


Executive Report

Economic Development, Enterprise and Tourism

1. Trade and Investment

- **ELI Lilly** announced a \$1bn expansion of Limerick facility, doubling the firm's investment in Raheen and creating 150 new jobs. The announcement brings Lilly's total Limerick investment to \$2bn. As a part of this expansion, Lilly will create another 150 jobs for highly skilled workers in Limerick such as engineers, scientists, quality assurance professionals and operations personnel, for a total of 450 employees.
- **WHOOP**, the wearable health and fitness manufacturers, has officially opened a new office at the Gardens International site. WHOOP is based out of Boston, Massachusetts, and produces technology that tracks science-backed metrics that matter, including heart rate variability, resting heart rate, and respiratory rate. Valued at approximately \$3.6 billion, WHOOP already has a strong Irish contingent across their teams, including Assistant Vice-President of Membership Services, Tina Stokes. Developed by Limerick Twenty Thirty, a special purpose vehicle of Limerick City and County Council, the multi-award winning Gardens International in the heart of Limerick City on Henry Street, the new base offers easy access to public transportation, dining, and other amenities for the WHOOP team.
- **Night Time Economy:** Limerick City and County Council held a Stakeholder Engagement Event on 26 September to hear views from businesses and stakeholders about what is required for a vibrant night-time economy in Limerick City, one which is accessible and workable for all citizens, businesses, visitors and those who work at night. The event incorporated information exchanges, insights from the recent Night Time Economy surveys and brainstorming sessions.

- **The Limerick Gift Card:** Limerick City and County Council, in partnership with Limerick Chamber, has unveiled plans to introduce a new gift card to encourage shop local in association with local businesses. The Gift Card initiative was published in September with the aim of driving footfall and spend in the city and surrounding towns, including Newcastle West, Adare, Abbeyfeale, Kilmallock and Rathkeale. The forthcoming Limerick Gift Card will be available as either a digital or physical gift card, with multiple benefits over paper gift vouchers, including security, friction-less redemptions and quick payment for merchants accepting the cards. The new Limerick gift card will provide tangible investment into a number of sectors including retail, hospitality, leisure and services, benefiting both the day and night time economy. Limerick businesses are encouraged to take part in the programme, which offers a no commission basis.

2. Local Enterprise Office (LEO) Limerick

- **Trading Online Voucher** – Eight Businesses in Limerick were approved for the Trading Online Voucher grant of up to €2,500 towards the development of their business website.
- **Energy Efficiency Grant** – One Business in West Limerick was approved a grant of €10,000 to upgrade equipment in their business which is more energy efficient and will reduce their costs and carbon footprint.
- **Green for Business** – Two Limerick-based businesses were approved for Green for Business supports in September to help them on their sustainability journey.
- **Grow Digital** – This new support for enterprises to implement digitalisation measure in their business was announced in September and provides financial support of up to €5,000.

- The National Ploughing Championships took place in Ratheniska, Co. Laois, and Lisnagry-based enterprise, Room Outdoors, represented Limerick in the Local Enterprise Village. Agri Tech company and LEO Limerick client from Abbeyfeale, Cotter AgriTech, were also represented at the Ploughing Championships where they displayed their Cotter Crate product to those in attendance.
- During September, LEO Limerick ran 11 different training programmes for 181 Limerick-based businesses to assist them on their business journey. One of the LEO's flagship training programme, the 15-week Advanced Management Development Programme, targeted at established businesses seeking to grow and expand, was launched on 18 September in Adare, with 15 Limerick businesses in attendance.
- The Minister of State with responsibility for Business, Employment and Retail in the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment, Emer Higgins, TD, visited the Local Enterprise Office Limerick on 23 September. The Minister met with the LEO staff to discuss some of the challenges facing business owners in Limerick and she also met with some LEO clients as part of her visit.

3. Tourism

Tourism General

In preparation for the formation of a new Tourism Strategy for Limerick, a Community Tourism Survey went live on 16 September asking the public a series of questions and providing an opportunity for any commentary/feedback in order to help shape the future of Limerick's Tourism offering. A Media Release was sent out on the survey on 16 September, with information and reminder posts on Limerick City and County Council's social media channels and Media Articles in relation to same on Live95 on 16 September, the Weekly Observer on 18 September, the Limerick Leader; Vale Star and Mallow Star on 19 September, as well as adverts on Live95 radio regularly over a three-week timeframe.

Limerick Greenway

- On World Tourism Day on 27 September, which coincided with International Week of the Deaf, Councillor Jerome Scanlan, who attended the event on behalf of the Mayor of Limerick, John Moran – along with Limerick City and County Council Tourism, Festival and Events Department colleagues, and those involved directly in the project - launched two U-Turn Units at Barnagh Viewing Point and Tullig Wood along Limerick Greenway which, when operated, can play local pieces of music and narratives in relation to different wildlife in the West Limerick region. Also, a QR Code on the mounting pole of each U-Turn unit can, when scanned on one's mobile device, take the person to a video of the local pieces of music and narratives being translated in the Irish Sign Language. A Photo story and Media Release were issued after the event with articles in many of the various local media outlets.
- Limerick Greenway's marketing campaign continued throughout September and included the following:
 - An excerpt in the Irish Examiner's Lifestyle Loves publication on 02 September and a full publication in the Irish Examiner's three big family days out on 07 September, following the Familiarisation Trip with Deirdre McArdle, Acting Lifestyle Editor with the Irish Examiner.
 - The Rising 2024, a fundraising event by charity A Lust For Life, which included cycling the full length of Limerick Greenway on their 158km cycle from Limerick city to Killarney, on 14 September.
 - Familiarisation Trip with Ben Haugh, Editor, Business Plus Magazine, on 27, 28 and 29 September.
 - Walk for Brú Charity 10km Walk, organised by Limerick man, Kevin Quaid, in aid of charity Brú Columbanus, in Cork, on 28 September, from Newcastle West Greenway Hub carpark to Barnagh Greenway Hub, with an article in the Limerick Post on 09 September promoting the event in advance.

FESTIVAL AND EVENTS

Polish Arts Festival (PAF)

The Polish Arts Festival, PAF, is the only festival of its kind in Ireland and now in its 17th year, ran between 26 and 29 September. The Festival began in the Limerick City Gallery of Art, where Olga Anacka's solo exhibition, "Patching Femininity," was debuted with live music from Dora Gola and JaYne. 27 September saw events such as The Peasants/ Chłopi being shown at the Belltable. 28 September had Hip Hop, Family Fabric Workshop, interactive music experience for children, and the Belltable hosted the film screening of Kaytek the Wizard and a Polish group of female singers. Other events included music from Seven Nun-Sins, DUB Intruda and DJ MANC at the Commercial Bar's Record Room on the Sunday and singing circle promoting community.

Hospital Arts and Culture Festival

From 18 to 22 September, the Annual Hospital Arts and Culture Festival took place. The Festival began at the Family Resource Centre where the following awards were presented: the Knight Award for Community Spirit and the Poetry and Photography Art awards followed by music from Kevin Sheehy and friends. Over the weekend, events included workshops in guitar maintenance and art. The local National School hosted an exploration dome and talks and performances were held on the third day of the festival with author, Christina Hardy, and actor and comedian, Seamus O'Rourke. The fourth day of the festival had a mix of events such as the Seamus O'Toole Memorial Tournament, poetry and music including African drumming workshop. The final day had a market, Theatre in the Tent, all ending in a festival Lantern Parade.

Limerick Jazz Festival

The Limerick Jazz Festival ran between 26 and 28 September. Aleka and Oxygen Thief with Romanian folk melodies with elements of Jazz started the festival, followed by a more traditional Jazz offering with elements of math rock and electronica. Events on the Friday included performances from Benjamin Boone Confluence Band at Dolans and Emma Rawicz, a critically acclaimed Saxophonist, performed at the Belltable. The final day

included a Jazz trail with free events across the city, taking in a Jazz workshop at the George Hotel and performance from the Markus Kraeber Trio at Steamboat Music. The Final performance was a Brazilian music night with the Kasia Eilas Band.

Pigtown Culture and Food Series

Pigtown Culture and Food Series took place from 20 to 22 September in the Milk Market. Friday evening saw Little Pigtown take place as part of Culture Night. Some activities on the night were a pet farm, live music, harp and candle making workshops. Demonstrations on the night showcased a blacksmith's workshop and there was also an antique craft display. Cooking demonstrations on the Saturday included Chef, George Casey, and on the Sunday, the Art of Pigtown Fair saw thirty-five local artists and crafters sell their products.

5. Discover Limerick DAC

Adare Heritage Centre

A public display event for the proposed remodelling and expansion of the Adare Heritage Centre Complex took place in Adare Village Hall on 05 September. The public was invited to view proposed plans to remodel and expand the complex. Part 8 application was submitted on 06 September. The Council has allocated funding to advance the detailed design of the project in order to ensure that the timeline of having the work completed in time for the Ryder Cup is achieved, subject to Government funding.

King John's Castle

Culture Night took place on 20 September and the Castle hosted the SIONNA music and arts festival – a free music festival showcasing five different artists, providing a platform for up-and-coming artists to showcase their talents.

A story-telling event called “The Storytelling Street” took place on Nicholas Street on Culture Night also, with local storytellers and animators from King John's Castle bringing the area's rich history to life. They recounted stories of the local characters who lived in the buildings on Nicholas Street and gave insights into their colourful past lives. This event was very popular and all three sessions were well attended on the day.

Industry Events

Discover Limerick DAC was represented at the Fáilte Ireland run Great Britain Coach Workshop that took place in the Radisson Hotel in Limerick on 12 September. The Marketing Manager of Discover Limerick DAC met with Tour Operators and Coach Owners showcasing the DAC sites to potential new customers, some of whom had never been to Limerick before.

European Mobility Week

During this week-long campaign, the Council committed to raising awareness about sustainable mobility and inspiring behavioural change towards active and sustainable travel methods, including walking, cycling, carpooling, and public transport.

1. Community Development

Local Community Development Committee

- Meetings of the Local Community Development Committee (LCDC) were held on 03 and 10 September.
- A presentation was given on LEADER 2023-2027 on Programme Timelines.

SICAP (Social Inclusion and Community Activation Programme)

- SICAP staff from the Local Authority attended a workshop that was delivered by Pobal and the Department of Rural and Community Development on the new SICAP programme.

Public Participation Network (PPN)

- Membership of PPN Limerick continued to grow and stands at 228. The membership registration form is on the Limerick PPN [website](#) and eligible groups in Limerick can register at any time.
- The Secretariat continued to fulfil its functions with a meeting held in September.
- PPN Limerick continued to have an active presence with its regularly updated website, social media and bi-monthly Newsletter distributed to members.

Integration

During the month of September, the Integration Support Team continued its regular visits to accommodation centres to meet with residents, offering information support clinics to address queries and provide guidance on accessing services and resources.

- **Assessment of Needs:** Conducting initial and ongoing assessments to determine the individual or family's needs.

- **Referral to Services:** Connecting clients with relevant services such as housing authorities, healthcare providers, schools, social welfare, NGOs (non-governmental organisations) etc.
- **Community Engagement:** Encouraging and supporting migrants in participation in local community activities, to accelerate integration and reduce isolation.
- **Ongoing Case Management:** Maintaining regular contact with clients to monitor their progress, address new issues, and adjust support as necessary.
- **Collaboration with Stakeholders:** Working closely with government agencies, NGOs and local communities to coordinate support services.
- **Documentation and Reporting:** Maintaining accurate records of interactions, and services provided to ensure proper case management.

Healthy Limerick

- The Mayor of Limerick, John Moran, met with the World Health Organisation (WHO) Regional Director for the European Healthy Cities Network and Minister Colm Burke, Minister of State for Public Health, Wellbeing and the National Drugs Strategy, as well as officials from the Department of Health, Limerick City and County Council and the HSE's Regional Executive Officer, on 10 September.
- The work of the Healthy Cities and Counties Programme, including Limerick City and County attaining WHO accreditation within the European Healthy Cities Network and the more focused Local Government piece in relation to the Healthy Ireland Local Government programmes, was the focus for the one-hour meeting. Following this meeting, the Mayor of Limerick, John Moran, Minister Burke and the WHO Advisor provided inputs to a wider audience, which included Healthy Ireland Local Government staff from

31 local authorities and local stakeholders working in the migrant health and wellbeing space. The focus in the afternoon turned to food security with site visits to Tait Community Kitchen and Tait House.

- Ballynanty Rovers has become Limerick's first smoke and vape free soccer club. The club is championing the 'Not Around Us' campaign, aiming to create a healthier environment for their community and beyond. The 'Not Around Us' initiative promotes spaces where it is easier for smokers and vapers to quit, and stay that way, while also helping to de-normalise smoking for the next generation. This health promotion campaign is led by Limerick City and County Council's Healthy Limerick, in partnership with the HSE and various community and youth organisations. 'Not Around Us' signs are available for any public or outdoor space where children and young people are likely to gather, reducing their exposure to smoking and vaping.
- The 'We're Breastfeeding Friendly Limerick' campaign was relaunched by the Mayor of Limerick, John Moran, in Kilmallock Library on 29 September. As part of this event, a collection of individual repoussé pieces created at previous workshops by Limerick mums was exhibited on the day. The 'We're Breastfeeding Friendly Limerick' campaign is now seeking more breastfeeding friendly businesses, organisations, communities and workplaces to join the initiative.
- Three Social Health and Education programmes started in County Limerick in September, two "Introduction to Personal Development through music" programmes with Mulcair Men's Shed, and one "Introduction to Personal Development" programme in Kilfinane.

Age Friendly

National Age Friendly Recognition and Achievement Awards 2024

- Under the National Age Friendly Recognition and Achievement Awards 2024, the 'Think before you park' campaign was shortlisted under the Transport category.
- It was submitted by Step Forward Disability Group who, in collaboration with Limerick City and County Council and the Gardaí, brought this initiative to fruition. The aim of the campaign is to raise awareness amongst motorists about the consequences of their parking choices which frequently cause obstructions and safety hazards for others who use wheelchairs, walking aids, those with limited sight and parents walking with their children in buggies.

- The judges were busy visiting all the incredible projects shortlisted around the country and on 12 September came to meet the dedicated team behind this inspiring initiative, the Step Forward Disability Group in Hospital Family Resource Centre.

Colbert Station Walkability Audit - World Health Organisation (WHO) Accreditation

- Colbert Station is one of 10 stations around the country selected for achieving WHO accreditation once it becomes an Age Friendly Station. To achieve it involves going through a four-step process as outlined by the WHO. One of the steps is to carry out a Walkability audit to see what improvements are required to bring it up to a standard to enable less able/vulnerable people to have accessible transport at the bus/rail station.
- On 13 September, the audit was conducted. The Age Friendly Ireland technical advisor, Age Friendly Programme Manager Limerick, representatives from Irish Rail, Bus Éireann, Dementia, Irish wheelchair Association, Visually impaired people and members from Age Friendly Older People's Executive all met. Photos were taken as issues were raised to capture same, as an agreed route was followed to check ticketing, signage, toilets, parking etc. and the immediate area surrounding the train station. This was followed by a round table discussion in the boardroom of Irish Rail to allow for those with impairments and the elderly who had taken part in the walkability audit to elaborate further on improvements required to make the station more user-friendly for that profile of people.

Limerick City Gallery of Art (LCGA)

- The Mayor of Limerick, John Moran, officially opened Vivienne Bogan's exhibition, Spontaneous Self, on 12 September. Bogan was born in Limerick and this exhibition of her work spans over 30 years but this is her first exhibition in LCGA. Opening at the same time was 'Odysseys of Self' exhibition by Tina O'Connell – a recent graduate from LSAD. A very large number of people (over 200) attended the openings.
- The Polish Arts Festival launched an exhibition of work by Olga Anacka titled Patching Femininity on 26 September. Councillor Elisa O'Donovan, in the presence of Patrick O'Sullivan, Honorary Consul for Poland in Limerick, officially launched the exhibition. There was strong representation from the Polish community in Limerick at the opening.
- LCGA continued to exhibit a selection of works from the Permanent Collection on a rotation basis expanding the use of separate exhibition galleries within the building. The exhibitions from the Permanent Collection display recent works donated and acquired, as well as works which are firm favourites to local and international visitors.
- LCGA hosted a performance by local Polish musicians on 29 September as part of the 2024 festival.
- Helium Arts held a one-day workshop in the Gallery on 21 September. The workshop was aimed at children with long-term illnesses.
- The University of the Third Age resumed its fortnightly meetings at LCGA on 17 September.

- Two works by Sarah Purser from LCGA Permanent Collections are on loan to the Hugh Lane Gallery for the major exhibition, More Power to You.
- LCGA continued to negotiate the loan of artworks by Walter Osborne to Raclin Murphy Museum of Art, University of Notre Dame, in the United States.

Limerick Museum

- On 05 September, the Mayor of Limerick, John Moran, performed the official opening of Continuum, an art exhibition by Gerry O'Mahony, a graduate of Limerick School of Art and Design. Gerry O'Mahony is a member of James Street Studios, Limerick and VAI (Visual Artists Ireland). He is also a member of ArtCan, a UK-based international art network. Continuum is a collection of recent artworks using a variety of materials and marks, it draws from very dark and very light spaces.
- On 10 September, the Museum received a large donation of Limerick lace and ancillary objects from the family of Veronica Rowe, whose grandmother, Florence Vere O'Brien, was a major figure in the history of Limerick lace. As a result, the Museum is now in possession of the entire Florence Vere O'Brien Collection.
- On Culture Night, 20 September, Limerick Museum remained open late and received a large number of visitors. The Museum hosted two special events on the night: an exhibition of photographs by Limerick Camera Club and a short film on Limerick lace, which had been made by the Friends of Lace Limerick and was shown continuously on a loop all evening.
- The Limerick Museum exhibition 200 Years of Achievement: The Dunraven Family and Limerick, continued in Saint Mary's Cathedral throughout September.

Limerick Arts Office

Strategic Fund for Culture and Arts Scheme 2024

- The Strategic Fund for Culture and Arts was developed by Limerick City and County Council to facilitate culture and arts organisations and practitioners in leveraging funds from national and international sources. The percentage available from the Limerick City and County Council Strategic Fund for Culture and Arts is 10% of the successful national or international award, to a maximum of €5,000, to fund elements of the projects specific to Limerick. In September, four strategic grants with a total value of €8,700, which assisted in leveraging grants to the value of €197,000, were awarded.

Call-Out for Applications - Artists' Residential Apartments, John's Square Limerick.

Limerick Arts Office's Artists' Apartments recognise cultural practitioners, across all art forms, by providing subsidised residential apartments in John's Square, Limerick. A competitive Open Call closed on 18 September. 20 applications were received for two available apartments. The Artists' Apartments create conditions for affordable living spaces for individual artists, attracting and keeping artists living and working in Limerick City, by encouraging living and working within the urban context. The apartments provide subsidised living spaces in recognition that artists and many individuals working in the arts are on modest income levels.

Studios

A competitive Open Call for one studio at James' Street Studios closed on 18 September. This is one in a complex of eight studios provided by Limerick City and County Council, at subsidised rental to professional artists, to support them in their careers and to enable them to work in Limerick City. A total of 11 applications were received.

Tyrone Guthrie Bursary

Limerick Arts Office Open Call for two Bursaries for the Tyrone Guthrie Centre closed on 18 September. The Tyrone Guthrie Centre at Annaghmakerrig is a residential workplace and residency programme in Ireland for artists of all disciplines. This Open Call to recognised cultural practitioners, across all art forms, residing within Limerick City and County, allows successful applicants to undertake a short residency at the Tyrone Guthrie Centre at Annaghmakerrig, the artist's workplace in Co. Monaghan. These bursaries cover all board and lodging expenses for one week, plus the use of a studio if necessary. Eight applications were received.

Open Call for Drama Facilitator

An Open Call for a Drama Facilitator to work in Limerick City closed on 11 September. Limerick Arts Office, working in collaboration with Limerick Youth Diversion Project, King's Island, is seeking a person experienced in script writing, production, stage management and socially engaged practice, who is comfortable working with harder to reach young people.

CREATIVE IRELAND

Síolta Glasa

The Creative Climate Action Project, Síolta Glasa, currently being delivered by Creative Ireland Limerick, in partnership with Climate Action, held the first of its storytelling workshops for participating creatives and communities on 26 September. The workshop was facilitated by Dr. Fergal Quinn and the University of Limerick School of English, Irish and Communication.

Culture Night 2024

20 September saw over 60 free events take place across Limerick City and County for Culture Night. This national celebration invites people to participate and explore the many different cultural offerings. Limerick people enjoyed dance, music, street art, theatre, parade, printmaking, exhibitions, talks and tours with events running from 4pm until 2am.

This year, Limerick was successful in two Culture Night Late awards. Limerick Arts Office led on Sionna Festival at King John’s Castle, while Top 8 and Dance Limerick presented an evening of Hip Hop. Three late night events were supported through the Night Time Economy, comprising Opera in Wickham Way, Sean-nós and story telling in Mother Macs, and a celebration of food in Treaty City Brewery. 1. Regeneration and Sports

Regeneration

Economic Regeneration

Limerick City and County Council Regeneration Directorate, in partnership with Intreo (the Public Employment Service), held an Employer Roadshow which took place on 10 September in the Strand Hotel, Limerick. Guest speakers from Intreo, Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board (LCETB), Technological University of the Shannon Midwest (TUS) and the Council briefed many local businesses in the construction industry about the supports and services available to them. This event was well attended and was a learning and networking opportunity taken by many of the Small/Medium Enterprise owners in Limerick.

Guests were also given a presentation on the Outreach to Employment programme which is a multi-agency partnership led by Limerick City and County Council to tackle the unemployment blackspots. Community mentors, funded through the Outreach to Employment programme, are assisting young people and the long term unemployed in the northside and southside of the city to avail of training, education and employment opportunities.

Community Activities

King's Island

The King's Island Community Centre continued to support residents throughout the month of September. Activities undertaken included:

- Culture Night, held on 20 September, saw local storytellers taking to Nicholas Street. Three performances took place with an estimated 40 people attending each performance.

- 'Car Free Day' – local stakeholders came together to convene at King's Island Community Centre for bike repair and refreshments before taking part in a cycle around St Mary's Park, Assumpta Park and Lee Estate, finishing at Nicholas Street. Here participants enjoyed storytelling about the buildings and residents of the area over the past 100 years.
- Crafty Monday returned to the Community Centre on 30 September.
- Community Engagement Students from University of Limerick were hosted on 18 September for a presentation about the 'Empowering Communities' programme in King's Island.
- 25 September saw the Hunt Museum host the Creepy Crawlies Clay Modelling workshop.
- Boxercise returned to its twice-a-week schedule held in the community centre.
- Bingo continued to be well attended on each Monday night.
- Freestyle Dancing proving popular, and held each Tuesday and Thursday.

Moyross

- Moyross Community Enterprise Centre (MCEC) now hosts a women's personal development group that runs three days a week.
- The 'Good to Go' group continued to meet every Thursday, with over 20 people attending. This is targeted at older individuals in the area.
- The Health Service Executive 'Living Well' programme was run from the MCEC. 15-20 people partake in this programme.

Southill

- Training for Community Employment workers in bricklaying, construction, and development of new raised beds, through QQI-accredited modules took place in conjunction with Tait House.
- Tait House welcomed the return of the school-aged childcare service, including the collection of children from three local national schools each school day.
- The gardening and craft classes, in partnership with Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board, recommenced in Tait House.

Ballinacurra Weston

- The Our Lady of Lourdes Community Services Group held a Family Fun Day on 06 September. Local volunteers across all age groups worked alongside the community to set up the balloon displays and decorate the centre's grounds.
- On 28 September, the community centre youth services hosted the Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board Youth initiative of "Pizza on the Pitch." The evening allowed young people and their families to enjoy a Family Movie night on the astro pitch and enjoy the community-led event.

- Design works progressed towards lodgement of a S179A application for a Cosgrave Park Phase 2 development in Moyross comprising 20 units.

Council Sporting Facilities

Limerick Regional Athletics Hub (LRAH)

- During September, 131 individual users visited the facility.
- 41 new users registered to use the facility on the Sportkey Platform.

- 2,200 metres of 2.5-metre-high earthen flood embankment involving importation of 97,300m³ of Class 2F core fill and 55,400m³ of Class 4 Landscape fill with 3-metre-wide footpath/cycleway and public lighting.
- Flood defence upgrades to existing quay walls involving:
 - Deconstruction of existing quay walls and parapets.
 - Lime mortar repointing, lime grouting and stonework repair to 870 metres of existing quay walls, approximately four metres high.
 - Construction of:
 - 290 metres of flood defence walls with glass panels.
 - 810 metres of stone clad reinforced concrete flood defence walls.
- The contract was awarded to Ward and Burke Construction Ltd. in the sum of €31,973,715.86, excluding VAT.

Citizen Innovation Lab

This September, the work of the Citizen Innovation Lab was highlighted at the 79th United Nations General Assembly Science Summit in New York. A team from University of Limerick and Limerick City and County Council was invited to the Summit to share the Lab's success in bringing together citizens, researchers and Local Government towards innovative climate action in the city. The Lab team participated in a session with representatives from the Office of the UN Secretary General and the New York Civic Engagement Commission. As a member of the European Network of Living Labs (ENoLL), the team joined an ENoLL delegation showcasing the work of prominent European living labs specialising in climate action. The team discussed the legacy and current activities of the Lab at the Science Summit and shared lessons learned from projects including:

- SMARTLAB - a living lab project currently working with participants from 70 Limerick city buildings with energy and environmental sensors installed.
- Síolta Glasa – a project using creative arts to engage communities in climate-focused activity.

- Clean Air Together Limerick City - a citizen science project in conjunction with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), recruiting 400 participants to record air quality in their local areas.
- City Studio - a new laboratory for citizens, Local Government and University collaboration. The studio is focused on the future of the city and the importance of design as a catalyst for Limerick's Climate Action Plan.

The Citizen Innovation Lab had a busy month in September hosting more than 40 events, including the Public consultation for the Market Quarter and Cruises Street Public Realm, Friends of Lace, a group showing how to upskill and upcycle clothing and the Royal Institute of Architects Regional Meeting.

As a result, 10 wildcards were chosen to join the five locations already voted through on the Live 95 public vote for the grand finale.

Ballyhoura Tidy Towns Awards Ceremony

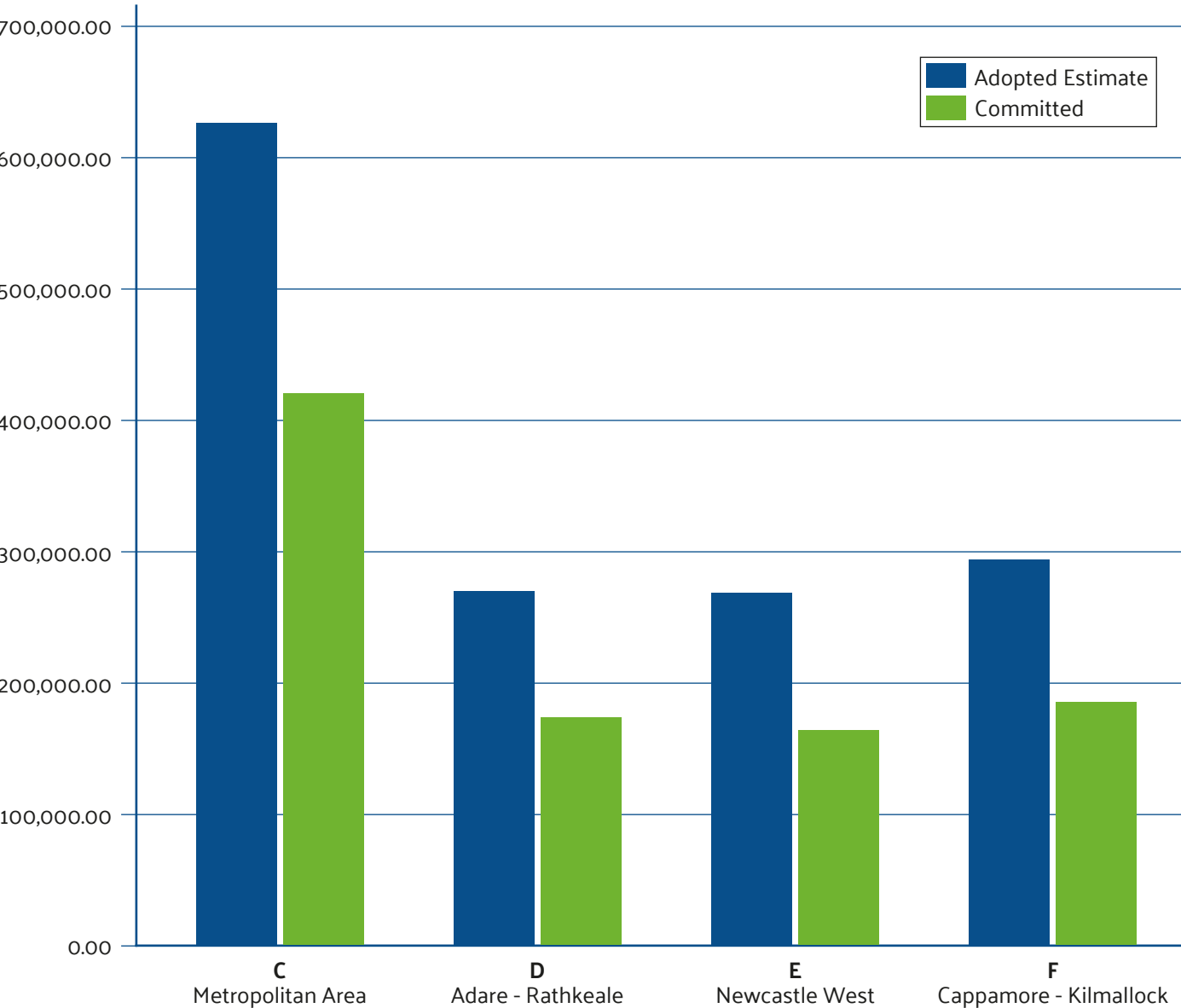

Customer Services

The Customer Services Team continued to support customers and Public Representatives at first point of contact by answering queries via telephone, email, MyLimerick and social media. Case creation, payments processing and generally facilitating applications for all Council services also continued throughout the month.

The following figures highlight the activity within the Contact Centre throughout the month of September:

- Customer Services Call Centre answered 11,012 calls. This represents an average of 524 per day, with the number of calls reaching as high as 664. A total of 77% of calls were handled at first point of contact.
- A total of 4,195 emails were processed through the Customer Services email platform.
- 3,275 cases were created on Dynamics, with 900 of these logged on behalf of Public Representatives. 3,093 cases were closed, with 755 of these being cases logged by Public Representatives.
- Of the 3,275 cases created, 69% were logged by the Customer Services team.
- The logging of cases through the MyLimerick portal continued, with a total of 151 cases being logged during the month. Of these, 138 were submitted by Public Representatives.
- Customer Services continued to support the Housing Maintenance Department in creating service requests and, throughout September, 98% of Housing Maintenance cases for the Limerick Metropolitan District were logged by Customer Services staff in the Dooradoyle and Merchant's Quay offices.
- A total of 112 out-of-hours cases were created.
- Customer Services continued to provide other frontline services to the general public, such as processing applications for Residential Parking Permits, of which 117 were applied for and 65 issued.
- Customer Services staff welcomed a total of 2,591 customers at the Merchant's Quay and Dooradoyle offices.
