I will move at the next Meeting of the Metropolitan District of Limerick that the Council seeks funding for the provision of a comprehensive CCTV system for Garryowen given the fact that Garryowen now meets the criteria for CCTV cameras.

REPLY:

Limerick City and County Council has started work on assessing the potential of a CCTV scheme, before seeking authorisation under the Garda Síochána (Recording Devices) Act 2023, with members of An Garda Síochána in the Limerick Division. Initial discussions have triggered the next step of identifying potential CCTV locations. Once potential locations have been identified, a detailed discussion will take place between Limerick City & County Council and An Garda Síochána members with knowledge of the area and its associated issues, to assess the necessity, proportionality and justification of each potential location. If agreement is reached on locations, Limerick City & County Council will undertake an assessment of funding needs with regard to installation and operational costs, taking in to account grant funding that may be available from The Department of Justice. Every effort will be made to source the necessary funding for a CCTV scheme in Garryowen.

It is important to understand that securing funding is only the first step of a long and detailed data protection and governance process where the tests of necessity, proportionality and justification may fail at any stage.

Limerick City & County Council will endeavour to carefully and meticulously support the process, engaging with An Garda Síochána, Elected Members and the Public.
