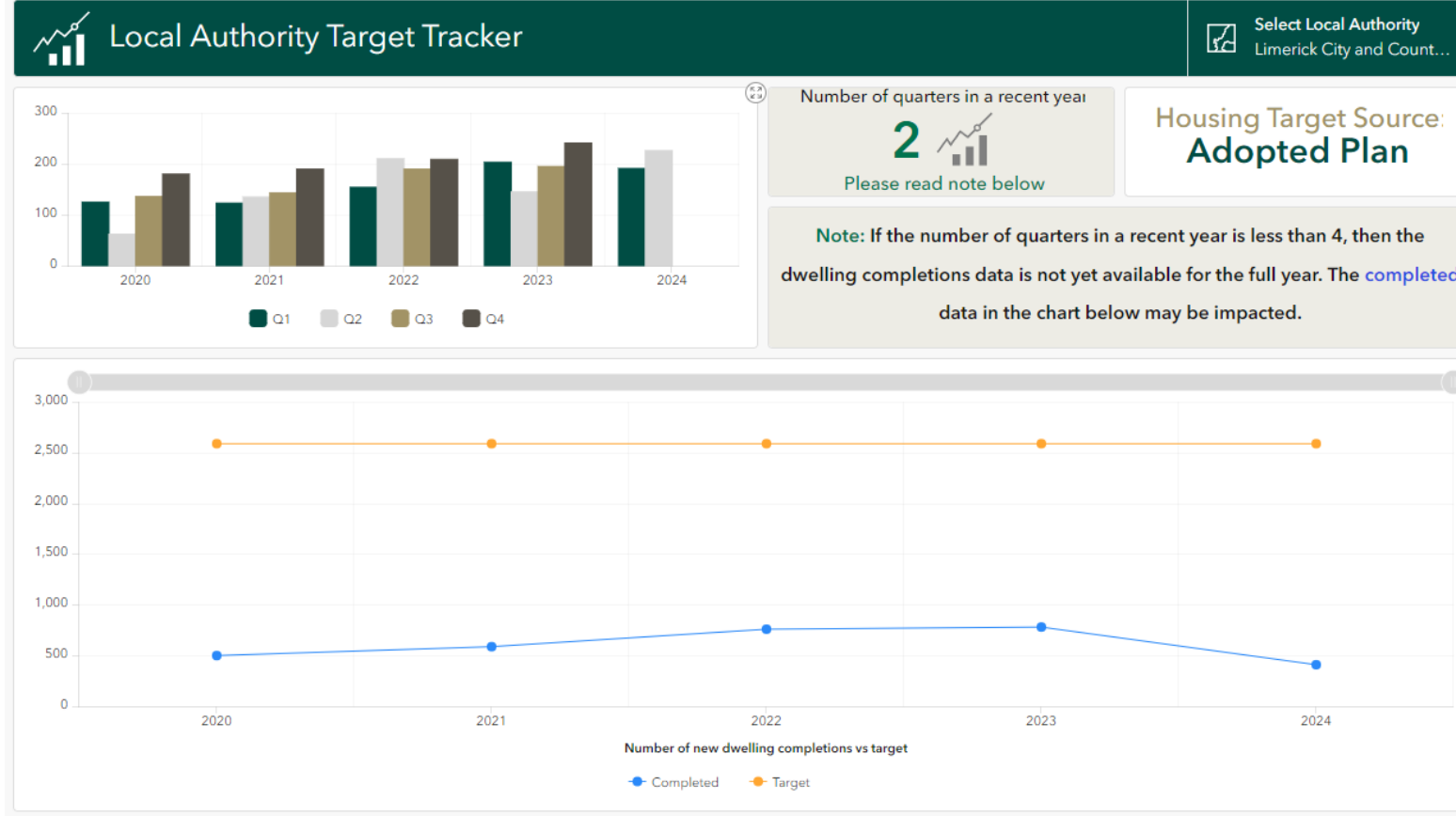

- Overall significant progress has been made in the implementation of the Development Plan

Key Recommendations

- Monitor planning applications and prepare annual Core Strategy Monitoring Report
- Invest in revitalisation, infrastructure, community facilities and the environment
- Seek funding for and activate projects for Local Authority provided dwelling units
- Work with all stakeholders to promote Limerick as a key choice for economic investment, support enterprise, job creation and ensure sufficient lands are zoned and serviced
- Protect and enhance Limerick's environmental and heritage assets, while managing appropriate change
- Work with transport providers to ensure delivery of LSMATS, public transport, active travel and roads projects
- Work with all infrastructure providers to seek the timely delivery of all forms of necessary infrastructure
- Progress actions to reduce carbon emissions, encourage renewable energy use and facilitate flood relief schemes
- Work with the Department of Education and Skills and third level education providers to ensure educational facilities meet the requirements of population growth
- Invest in community infrastructure and progress the actions contained in the Local Economic and Community Plan
