I will move at the next Meeting of the Metropolitan District of Limerick that we clarify the situation regarding bring banks and that Limerick City and County Council put in place a plan for maintaining the bring banks and that the Council considers installing CCTV at these locations.

Limerick City and County Council is currently in the process of preparing a tender for the operation and management of the 65 Bring Bank sites within its jurisdiction. Many of these sites have experienced recurring incidents of illegal dumping so as part of the tender process, we will be including a response service in this contract for the clean up of waste materials at these locations.

The recent implementation of the Codes of Practices regarding the Prevention, Detection, and Prosecution of Waste and Litter Offences utilizing CCTV and Mobile Recording Devices (MRDs) is regarded as a valuable tool in addressing the issue of illegal dumping at Bring Bank sites. In order to warrant the installation of CCTV at these sites, it is required to conduct a Data Protection Impact Assessment that is backed up by substantial justification. This justification will take into account various factors, including the frequency of reported incidents at these locations. If deemed necessary and supported by evidence, the installation of CCTV will be considered for all Bring Bank sites across the county.

I will move at the next Meeting of the Metropolitan District of Limerick, that Limerick City and County Council outline its proposals to address the issues relating to the proper upkeep and maintenance of cemeteries, located within the Metropolitan District of Limerick.

There are forty one cemeteries within the Metropolitan District, the four main cemeteries are managed by the Council, nine cemeteries with the assistance of Limerick Civic Trust and twenty two by local cemetery community groups with the remaining six having minimal upkeep. The Council provides an annual maintenance grant to community groups along with them being able to apply for annual community enhancement programme grants towards the purchase of equipment.

The Council also provides an annual maintenance programme of works in relation to repair of walls, footpaths, drainage and tree surgery works and works prioritised in accordance with the available budget for these works. The Council are currently reviewing grass cutting arrangements in the main city cemeteries and general maintenance in those cemeteries to address the issues that have been reported. In addition, the Council are putting in place a Service Level Agreement with Limerick Civic Trust which will outline the level of service that is required to ensure an appropriate standard of maintenance.

I will move at the next Meeting of the Metropolitan District of Limerick that the restrictions on capacity at Mungret Recycling Centre for green waste from small businesses be lifted by Limerick City and County Council and a solution is examined as soon as possible.

The Council had to restrict green waste coming in to the recycling centre in Mungret as there was insufficient capacity to manage the amount of green waste in the yard. The Council are currently looking at options to reduce the stockpile in the yard, the public can avail of the composted material free of charge but the stockpile is not being reduced as much as the Council would like. The Council are looking at the possibility of moving some of the material to Newcastle West and Kilmallock Civic Amenity Sites but advance works are required to facilitate this.

The Council will review the situation in a number of weeks to determine when commercial green waste can be received. It is important to point out that only green waste will be accepted, rubble and other construction materials mixed with green waste will not be accepted and will be turned away. The green waste material being received in the last number of months has been of good quality, allowing the Council to process and shred the material resulting in a composted material that was used for planters in the city centre. It is the Council's objective to further improve the quality of the composted material in the Mungret Horticulture yard and continue recycling the green waste and consider for further use, in particular for the flower baskets and flower tiers in the city.
