### **Purpose of the Strategic Fund for Arts and Culture Award**

The Strategic fund for Arts and Culture was developed by Limerick City and County Council to allow culture and arts organisations and practitioners to bid for funding, with an aim to leverage funding from other national and international sources.

The percentage available from the Limerick City and County Council Strategic Fund for Arts and Culture is 10% of the successful national or international amount awarded, to a maximum of €5,000 in 2023.



## PROJECT DETAILS:

### **Late Night Museum Art Fund – Arts Council**

*Ormston House*

The funding is for a series of late-night events that will all take place in Ormston House in Limerick City Centre and feature local artists. The events will take place between 2<sup>nd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

### **Opera Commission Award – Arts Council**

*Opera Workshop*

Commission composer, Luke Byrne, as part of composition of two new chamber operas. The new Ballybruff Trilogy.

### **Opera Projects and Productions Award Strand 3 – Arts council**

*Opera Workshop*

This funding will support the Set Design, Costume Design and Artist fees for The Ballybruff Trilogy. Production work will begin in the Autumn 2023 on a part-time basis, going into Pre-production in February 2024 with rehearsals running from April and performances at the Belltable Theatre at the end of May 2024.

### **Opera Projects and Production Award, Strand 1 – Arts Council**

*Opera Workshop*

This funding will support the Librettist and Director fees for the initial development work of a proposed new opera inspired by Limerick author, Kate O' Brien. We believe this is a timely project considering 2024 is the 50th anniversary of the acclaimed Limerick author's death.

### **Young Ensembles Scheme – Arts Council**

*LYT (Limerick Youth Theatre)*

Junior and senior members of Limerick Youth Theatre (LYT) plan to join forces with County Limerick Youth Theatre (CoLYT) to develop and present a new multidisciplinary artistic project in collaboration with The Hunt Museum and the Irish Youth Chamber Orchestra. They will stage a number of promenade performances in August 2023 in the gardens of The Hunt Museum involving a large number of young artists.

### **Capacity Building Support Scheme Arts Council**

*EVA International*

The funds will support EVA to conduct a strategic development process with the EVA Board and Team, and prepare EVA's existing strategic plan for the period of 2024 - 2029, to reflect internal and external changes to the organisation and broader social context.

### **Creative Youth Nurture Fund - Creative Ireland**

#### *Ballyhoura Development*

The project, Building Bridges, will work directly with 10-15 Traveller Young People from East Limerick over a period of 18-24 months. Needs in the community were identified through ongoing work through East Limerick Traveller Project and research /focus groups with the community. Through the means of drama the project will build the capacity of participants and provide a safe space for them to explore their vision for their future and how they can get involved in decision making that affects them.

### **Capacity Building Support Scheme – Arts Council**

#### *Opera Workshop*

Opera Workshop, with support from the Lime Tree | Belltable, will recruit a freelance, part-time Administrative officer. The overall aim is to create a more permanent development role as we seek to diversify the company's funding strategy. We aim also to build on the company's current excellent reputation as a creative opera making force in Limerick.

### **Creative Youth Nurture Fund - Creative Ireland**

#### *Limerick Learning Hub*

This project will engage with young people transitioning from care and in Aftercare. Aftercare planning begins while young people are still in care at 17 years of age. It will work with young people in the 17-23 year age cohort in care/aftercare living in Limerick. The project will put particular focus on including young people who do not receive an aftercare allowance from Tusla. An aftercare allowance is made in respect of the young adult and the purpose of the allowance is to cover the day to day costs associated in supporting the young adult as they progress in education or accredited training. Young people who are in receipt of an Aftercare Allowance will not be excluded from participating.
