Functions of An Garda Siochana

- Preserve peace and public order
- Protect life and property
- Human rights
- Protect the security of the state
- Prevent crime
- Bringing criminals to justice, investigate and detect crime
- Regulate and control traffic and improve road safety (interagency cooperation)





CCTV Schemes

- Must apply through An Garda Siochana (Section 38 of the Garda Siochana Act 2005)
- The Garda Commissioner may authorise the installation and operation of CCTV for the sole or primary purpose of securing public order and safety in public places by facilitating the deterrence, prevention, detection and prosecution of offences.
- Various conditions, requirements and scrutiny
- Work together /Joint controllers / interagency cooperation .





History

Investigations

- Every investigation requires the gathering of all available evidence (DPP vs Braddish)
- Public and private schemes
- Vital role in prosecutions
- Prevention and deterrence.
- Identification of suspects
- Independent witness
- Confirm or disprove.

- Assisted in the solving of many crimes
- CCTV footage 2020 3672 hours / 2021- 15969
- 2017 Murder 70,000 hours all areas in the city

 Northside, Southside, Canal & River Bank, Hinterland
- Ensure all cameras are necessary, justified and proportionate
- Conduct a Data Protection Impact Assessment
- Public Consultation for each grouping
- Garda Commissioner application & Joint Policing Committee consultation





Garda Commissioner Process

Must include

- Completed application form
- A letter of approval for the proposed CCTV system signed by local Garda Divisional Officer
- Signed Joint Data Controller Agreement (LCCC & An Garda Siochana)
- Documentary Evidence that CCTV has been approved by LCCC following consultation with the JPC





Garda Commissioner Process

- Technical Specifications
- Scaled Maps for all locations
- Details of all persons with access to CCTV
- Completed vetting forms

 O'Malley Park, Rathbane, Keyes Park, Galvone, Ballinacurra
 Weston, Sarsfield Park 127 cameras

- Hinterland covering the towns of Abbeyfeale, Adare, Askeaton, Caherconlish, Cappamore, Castleconnell, Croom, Foynes, Kilmallock, Murroe, Newcastle West, Pallasgreen, Patrickswell, Rathkeale - 88 cameras
