Habitats Directive 92/43/EEC



Requires designation of Special Areas of Conservation (SACs) for the protection of:

Annex I habitats (59 habitats)

Annex II species (25 species)

Required to maintain or restore at favourable conservation status (Annex I habitats & Annex II species)

Undertake surveillance of conservation status









Birds Directive 79/409/EEC



Conserve all European wild birds


Protection, management & control Birds, their eggs, nests & habitats

Requires designation of SPAs that contain

- strictly protected species (on Annex I eg Peregrine Falcon)
- internationally important assemblages of birds (eg breeding seabirds, wintering waterbirds)



Natura 2000 network in Ireland





- 439 SACs
- 154 SPAs
- 906,000 ha terrestrial area (including lakes and rivers) (13%)
- 1,042,000 ha marine area
- 1,839 individual qualifying interests for SACs
- 90% of terrestrial area is privately owned
- 59% of terrestrial area is farmed
- Circa 35,000 farmers (26% of all farmers)












Site-specific conservation objective setting process



Local Biodiversity Action Fund

- Recognition of role LAs have in NBAP delivery
- Helps Heritage and Biodiversity Officers implement actions in the NBAP
- Fund has grown each year 128 projects financed in 2022 across all 31 LAs
- Projects financed include:
 - Biodiversity Awareness
 - Pollinator projects
 - Surveys habitats and species
 - Conservation Management Plans
 - IAS control
 - Wetland restoration




