Proposed Disposal of Derelict Property - 34 Creagh Avenue, Kileely, Limerick



1. Introduction

It is intended that the following proposed disposal of property (see site map in Appendix) will be included on the Agenda for the November Full Council Meeting:

Disposal of derelict property at 34 Creagh Avenue, Kileely, Limerick to Nikolay Raevski and Stanislava Raevska in the sum of €79,000.

2. Description and Location of Property

The subject property is derelict and in need of complete refurbishment works. The site comprises a mid-terrace, residential property and surrounding land with a total area of approximately 0.014 hectares.

It is located in the Limerick City North electoral area in Kileely. The site is surrounded by residential properties and is close to St. Munchin's Community Centre and Thomond Park.

3. History of Property

The property and surrounding land have been vacant and in a derelict condition for a number of years. Statutory notices were served in accordance with the Derelict Sites Act 1990. The property was entered on the Derelict Sites Register in October 2021. Limerick City & County Council subsequently acquired the property compulsorily.

4. Marketing of Property

The property was brought to the market and advertised for Sale by Private Treaty on 16th June, 2022. The property was fully exposed to the market including the use of internet advertising and an on-site For Sale signboard.

There were a large number of enquiries on the property and several open viewings took place. The open viewings were facilitated by appointment to all interested parties and a competitive bidding scenario commenced following the viewings. Over the course of the marketing campaign 14 parties submitted bids on the subject property.


5. Key Elements of Proposal

The offer is subject to contract, survey and satisfactory title. The highest bidders are cash buyers and they have provided proof of these funds. It is intended that the house will be occupied by someone from within their extended family.

As the property is derelict, the proposed purchaser is furnished with copies of the derelict site notices affecting the property. The purchaser is acquiring the property with full knowledge of the derelict site notices and covenants to complete the appropriate works so that the property is delisted from the Derelict Sites Register. This covenant shall survive the closing of the sale herein and shall be incorporated in the Deed of Transfer from the vendor to the purchaser.

6. Executive Recommendation to Council.

The proposal before the Members is to note the proposed disposal of the property to Nikolay Raevski and Stanislava Raevska in the sum of €79,000.
