
Thank you for your recent correspondence, dated 17th May, regarding the Special Meeting of Limerick City and County Council to discuss the closure of our Limerick plant at Raheen Business Park. I note you have also written to the Chairman of the Rehab Group Board on the matter and I am responding to both letters in this communication.

As outlined in my letter of the 16th April (enclosed) Rehab have made considerable effort in recent years to identify alternative business opportunities and to adapt our business models in Raheen. Unfortunately, this was not successful, and the business is now closed, with employees made redundant. .

We made a joint submission with SIPTU, to the Labour Court, to work collaboratively for a viable outcome for our employees concerned. On recommendation from the Labour Court last month, Rehab Enterprises is currently working with a SIPTU appointed expert.

A dedicated team at Rehab Group is meanwhile continuing to work with each affected person, to support them on an individual basis to access social welfare supports and alternative work or training opportunities. To date, four individuals have found alternative employment opportunities and Rehab Enterprises has committed to seeking a transitional training programme to support more people into new pathways of employment or training.

Once again, Rehab Enterprises deeply appreciates the positive working relationship that we have had with many valued partners over the years in the Limerick area who have worked with us to provide meaningful employment opportunities for people with disabilities in the community.



I trust this clarifies the issue for your members.

Thank you for your recent correspondence regarding an upcoming motion on our Limerick plant at Raheen Business Park.

Rehab Enterprises Ltd, a division of the Rehab Group, which provides full and part-time employment to people with disabilities, has now closed its Rehab Logistics facility in Raheen Business Park, Co Limerick.

The facility at Raheen had been providing its customers with bespoke electrical assembly items and a small fulfilment service since the 1990's. The business, which has been significantly loss-making for a number of years, suffered a further deterioration in its finances arising from the Covid-19 pandemic. This led to the facility being closed for a number of months in 2020, and thereafter to operate at a significantly reduced capacity which further impacted margins.

We have made every effort in recent years to identify alternative business opportunities and to adapt our business model in Raheen. Unfortunately, this was not successful. The company entered into a process of consultation with 37 of its employees in mid-February, which has now been concluded; with the individuals affected offered a redundancy package. Rehab Enterprises has demonstrated a commitment to work with its employees in respect of the redundancy and the terms offered. We have also continued to work with SIPTU (the recognised Trade Union) in respect of their members. We have attended the WRC on two occasions in recent weeks and have made a joint submission to the Labour Court which will be heard later in the month.

Rehab is meanwhile working with each staff member to support them on an individual basis in a bid to find an alternative work or training opportunity

At the Adjourned Ordinary Meeting of Sligo County Council held on 24th May 2021, the following resolution was agreed:

"That this Council call on the Minister for Justice to reconsider her department's decision not to have a specific offence of stalking introduced on to the statute books, and to not only introduce an offence of stalking but to also introduce longer sentences for the crime than that currently available to prosecutors."

At present in Ireland, there is no law that defines stalking as a crime. This Council calls on the government to urgently enact clear and concise stalking legislation in Ireland.

On the rare occasion that stalking is prosecuted in Ireland, it is prosecuted under harassment laws. The terms 'stalking' and 'harassment' are sometimes used interchangeably, but they can be significantly different.

Harassment is unwanted behaviour from someone else that makes you feel distressed, humiliated or threatened. Stalking, however, is more intense, sinister and distressing. Stalking is a pattern of fixated, obsessive behaviour which is repeated, persistent and intrusive. It causes fear of violence or engenders alarm and distress in the victim. Victims of stalking are often at risk of violence from their stalker.

Although stalking has recently been associated with crimes against women it can also be a crime against a man. It can be used against celebrities, politicians and civic leaders and needs to be clearly defined as a crime.

The Law Reform Commission has recommended that stalking be defined as a separate crime to harassment. In the UK, when stalking was made a crime there was an increase in prosecutions - meaning it was necessary and overdue. This Council calls on the Minister for Justice to act urgently and legislate to make stalking a crime in Ireland.

I also ask for this motion to be shared with all other local authorities".

I wish to refer to your correspondence in relation to Rural Housing, which was forwarded to Mr. Peter Burke TD, Minister for Planning and Local Government, by Minister Darragh O'Brien.

The Department acknowledges your letter, and the views of Limerick City and County Council are noted.

Work is currently underway on an update of the 2005 Sustainable Rural Housing Guidelines for planning authorities, (which were issued under Section 28 of the Planning and Development Act 2000) and in doing so will have regard to the principles of the outcome of the 'Flemish decree' case, where relevant.

It is expected that an initial draft guidelines document will be completed in the coming weeks, given the complexity of the issues involved, the need for environmental assessment and both internal and external consultation, updated guidelines will be finalised later in 2021.



Re: Motion - Implementation of our BDS support in relation to PSNI/An Garda Síochána partnerships with Israeli security forces and companies with involvement in illegal Israeli settlements

At the Council meeting held on 2 June 2021, the Council approved the following Motion: -

The Israeli Human Rights Organisation, B'Tselem, and the UN Human Rights Watch have both recently reported that Israel is guilty of crimes of apartheid and persecution, and the 'Ministry for Public Security' was strongly criticised for their treatment of Palestinians in the HRW As a Council who has adopted and is supportive of the Palestinian call for Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions, Fermanagh and Omagh District Council hereby call on the Chief Constable of the PSNI and the Garda Commissioner, as well as the Department of Justice & Policing Board in the North and Minister for Justice & Policing Authority in the South, to immediately withdraw their respective forces from any and all partnerships with the Israeli ministry responsible for police and prisons (Ministry of Public Security) and from companies which are involved in surveillance in illegal Israeli settlements report.

Patrick Corrigan from Amnesty International noted that "as a matter of urgency, the PSNI should suspend all programmes with the Israeli police and security services where there's a clear risk of involvement in human rights violations...[the] police service must ensure it is not implicated in Israel's human rights violations. The distressing scenes from East Jerusalem and Gaza should now be a wake-up call."

As such, and mindful of our BDS commitments, we call on the PSNI Chief Constable and Garda Commissioner to immediately cease all partnership and involvement with the security forces of apartheid Israeli. In support of this we call on all Councils on this island to back this motion and lend their voices in support of the Palestinian call for international solidarity and BDS action".

Furthermore, this Council calls on An Taoiseach, Micheál Martin, to expel the Israeli Ambassador to Ireland due to the ongoing de facto annexation of Palestine and further requests that Minister for Foreign Affairs, Simon Coveney TD, use his position as representative for Ireland on the UN Security Council to seek full enforcement of the UN resolutions on Occupied Palestine and East Jerusalem and that the Dublin government also calls on the EU to place sanctions on Israel. We also call on the Dublin government to

recognise the State of Palestine. Furthermore, that this Council invites the Palestinian Ambassador to Ireland, Dr Jilan Wahba Abdalmajid, to meet with the Council so that we may convey our solidarity and support, through her, to the Palestinian people.

Representations have been made to each of the bodies included in the above Motion calling them to take the actions requested within.

The Council requests that you take the action requested of your Department as outlined in the Motion above, and it looks forward to receiving your response in due course.


A Chairde,
