




- Can be colour coded by Category if you wish

- Complete all parts in the "About You" section, very important so we have current contact details and can record your entry correctly
- 8 categories each should be completed with relevant projects and any associated Sustainable Development Goals should be highlighted.

  presented during the pandemic, perhaps you were involved in the Covid-19
  Community Response Forum, helping those in need in your area.







- We would encourage you to use photographs to support your entry form, before and after photographs will give your Adjudicator a better sense of the work completed.
- The use of links to YouTube or other videos your community have completed should be used to showcase your work, links to social media such as Facebook, Twitter etc., should also be used If your group use these platforms. Do you have a website?





 Photographs should be copied into a WORD document and attached to your entry form or copied into the form under the relevant category. Please reference each photograph so that the Adjudicator knows which project it refers to.








- If we copy and paste our Photo into WORD we can click on any corner of the image and reduce its size. By doing this we can fit more photos on one page or in the body of the entry form.
- Please remember to title each image and include the legend identifier.








- In a bid to become more sustainable and to align with Public Health Advice, we ask that you submit your 2021 entry form via email. This will eliminate postage costs and will allow us to forward your entry to your allocated Adjudicator whilst working remotely.
- As a result of the travel restrictions in place, Adjudication this year will be carried out remotely, you should therefore make every effort to showcase the work you have carried out in the entry form as the Adjudicator reviewing your entry may not be familiar with your town or village.
- Please note the file limit for entering via email is 20MB but this should be sufficient to submit the information required. Entries can also be submitted as a compressed zip folder which reduces its size for transmission.








In order to create a compressed zip folder, right click on the folder and select "send to" then select "Compressed Zipped Folder" as shown here.







This will then create a new folder with the same name as the original folder but it will be compressed, the icon will be a small folder with a zip type image.
