






Figure 4 Distribution map and graphed population 18-year trend for Sparrowhawk. The breeding distribution map is based on the Bird Atlas (2007-2011) (Balmer et al., 2013). The population trend uses data from CBS 1998-2016 (Photo: Brian Burke).


Rodenticide exposure in Irish Barn Owls

- PM's & toxicology analysis of 69 Barn Owl carcasses collected between 2006 2011
- 88.4% of Barn Owls (n = 69) had detectable levels of SGARs (Second-Generation Anticoagulant Rodenticides)
- Multiple compounds were detected in 71% of birds
- Two most prevalent compounds were Brodifacoum 74% of birds & Floucoumafen 58% of birds
- > 3 times greater concentration levels than Barn Owls in UK









Studies show a -10.2 % population decline over 10 years (IWeBs)




Figure 13 Distribution map and graphed population trend for Light-bellied Brent G distribution map illustrates sites supporting numbers of international importancircles), national (all-Ireland) importance (blue circles), and all other sites where during the period between 2011/12 and 2015/16 (red circles). The population treillustrates the population size obtained from census data 1985-2017 (Photo: Brian E)








Figure 21 Distribution map and graphed population 18-year trend for Sand Martin. The breeding distribution map is based on the Bird Atlas (2007-2011) (Balmer et al., 2013). The population trend uses data from CBS 1998-2016 (Photo: Dick Coombes).





Figure 10 Distribution map and graphed population 18-year trend for Swift. The breeding distribution map is based on the Bird Atlas (2007-2011) (Balmer et al., 2013). The population trend uses data from CBS 1998-2016 (Photo: Dick Coombes).






