




Raheen-Dooradoyle Areas of Focus

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

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

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
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Newcastle West

Sample Priorities






Population increase of Dublin more than 3 times that of the other Cities combined





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
Population Growth 2016 to 2022

% of RSES Growth Projection Achieved






Planning and Development Activity 2022 – 2023: SRA Local Authorities

Housing Completions in Cities

- Irelands five Cities have accounted 24,600 new homes over 2022 and 2023, 39% of all completions nationally.
- When only houses are considered, delivery across the five cities is broadly proportional to the targeted distribution growth set out in the NPF. However when apartment delivery is included, there is a stark difference in the overall distribution of housing in Dublin (82%) compared to other Cities combined (18%).
- Since 2018, 28,400 apartments have been completed across the five Cities. **Of these, 26,326 (93%) have been delivered in Dublin, with only 270 (1%) in Limerick.**
- Trends highlight a sustained under delivery of privately developed higher density, apartment developments in Cities outside of Dublin – primarily due to development viability rather than lack of market demand.

National Development Plan 2021-2030 Planned Investment Per Capita



Planned Investment in MASP Areas and Opportunities for Equalised Funding






Effective Regional Development Key Issues and Concerns

- Ambitions for balanced regional growth **are reasonable and achievable**, but require an **effective whole of government approach to implementation**.
- Housing market dynamics are resulting in **a significantly more pronounced under delivery of housing in our Region and Cities** compared to Dublin and the Mid-East. **This is influencing, rather than a response to, population growth.**
- Planned capital investment under NDP **is significantly misaligned with the objectives of the NPF** and fails to support ambitions for the Southern Region.
- The misalignment of the NDP and NPF is not recognised by government, with **no effective mechanism for monitoring** the regional distribution of investment.
- **It is not realistic to our three Cities to grow at a faster rate than Dublin when they receive half the level of investment.**







Aim of the Submission

This submission is intended to support the Government in developing a more tailored approach that ensures Limerick is well-positioned to meet the challenges and opportunities of the coming decades.

In alignment with the Mayor's "More for Limerick" programme, this submission focuses on five key objectives that are essential for Limerick's growth and success, which should be considered in the First Revision of the NPF:

1. Developing an ambitious plan for Limerick's growth to 2050.
2. Enhancing the quality of life and place-making to create vibrant, attractive communities.
3. Promoting social inclusion and ensuring more equal opportunities for all.
4. Increasing access to more affordable and sustainable housing.
5. Reimagining and revitalising our City Centre.

Limerick's Growth to 2050

- Build on the momentum gained through the Limerick 2030 strategy and prepare subsequent plan to 2050.
- Review the population growth figures in Tables 2.1 & 4.1 which are incorrect for Limerick.
- Council recommend that the timeframe for the 'regional parity' approach be extended (see section 2.4, 'Growing our Regions').
- Review the definition of 'built-up footprint' in the NPF, as it requires greater clarity.
- Recommended that the text on 20% phased population is reviewed to ensure that it does not compromise the long-term growth and sustainability of Limerick City.
- More clarity on the DMAP preparation process; delivery timeline, supports and public participation.
- Clarity about and support for new healthcare treatment facilities (level 3 and level 4) to support Mid-West population growth to 2040-2050

Enhanced quality of Life and Place-making

- The inclusion of TOD as a key future growth enabler for Limerick.
- Potential of urban rail services - Need to investigate the viability of expanding its urban rail provision, including the reopening of disused lines and connections to Kilmallock and Shannon Airport and new stations on operating lines (Moyross, Corbally, Parkway, Ballysimon etc.).
- URDF and RRDF funding criteria and amounts need to increase.
- Support for Limerick's creative industries.
- Additional funding for heritage conservation and the development of infrastructure for creative infrastructure.

Social Inclusion and Equal Opportunities

- Development of social infrastructure, decentralise healthcare services, and ensuring equitable access to healthcare and education.
- Provisions to help ensure that educational infrastructure keeps pace with population growth.
- Recognise Department of Education as a key stakeholder.
- Establishment of dedicated telecoms unit within the County.

More Affordable and Sustainable Housing

- Need to outline the necessary supports and funding to ensure success of the new Directly Elected Mayor governance structure - Limerick Growth and Infrastructure Fund.
- Leverage private sector financing to expand Limerick's housing portfolio through the Limerick Housing co-op initiative.
- Timely delivery on critical infrastructure, particularly in areas such as transport, water and community services.

City Centre Revitalisation

Need for increased funding to support Limericks strategic projects:

- King's Island Development
- Reimagining Limerick's Georgian Quarter
- Waterfront and Riverside Development
- Public Lighting and Safety Improvements
- Colbert Quarter and Docklands
- Amenities such as library, Game Cube, sports and cultural amenities in Colbert Quarter
