 Glin, a picturesque village on the Shannon Estuary, boasts a rich and varied culture dating back to the early Celtic settlements of the Corbry Clan.




2 Foyne Flying Boat and Maritime Museum

11 Knockfierna Heritage and Famine Trail

 Nestled in the Ballyhoura Mountain range in the south of County Limerick, this is the largest mountain bike trail network of its kind in Ireland.




13 Limerick Regional Athletics Hub

CITY ATTRACTIONS AND ACTIVITIES

- 1 King John's Castle** www.kingjohnscastle.com
Located on the banks of the River Shannon, King John's Castle is Limerick's most iconic landmark.
- 2 Limerick Milk Market** www.milkmarketlimerick.ie
Established in 1852 and situated in the heart of Limerick City, Limerick Milk Market is a haven for all who care about the provenance and quality of the food they eat.
- 3 Saint Mary's Cathedral** www.saintmaryscathedral.ie
Located on the waterfront in the city centre, this Cathedral was once the Royal Palace for the Kings of Thomond and was gifted to the Church of Ireland in 1168.
- 4 Treaty Stone and the Three Bridges Walk** www.limerick.ie
The Treaty Stone in the heart of Limerick City is one of our most iconic links to the past and can be seen on the Three Bridges Walk along the River Shannon.
- 5 Hunt Museum** www.huntmuseum.com
Located on the waterfront, The Hunt Museum preserves and exhibits the original artefacts gathered over a lifetime, by John and Gertrude Hunt, which is today known as the Hunt Collection.
- 6 Wickham Way** www.limerick.ie
Located on the junction of Thomas Street and Wickham Street, the Wickham Way is an indoor community space offering everything from food, coffee, art, crafts and more!
- 7 Limerick Museum** www.limerick.ie
The Museum's collection illustrates the unique history of Limerick and its people, with almost 60,000 display objects.
- 8 People's Park** www.peoplesmuseum.ie
People's Park, situated in the heart of Georgian Limerick, was first opened in 1877, and has many iconic features including a band stand and a refurbished drinking fountain.
- 9 Limerick City Gallery of Art** www.gallery.limerick.ie
Limerick City Gallery of Art (LCGA) invites you to see the best of contemporary art through its exhibition program.
- 10 The People's Museum of Limerick** www.peoplesmuseum.ie
The beautifully restored Georgian townhouse at No. 2 Pery Square is home to The People's Museum of Limerick.
- 11 Watersports and City Kayaking Tours** www.nevsaillwatersports.ie
Situated on the banks of the River Shannon, Limerick City has a number of watersports activities including kayaking, for 6 years +.
- 12 Treaty City Brewery** www.treatycitybrewery.ie
Treaty City Brewery is an artisan craft brewery situated in a newly renovated 18th century building on Nicholas Street, in the heart of Medieval Limerick.
- 13 Thomond Park & Museum** www.thomondpark.ie
TUS Millennium Theatre 3km
This famous venue, renowned internationally for its unique history and atmosphere, is the home to Munster Rugby.
- 14 Limerick Whiskey Experience** www.whiskeyexperience.ie
Located in Limerick City this experience is situated in a architecturally iconic building now housing Mother Mac's public house.
- 15 Lime Tree Theatre and The Belltable** www.limetreetheatre.ie
Two theatres in Limerick City renowned for their diverse arts, cinema and theatrical programming.
- 16 University of Limerick, University Concert Hall and Sports Campus** www.ul.ie
The campus has a number of woodland trails to meander and an excellent diversity of architecture.
