Limerick Metropolitan (North, West, East)

€4000

The artist aims to continue to deepen her understanding of filmmaking, screendance, music and digital art, its creation process and presentation possibilities. She will delve into the creative process of a multidisciplinary performing artist and experiment with developing "performed persona" in existing outdoor spaces with historic significance.

The bursary will enable the artist to develop a sequence of performance poems titled How complete + final the feeling, as I lift its curve in the net, inspired by Ted Hughes' pike-fishing visits with his son Nicholas to Lough Gur in the late 70s and 80s. This will include a site-specific performance of the sequence at Lough Gur.

Kerry Guinan wants to develop a new edition of their performative installation 'Portraits' (2019) to a professional exhibition standard. They will do this by creating a new tech spec for the installation, redesigning the selection criteria for performers, re-evaluating its social, logistical, and contextual elements.

Pamela Dunne would like to buy studio time and materials to explore the new areas of her art practice for a new body of work. She would like to upgrade her current out-of-date laptop. She would like to participate in an online masterclass on Adobe Premier pro Video editing.

Salma Ataya

Limerick Metropolitan (North, West, East)

Salma Ataya will develop on a previous project to research and create a dance video influenced by Limerick City's streets and sounds. Working towards creating and working more in Limerick City, where they have been based for over 7 years. The artist will use the outside spaces for creating movements, inspired by the normal life sounds and movements.

This application supports production, publication print and launch event costs for a presentation of new work, recently created on the DOMUS eco-feminist residency programme (Galatina). A publication launch and curators talk event is proposed to take place at Belfast Exposed and Limerick City Gallery of Art, this coming October.

Scott Robinson

Scott Robinson will use the bursary to develop an anthology series of digital artworks across five locations in Limerick City, blending local stories and memories with ethereal vignettes to evoke emotional response. This will utilise new media, digital technology to blend the boundaries between physical and virtual landscapes, enhancing viewer immersion and connection to the specific location.

The artist will record an EP in Launchpad Studios, Limerick. Recorded and mixed by Shane Wixted of the studio. He will shoot a music video for one of the tracks produced, directed by Ellie Marron, collaborating with Animator Alan Tuffy who got his degree from Tús, Limerick. He will shoot photography material with frequent collaborator Jake Casey
