Attendance at a 'Planning and Promotion of Cycling in Denmark Study Trip' November 4th-7th

A Chomhairleoir, a Chara,

The Active Travel Unit are organising a cycling study trip to Denmark to review cycling networks within Copenhagen and surrounding areas from November 4th-7th inclusive.

The purpose of this trip is to get an insight into how the cycle network has developed in Denmark and for the delegation to physically see various types of infrastructure and how it works with pedestrians, buses and cars.

Denmark considers cycling and walking as the most important modes of transport in the city and are building a network of major bicycle routes, connecting the city to the region. One of the main themes in the Traffic and Mobility Plan for the capital region of Denmark is to progress developments in the fields of traffic and mobility, which is what Active Travel aim to mirror in Limerick.

This visit will:-

- Highlight the cycle/walking network
- Deepen the depth of knowledge in relation to cycling/walking amenities.
- Allow for exploration of future project collaboration opportunities.
- Share best practices

This trip is an excellent opportunity to build relationships and tap into the excellent manner in which pedestrians, cyclists and public transport is prioritised.

The cost of the trip will be approximately €1500 per person. The price includes flights, accommodation, transfers, meals, bicycle rental and public transport during the study trip.

This will be fully funded by NTA and paid for from within the Active Travel budget.

11:13 -12:00 **Bicycle trip 2** (3 km) visiting a bicycle street, passing a crossing with a diagonal cycle lane, passing the iconic Cykelslangen (The Bicycle Snake) and Bryggebroen.
