on, in or under any land for the purposes of any enactment (including this Act) relating to the construction or maintenance of public roads or for any purpose incidental thereto.

(3) An authorised person shall be entitled in the performance of his functions under this section to take with him on to land such persons and equipment as he considers necessary to assist him and to carry out such surveys, investigations, excavations, borings or tests, to take samples or to do any other thing which he considers necessary for the purposes referred to in subsection (2).

Recipients of the personal data

Where applicable, Limerick City and County Council and its Technical Advisors with whom LCCC have a Data Processing Agreement.

All data will be processed within Ireland.**The period for which the personal data will be stored:**

All data is used for the statistical purpose of quantifying vehicle and pedestrian movements only.

Once the data has been processed to provide the required information the raw data is deleted. This will generally be within 1 to 2 months of the data being collected.

Your Rights

You have the right to request access to personal data held about you, obtain confirmation as to whether data concerning you exists, be informed of the content and source of data and check its accuracy. In addition, if the data held by us is found to be inaccurate you have the right to change, remove, block, or object to the use of, personal data held by Limerick City and County Council.
