## Emergency Vehicle Report Workshop

Active Travel Limerick hosted an engagement workshop for **Metropolitan District Councillors on Monday, 9th June 2025**, both in-person at the Council Chamber, Merchants Quay, and online. The focus of the workshop was to get feedback and input from Elected Members on the independent study's objectives, of examining the interaction between Active Travel projects and emergency vehicle.

The study is being undertaken by **Egis**, a leading global consulting engineering firm with expertise in Smart Cities, Transport Engineering, Active Travel, Rail, and Urban Transport. The workshop provided Elected Members with the opportunity to engage with the Egis at an early stage of the project, ensuring their insights and concerns are incorporated from the outset.

The tender process for the study was in response to a Notice of Motion query at the December 2024 Metropolitan meeting about the interaction of emergency services and Active Travel projects.

The workshop was led by **Ilyaas Adams of Egis**, who delivered a presentation outlining the study's scope, methodology, and how data will be gathered and shared. He also invited questions and feedback from Councillors to inform the report's development in the coming months.

# TUS Moylish to City Centre Scheme

The following works are anticipated to be carried out as part of the TUS Moylish to City Centre Scheme over the coming weeks:

- **Bus stop shelter 606941** is still currently in operation and will be for the next two weeks (approx). A temporary bus stop will be set up in the interim period until the upgraded bus shelter is replaced.
- Service installation and kerbing will continue.
- Concrete footpath to commence.
- Works will be ongoing in front of the **TUS Campus** building where a new footpath and cycleway will be installed.

**Note: Half of the TFI Bike Stand is closed off to accommodate works.**

**Note: Two way traffic will be maintained, apart for very short intervals where plant & material will be going into the works area via the site access points, flagmen will be present during these operations.**




# Mill Road Scheme

The following works are anticipated to be carried out as part of the Mill Road Scheme over the coming weeks:

- Works will continue on the **Corbally/Mill Road Junction** the 4 way Stop/Go system will continue to accommodate these works **until Wednesday the 18<sup>th</sup> of June.**
- Ducting, drainage and kerbing works will continue.
- Base course of tar will be laid following the installation of kerbing.

**Note: Night works starting Monday the 23<sup>rd</sup> of June from 19.00-07.00hrs. The works are expected to last until Saturday the 28<sup>th</sup> of June at 07.00.** The work undertaken at this time will be road surface works and resurfacing works with tar.

- Footpath refurbishment.
- Widening works along the **R518 Ballingarry Road, Rathkeale.**
- Footpath repairs and junction widening at **Bank Place**, at the junction with **Ballingarry Road, Rathkeale.**
