The Chief Executive's Reports were noted by the Council.

#### **(b) Raising of Loan to fund the Issuing of Local Authority Home Loans (LAHL) by Limerick City and County Council to Borrowers**

Circulated, report of the A/Director, Support Services, dated 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2024, seeking the Council's approval to application for sanction from the Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage for a loan in the amount of €5,590,000 to fund the drawdown of Local Authority Home Loans.

“That, the approval of the Council be and is hereby given to application for sanction from the Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage, in accordance with Section 106 of the Local Government Act, 2001, as amended, for a loan in the amount of €5,590,000 to fund the drawdown of Local Authority Home Loans, the loan to be drawn from the Housing Finance Agency.”

**9. Presentation from IFA**

With the permission of the Mayor, Item No. 9 – Presentation from the IFA – was taken at this time. The Mayor welcomed Limerick County Chairman, Mr. Sean Lavery, to the Meeting.

Mr. Lavery, with the aid of a PowerPoint presentation, addressed the Council and gave an overview to the Members in relation to the issues involved in the Limerick IFA “Enough is Enough” Campaign which included:

- Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) Transformation of CAP away from supporting food production;
- Proposed Mercusor Trade Deal;
- Overly Complicated Schemes;
- Nitrates Derogation Reduction;
- Ash Dieback;
- Measurement of Agricultural Emission;
- Zoned Residential Land Tax.

The Presentation also outlined the importance of beef and dairy farming to Limerick and statistics on how many were involved in the industry, the production capacity, the contribution to the local economy.

The Members thanked the IFA group for their presentation and noted the challenges facing the farming sector, and the contribution of farming to Ireland and the local economy in Limerick. They noted the increased fuel and costs for farmers in recent years.

They agreed that the challenges of climate change needed to be addressed by all sectors in partnership, and the importance of supporting the farming sector in dealing with all the challenges and issues that are there, so as to ensure the farming sector continues to operate in a sustainable manner.

1. “That this Council recognises the significant contribution that farming, and the Agri-sector makes to the Irish and local economy. The Council acknowledges the income challenge on Irish farmers arising from the significant increases in the cost of doing business, regulatory costs and cuts in Basic Income Support for farmers”
2. “The Council calls on the Government to introduce no further regulations on farmers or any measures that may increase costs on farms without full negotiation and agreement with the Irish Farmers Association (IFA) and other farming organisations. The Council calls on the European Union and the Irish Government to provide additional stand-alone funding, separate to the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP), to support farmers to undertake climate and biodiversity measures”

With the permission of the Mayor and the agreement of the Meeting, the following Notices of Motion were taken at this time:

**14. Notice of Motion submitted by Councillor S. Keary**

**I will move at the next Meeting that Limerick City and County Council request a full and up-to-date report from the Minister for Health regarding wind turbines on the following issues: (a) likely health effects on adjacent residents; (b) noise levels; (c) shadow flicker; (d) damage to residential amenity.**

The Motion was proposed by Councillor Keary, seconded by Councillor Teskey and adopted.

In proposing the Motion, the Members referred to the issues faced by communities living near to wind turbines including noise and shadow flicker and noted that the current regulations, drafted in 2006, needed to be updated urgently. The Director, Planning, Environment and Place-Making confirmed that new guidelines had been drafted in 2019 and had gone to public consultation, but confirmed that they had not been adopted yet by the Department.

**13. Notice of Motion submitted by Councillor J. Sheahan**

**I will move at the next Meeting that Limerick City and County Council, in conjunction with both the Clare and Kerry County Councils, have a joint approach to apply pressure on the Government to ensure the Shannon Estuary is prioritised and that the findings of the Shannon Estuary Economic Task Force Report be implemented forthwith.**

The Motion was proposed by Councillor Sheahan (J), seconded by Councillor Teskey and adopted.

In proposing the Motion, the Members referred to the fact that Maritime Area Plans had not been agreed by Government and that these were needed so as to develop Foynes Port and the Shannon Estuary programme. Members agreed the importance of engagement also with Clare County Council and Kerry County Council on this, and the Chief Executive agreed to discuss this with his counterparts in those local authorities so as to ensure a joint approach.

**(c) Standing Orders**

Circulated, report of the Head of Corporate Services, Governance and Customer Services dated 20<sup>th</sup> March, 2024, in relation to Executive Review of Standing Orders for Plenary Meetings of the Council.

The Head of Corporate Services, Governance and Customer Services outlined the details of her report which recommended that a review of Standing Orders takes place after the Local Elections scheduled for June 2024.

She explained that where the Elected Members wish to resolve to remove part of Standing Order 53, that it would appear to achieve the purpose of allowing a Member to submit a Notice of Motion in the District without affecting the submission of Notices of Motion in Plenary Council Meetings.

The report stated that Martina Brennan, Limerick Cycling Campaign, was being nominated to fill the vacancy, replacing Tracy McElligott, Moyross Residents’ Forum, and representing the Community/Voluntary Sector.

**Recommendation No. 1**

***“That, the Draft Traffic Calming Policy 2024 be presented to the Full Council Meeting on 25th March, 2024, for adoption.”***

Following discussion, it was agreed that a Workshop would be held with the Members on the proposals contained within the new policy.

**Suspension of Standing Order No. 4:** At this point in the Meeting, the Mayor drew attention to the time which was approaching 5.30 p.m., and on the proposal of Councillor Sheehan (C), seconded by Councillor O'Donovan, Standing Order No. 4 was suspended in order to complete the agenda.

**Recommendation No. 2**

***"To introduce a multi-location Parking Permit for certain approved organisations operating within the City Centre area, so as to enable them to park their vehicle at various locations throughout the city in order to deliver essential and important services to people in the City Centre area."***

Councillor Hartigan proposed the following amendment. This was seconded by Councillor Collins (B) and agreed by the Meeting:

***"To consider the introduction of parking permits for voluntary organisations that are based within the paid parking areas of the city centre, and in County areas where current parking bye-laws are in place. The permits should be considered for charitable / voluntary organisations that are involved in the provision of health or critical welfare services on a volunteer-led, free-of-charge basis to the public, and where parking in the city is an essential response requirement in the delivery of the service for unpaid volunteer staff."***

- (iii) Circulated, report of the Chairperson of the Economic Development, Enterprise and Planning Strategic Policy Committee in relation to meeting of the Committee held on 19<sup>th</sup> February, 2024.

**Recommendation**

***"That, Limerick City and County Council write to the Minister of Housing, Local Government and Heritage seeking an update on the onshore wind farm regulations and a date for the publication of same."***

On the proposal of Councillor Collins (B), seconded by Councillor O'Donoghue, this Recommendation was agreed.

**5. Planning, Environment and Place-Making**

**(a) Limerick City and County Council Local Authority Climate Action Plan 2024-2029**

Circulated, report of the Director, Planning, Environment and Place-Making dated 8<sup>th</sup> March, 2024, enclosing Local Authority Climate Action Plan 2024-2029, together with Chief Executive's Report of Submissions to the Draft Plan.

A PowerPoint presentation was given at the Meeting in relation to the Plan. The Climate Action Co-ordinator explained that each local authority is required to prepare a 5 year plan which will specify the mitigation measures and the adaptation measures to be adopted by the local authority. He confirmed that it was proposed to deliver a 51% reduction in Council Carbon emissions by 2030 and carbon neutrality by 2050. The main themes involved in the Climate Action Plan included Travel & Mobility; Built Environment & Energy; Governance and Leadership; Community & Partnership; Natural Environment and Environment & Circular Economy.

The Members welcomed the proposed Climate Action Plan and there was a discussion in relation to the targeted timelines and the additional resources required to implement and deliver on same. The Members also agreed the importance of tackling issues at a local authority level so as to demonstrate a commitment to addressing the reality of climate change.

And Resolved:

“That, the Limerick City and County Council Draft Local Authority Climate Action Plan 2024-2029 be adopted by the Members in accordance with Section 16 of the Climate Action and Low Carbon Development (Amendment) Act, 2021, subject to the following amendments:

- That Limerick City & County Council include a target measure to carry out energy upgrades to its housing stock to an “A” Building Energy Rating by 2030;
- That Limerick City & County Council include a target measure to aim to achieve a reduction in cars on Limerick streets by 2030;
- That Limerick City & County Council include a target measure to report on progress on its Local Authority Climate Action Plan 2024-2029 on a monthly basis in the Councils Chief Executive Report.”

**(b) Litter Management Plan 2023-2026**

Circulated, Chief Executive's Report on Public Consultation to Elected Members on the Litter Management Plan 2023-2026, together with copy of Litter Management Plan 2023-2026.

A PowerPoint presentation on the Plan was given at the Meeting. The Members noted the contents of the proposed Litter Management Plan 2023-2026. They agreed that improved enforcement was key to ensuring greater compliance by the public, and also agreed that CCTV should be used where possible in tackling dumping at litter blackspots and Bring Bank areas. They also agreed that resources were key to delivering on the objectives of the Litter Management Plan.

I will ask at the next Meeting (a) what funding was advanced to the Dublin Bike Hire business and its associated companies on foot of this Authority's Loan Agreement of 2022; (b) for a listing of those companies and their addresses; (c) how many bicycles were purchased; (d) where and when were they provided; (e) how many remain in service on the Greenway; (f) what interest did this Authority receive on the monies advanced; (g) what, if any, funds remain due to the Council; and (h) the anticipated date of full repayment should monies remain due to the Council.

**REPLY:**

**11. Question submitted by Councillor J. Scanlan**

**I will ask at the next Meeting (a) how many septic tank inspections were carried out by this Authority in 2023; (b) the number of those deemed inadequate and requiring remedial works; (c) the amount of grant-aid called for; and (d) how much was paid out.**

**REPLY:** In 2023, Limerick conducted inspections on 24 No. Domestic Wastewater Treatment Systems (DWWTS), comprising of 18 initial assessments and 6 follow-up inspections for verification purposes. This fell short of the targeted level for 2023 due to loss of trained personnel. However, we anticipate a significant increase in inspections for 2024;

Out of the 18 new inspections, 10 (55.55%) led to the issuance of an advisory notice mandating remedial actions. The identified non-compliances encompassed a spectrum of issues including failed DWWTS, desludging, network repairs, and improper disposal of grey water;

In 2023, Limerick City and County received a total of 8 grant applications, each with a maximum cap of €5,000 per application;

A total of €40,000 was paid out by Limerick City and County Council under the Housing (Domestic Waste Water Treatment Systems Grant under the National Inspection Plan) Regulations, 2012 (S.I. 223 of 2012) in 2023.

**12. Question submitted by Councillor E. O'Donovan**

**I will ask at the next Meeting for details on all ecological/environmental assessments that have been carried out on Limerick Greenway.**
