

2. Trade and Investment

- On 18 February, a delegation from Savannah, Georgia, USA, led by Mayor Van R. Johnson II, visited Limerick City and County Council. During a Special Meeting of the Plenary Council at the Council's Offices in Dooradoyle, Mayor Johnson and the Mayor of Limerick, John Moran, signed a Friendship Agreement to promote mutual understanding, tourism, and economic development between the two cities.
- Mayor Johnson expressed a strong commitment to fostering economic, tourism, and cultural ties, highlighting the significant Irish heritage within Savannah. He noted that many residents bear surnames like Hogan, Barry, and McCarthy, reflecting deep ancestral connections to Limerick.
- The Savannah delegation included key figures from sectors such as trade, transportation, city management, tourism, finance, and business development. Over their two-day visit, they engaged in discussions with local stakeholders, including representatives from the IDA, Limerick Chamber, Enterprise Ireland, and local educational institutions. The itinerary also featured presentations, site visits, and a focus on exploring collaborative opportunities, such as establishing a direct flight route between Shannon and Savannah.
- Lidl opened a new state-of-the-art Limerick store located off the Groody Road, beside Limerick Educate Together Secondary School and the new Bon Secours Hospital which is under construction. The new Lidl store represents the first major retail offering in the area and has created 30 permanent retail jobs for the local community.
- The Trade and Investment Team attended the Limerick Chamber Small and Medium Enterprises Seminar, which was attended by EU Commissioner, Michael McGrath. The event discussed the key challenges facing Europe and their implications for Ireland and the business community.

3. Local Enterprise Office (LEO) Limerick

- LEO Limerick ran five Training programmes and Business Advice Clinics during the month for Limerick-based businesses, which were attended by 77 business owners from across the City and County.

In February, LEO Limerick approved:

- Two Digital for Business supports to help Limerick business incorporate digitalisation strategies into their business models.
- Three Green for Business programmes were provided to Limerick enterprises to assist them map out their sustainability journey.
- Two Trading Online Vouchers to assist Limerick companies who want to trade online.
- One Market Explorer grant to assist Limerick businesses with their exporting strategy.
- 27 One-to-One Mentoring sessions with LEO Limerick Business Consultants.
- During the month of February, Enterprise Ireland announced the number of jobs created by Local Enterprise Office supported enterprises for 2024. In Limerick, there was a net gain of 178 jobs in businesses supported by LEO Limerick.

FILM IN LIMERICK

Film in Limerick had an exciting and productive February with substantial local and international engagement.

Below is a summary of the key highlights:

Bonhoeffer European Premiere

The highly anticipated European premiere of Bonhoeffer, a €22m Irish-Belgian co-production, took place at the Belltable in Limerick. The event was a major success, drawing over 250 attendees. The film, directed by Todd Komarnicki, explores the life of theologian and anti-Nazi dissident, Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Parts of the movie were filmed in Limerick, including locations like the Georgian Quarter, Cleeves Factory and Pery Square.

Berlinale and European Film Market (EFM)

As part of its international outreach, Film in Limerick attended the Berlinale Film Festival and the European Film Market (EFM), one of the top film markets globally. Local producer, Tara Doolan, pitched her Screen Ireland-backed TV project Bluebell Fields, while screenwriter, Richard Lynch, presented his feature script The Crier at the event.

Sound Masterclass with Oscar Winner

In February, 120 students from Munster’s Third Level colleges participated in a soundmaster class led by an Oscar-winning expert. This educational opportunity was a significant boost for students in the region, providing direct access to high-level industry knowledge.

Crew Academy at Dublin International Film Festival

Film in Limerick supported local talent through Crew Academy’s participation in the Dublin International Film Festival, an important event for networking and showcasing talent.

Work Placements at West Cork Studio

Another important initiative was offering work placements on film productions at West Cork Studio. This opportunity provided invaluable hands-on experience for emerging talent in the industry.

Transportation and Mobility

1. Travel and Transport Strategy

BusConnects Network Improvements

During February, representatives from the National Transport Authority BusConnects Team, and their Consultants, visited Limerick as part of the design stage planning for BusConnects Limerick. Staff from Limerick City and County Council met with the BusConnects Team over four days to assess locations for new bus stops and terminals.

Road Safety Working Together Group – Quarterly Meeting

The Quarterly Meeting of the Limerick Road Safety Working Together Group took place on 25 February. At the meeting, the group received updates on the Speed Limit Review/Implementation and the Limerick City Centre Transport Plan.

The Road Safety Working Together Group is led and chaired by Limerick City and County Council and has representatives from An Garda Síochána, Transport Infrastructure Ireland, Health Service Executive – Ambulance Service, Limerick City and County Council – Fire and Emergency Services, Limerick Cycling Campaign and Limerick Pedestrian Network.

Park Road Bridge, Corbally / Rheybogue

An application for planning consent for the refurbishment of Park Road Bridge has been submitted to An Bord Pleanála. The proposed works consist of:

- Removal of the bridge deck and support beams and replacing them with a new deck and beams at the same location.
- All associated site development works.

A Natura Impact Statement (NIS) has been prepared in respect of the proposed development. Submissions or observations to be made in writing to An Bord Pleanála.

New Bloodmill Road, Towerton - Re-Alignment and Completion

This project has progressed very well under contract with Priority Construction.

Improvements to R506 Cappamore Road Junction with R445 Dublin Road

Construction of this project has now commenced under contractor, P&D Lydon.

Mill Road, Corbally, Limerick: Works continued to progress on site. Upgrade of footpath from cul-de-sac to Scoil Íde continuing. Boundary wall construction adjacent to private properties ongoing, landscaping at junctions near completion.

R510 Quinn's Cross to Raheen, Limerick: Works continued to progress on site. Concrete slip-form segregation kerb to cycle lane laid from St. Nesson's National School to Mungret Gate junction. Public lighting installation ongoing.

St. Patrick's Road, Singland, Limerick: Works substantially completed. Includes installation of both controlled and uncontrolled pedestrian crossings; junction tightening works; installation of raised tables; new kerbing.

3. Mid West National Road Design Office

The Adare Bypass Design and Construction Contract was signed at a reception held at the Council's Corporate Headquarters, Merchant's Quay, hosted by the Mayor of Limerick, John Moran, in the presence of the Minister for Climate, Environment and Energy and Minister for Transport, Darragh O'Brien, T.D. The contract was awarded to the Sisk Sorensen Joint Venture, comprising John Sisk & Son (Holdings) Ltd. and Sorensen Civil Engineering Ltd., and is funded by the Government of Ireland through the Department of Transport.

The Government is investing approximately €150 million to deliver the bypass.

Limerick Arts Office

Strategic Fund for Culture and Arts Scheme 2025

Limerick Arts Office manages the 2025 Strategic Fund for Culture and Arts Scheme. The purpose of the scheme is to support the maximising of the leveraging of funding into Limerick from national and international sources and to support a vibrant creative culture.

In February, 12 letters of support were issued:

- 11 to support Arts Council of Ireland applications (Opera, Dance, Music, Theatre, Film, and Visual Arts).
- One to support a Culture Ireland application (Theatre).

Grants Under the Arts Act

- The Grants Under the Arts Act closed for applications at 12 Noon on 12 February. These grants are open to artists, community and voluntary groups to promote the arts and provide access to arts for Limerick. The total grant budget is €20,000 and grants offered average between €150 - €500, with a maximum of €1,000 being offered in exceptional circumstances. A total of 59 applications were received.

Individual Arts Bursary, Theatre Bursary, and Dolores O'Riordan Music Bursary Awards Schemes 2025

- Limerick Arts Office invited applications from professional artists based in or operating substantially within Limerick City and County Council's administrative area who wished to be considered for a Bursary of up to €4,000 for Individual Arts and Dolores O'Riordan Music, and €5,000 for Theatre for the development of work/professional skills, in any art form, including Visual Arts, Circus, Dance and Literature, Theatre and Music. The closing date for applications was 12 Noon on 12 February.
- A total of 58 applications were received - 33 Individual Arts, 18 Dolores O'Riordan Music, seven Theatre.

Limerick Creative Communities Small Grants Scheme (formerly Made in Limerick Grants Scheme)

- A total of 68 applications were received under the Limerick Creative Communities Small Grants Scheme, which closed for applications on 05 February. These grants were open to Limerick-based creative practitioners, organisations and communities of place and interest to submit applications. They were assessed on 24 February by an independent expert panel.

Opportunities

- Creative Limerick, with the Arts Office, launched a Request for Quote for an event co-ordinator to support the development and delivery of Limerick Cruinníú na nÓg 2025.
- The Drama League of Ireland Summer School Bursary 2025 opened for applications. Limerick Arts Office is offering one non-residential bursary to attend the Drama League of Ireland Summer School 2025 at the University of Limerick. This bursary will cover one week's tuition (lectures, workshop etc.), to a maximum value of €390 (members) or €440 (non-members). The purpose of this bursary is to support professional development.

Integration Supports

Ongoing Visits to Accommodation Centres

The Integration Support Team continued to regularly visit accommodation centres to meet with residents, offering information support clinics to address their queries and provide guidance on accessing services and resources. These centres include Riverhouse, Ballysimon, Fernbank Designated Accommodation Centre, Knockalisheen, Coonagh Travelodge among others.

- 29 visits were made to the above accommodation centres.
- Nine information sessions were held with residents.
- 87 residents were supported with different issues in all of the centres.

Assessment of Needs

- The Integration Team continued to conduct initial and ongoing assessments to determine the needs of the residents during weekly visits to International Protection Accommodation Services (IPAS) and Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection (BOTPs) accommodation centres in Limerick.

Referral to Services

- The Integration Team continued to connect and signpost clients and migrant residents in Limerick with key relevant services such as housing authorities, healthcare providers, schools, social welfare services, Non-Governmental Organisations etc.

Community Engagement

- The Integration Team continued to encourage and support migrants in the participation of the local community activities in Limerick City and County in order to accelerate their integration and reduce isolation.

Ongoing Case Management

- The Integration Team continued to maintain regular contacts with clients and migrant residents, especially those living in IPAS and BOTPs accommodation centres, in order to monitor their progress, address new issues and challenges, and adjust appropriate supports as necessary.

Collaboration with Stakeholders

- Working closely with government agencies, non-governmental organisations and local communities to coordinate support services - the Integration Team assisted PAUL Partnership in providing Manual Handling Training free-of-charge to a number of BOTPs and IPAS clients in Limerick city and county.

1. Regeneration, Sports and Recreation

Economic Regeneration

The Outreach to Employment Project Group held its monthly meeting to review initiatives in the previous year, including the Jobs Fairs which have been running in each of the Regeneration areas over the last three years. Feedback from evaluation surveys was discussed with a focus on a tailored approach to meet specific group's employment, training and further education needs.

Social Regeneration

The five Local Strategic Advisory and Monitoring Group (LSAMG) sub-committees have met and reviewed Economic and Social Intervention Fund (ESIF) 2025 applications. Applications were reviewed by the sub-committee with responsibility for each of the Economic and Social Intervention Fund themes: Community; Education and Learning; Health, Wellbeing and Ageing Well; Families and Youth at Risk; and Employability and Work. 97 projects across 55 organisations were recommended for consideration by the LSAMG prior to progressing to the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage for decision.

Community Activities

King's Island

- A Safe Pass course was delivered for the community through the St. Mary's Community Adult Education Group, held in King's Island Community Centre.
- Regular activities, including Crafty Mondays, Family Learning, Drumming, LEGO Club took place at the Community Centre. Attendance and engagement for these remain positive.

- An Energy Awareness workshop was held in St. Mary's National School.

Moyross

- Limerick Sports Partnership delivered a suite of programmes in Moyross during the month. These take place at a variety of venues, including the Moyross Youth Academy, Moyross Community Enterprise Centre (MCEC) and Corpus Christi Primary School Hall. The activities included MoyFit, Good2Go, line dancing and the popular Boxercise classes. These are open to men and women of all ages from the community who are seeking to maintain or improve their exercise levels.
- The Centre has recently installed a new sensory space contained within the Little Seeds Childcare.

Southill

- Southill Hub advertised two roles, Chef Manager and a Cafe Assistant, during February.
- Southill Hub continued to host weekly clinics with the Council, enabling members of the local community to engage with the Council at a convenient location.

Ballinacurra Weston

- Our Lady of Lourdes Community Services Group hosted a Valentine's Day themed pop-up restaurant on 15 February. A total of 32 guests were welcomed and enjoyed a three-course meal, with live music. The Community Companions played a key role in organising this event which was warmly received by the community.
- The Group also hosted a global staff training day for 65 individuals to support staff understanding of the overall organisation.

A REFER Restarter Café, which is a free electronic repair event, was hosted in the Citizen Innovation Lab. Each repair workshop or event is free and is open to the general public on a first come, first served basis. Anybody can bring along their broken electronic appliances, devices and sit down with repairers to see what is wrong with it and what can be done to fix or repair it. People are encouraged to drop in with their broken phones, laptops, hoovers or other electrical or electronic appliances. Skilled repair volunteers help people diagnose and fix these broken or slow electronic devices and small appliances, to save them from waste and help change our relationship with electronics.

Clean Air Together

Limerick City and County Council hosted the Clean Air Together Limerick City results event, in partnership with the Environmental Protection Agency, at The Strand Hotel on 26 February. Approximately 400 citizens participated in the project by measuring nitrogen dioxide, a traffic air pollutant, at their home or business for the month of October in 2024. The results indicated that, in comparison with relevant standards and recommendations, all of the results meet the current Irish Air Quality Standards, and 98% of the results meet the proposed target for 2030 in the new EU Clean Air for Europe (CAFE) Directive.

Globe Project

Limerick City and County Council hosted students from Castletroy College and St. Clement's College, in partnership with An Taisce and the Environmental Protection Agency, on 27 February at Merchant's Quay in relation to a workshop, teaching students about the assessment of air quality at their own schools under a pilot GLOBE project. The Council has supported the project by installing and managing air quality and meteorological sensors at the colleges and presenting at workshops the work the Environment Section carries out.

Environmental Awareness

Visits to schools renewing their Green Flag continued during February with 11 schools receiving visits from the Environmental Awareness Officer across the following themes – Water (2), Biodiversity (3), Global Citizenship Litter and Waste (1), Global Citizenship Energy (3) and Global Citizenship Marine Environment (2).

Information briefings and ongoing programmes attended by the Environmental Awareness Officer included:

- Food Cloud Briefing – driving food loss and waste solutions for a more equitable, inclusive and circular food system.
- Community of Practice Furniture, Re-love Paint Limerick, Reuse and Repair Funding and Adare My Waste Green Hub project.

The Limerick City Fairtrade School poster competition results ceremony was hosted in Istabraq Hall, Merchant's Quay, in conjunction with the Limerick City Fairtrade Committee. This was a 99% zero waste event due to a collaborative effort to ensure only use of real delph and cutlery and correct segregation of the minor amount of waste produced (tea bags and bun cases and milk cartons). This was a really lovely event attended by the Mayor of Limerick, John Moran, with an attendance of 90 (students and their families). The following schools received awards for promoting Fairtrade products through the medium of art with some fantastic posters on display which were created by students of primary and secondary schools – Castletroy College, An Mhodhscoil O'Connell Avenue, Our Lady of Lourdes Rosbrien, Corpus Christi Primary School and Art Class Moyross, and Scoil An Spioraid Naoimh, Roxborough.

Customer Services

The Customer Services Team continued to support customers and Public Representatives at first point-of-contact by answering queries via telephone, email, My Limerick and social media. Case creation, payments processing and generally facilitating applications for all Council services also continued throughout the month.

The following figures highlight the activity within the Contact Centre throughout the month of February:

- Customer Services Call Centre answered 10,241 calls. This represents an average of 539 per day, with the number of daily calls exceeding 600 on several occasions and reaching as high as 766. 78% of calls were handled at first point-of-contact.
- A total of 3,557 emails were processed through the Customer Services email platform.

- 3,215 cases were created, with 724 of these logged on behalf of Public Representatives. A total of 4,194 cases were closed, with 839 of these being cases logged by Public Representatives.
- Of these 3,215 cases, Customer Services staff logged 67% of same.
- The logging of cases through the MyLimerick portal continued, with a total of 144 cases being logged. Of these, 134 were submitted by Public Representatives.
- Customer Services continued to support the Housing Maintenance Department in creating service requests and, throughout the month, 98% of housing maintenance cases for the Limerick Metropolitan District were logged by Customer Services staff in the Dooradoyle and Merchant's Quay offices.
- A total of 115 out-of-hours cases were created.
- Customer Services continued to provide other frontline services to the general public, such as processing applications for Residential Parking Permits, of which 97 were applied for and 73 issued.
- Customer Services staff welcomed a total of 2,510 customers at both the Merchant's Quay and Dooradoyle offices.
