
Active Travel News

A new digital map providing an interactive information source for the public on current and future walking, wheeling and cycling projects in Limerick has been launched on Limerick.ie [Click here](#)

The resource will show colour coordinated, categorised projects that have been delivered and are being worked on by the multi-disciplinary Active Travel team in Limerick City & County Council, based in Barrow House on Michael St.

For the first time, all cycle lanes in Limerick have been mapped and are now available for the public to view. **These consist of 104km approx. in the city and 41km approx. in the county.** All works in progress and works that have been approved to proceed via statutory planning processes have been included, with it now possible to see the Active Travel network's continued development in one place.

These projects are being fully funded by the **National Transport Authority (NTA)**, which has allocated Limerick City & County Council €20.5 million to spend on walking, wheeling and cycling infrastructure in 2025.



Active Travel News

The new Active Travel digital map will show the following across Limerick city and county:

- Progress of the rollout of **enhanced pedestrian infrastructure** under Active Travel funding across both Limerick city and county.
- Progress of **Limerick's cycle network** (specifying built, under construction and future cycleways).
- Progress of the rollout of the **Safe Routes to School programme** (specifying completed and upcoming works).
- Completed facilities under the **Bus Shelters Enabling Works Programme**.
- Locations of **nitrogen dioxide monitoring tubes** in areas being monitored by the Active Travel team.
- Available **bike parking facilities** throughout Limerick City and County.

The map will be continuously updated with other elements of the Active Travel Limerick team's work in the future.

The intent is to share the map's information with OpenStreetMap and Google Maps, in order for members of the public to be able to use existing tools for accurate cycle and pedestrian journey planning.

Bus Stop

Towns and Villages Schemes

Note: The Active Travel team is tasked with providing new and upgraded pedestrian infrastructure across Limerick City & County Council's Metropolitan and Municipal districts.

Active Travel Limerick has recently funded works in **Caherline, Co. Limerick**, that are now completed.

The works included:

- Junction tightening.
- Tactile paving installed.
- New raised kerbing.
- Installation of **860m** squared of new public footpath.
- New pedestrian crossing points, public lighting and corresponding drainage works .
- The works included the surfacing of the main junction in Caherline and corresponding approaches to **Caherline National School**.



Mill Road Scheme

The following works are anticipated to be carried out as part of the Mill Road Scheme over the coming weeks:

- Complete footpath construction in front of Roseneath and commence carriageway works.
- Continue drainage and footpath construction in front of **Scoil Íde**.
- ESB and Eir to continue installing cables and preparing for diversion of the overhead lines.
- Surfacing to accesses.



R510 Raheen Roundabout to Quinn's Cross Scheme

All night works are now completed.

Raheen Roundabout - Quinns Cross Roundabout (Daytime)

(Week commencing Monday, 31st of March '25)

- Completion of landscaping.
- Drainage cut-outs to cycle lane segregation kerbs.
- Completion of finishing works and boundary treatments.
- Completion of signage and road markings following the now completed surfacing works.
- Completion of public lighting installation.

All works are off line to the R510 with two way traffic maintained.

On occasion for a short duration Stop/ Go TTM may be required to facilitate the movement of plant/ delivery vehicles to and from the work areas.

Temporary Traffic Management plan (TTM)

- Removal of decommissioned public lighting columns on the R510 including reinstatement of concrete to footpath bays. To facilitate these works Stop/ Go TTM will be required on the R510 from **9.30am - 4.00pm Monday to Friday (31st of March until the 11th of April)**.
