Reference your correspondence (AF / BG 26.06.25) I have received indirectly.

I can confirm the following in regard to acute hospital services within the Mid West:

- the Medical Record department undertakes a daily exercise whereby all deaths for the previous 24 hours are recorded on the Integrated Patient Managed Systems (iPMs).
- this action generates an alert whereby any future planned appointments including waiting list records are removed.

However it should be noted that if a patient dies at home the hospital is not alerted with the result that the appointment letter will continue to be issued. To overcome this matter the hospital is working with the local Civil Registration office to see if community deaths can be notified to the hospital in some manner. To date a viable solution has not been secured.

Dear Ms Foley

I refer to your correspondence dated the 27th June 2025.

The HSE Civil Registration Service registers all births, deaths and marriages in Ireland. To register a death, a person must book an appointment at their local civil registration office.

The ownership of the Civil Registration Computer System (CRCS) is under the remit of the Office of the Registrar General, Department of Social Protection, who share the data appropriately with other agencies.

The current practice is that a death must be registered on the CRCS to know that a person is deceased. At this time, there is no notification from a coroner or medical professional to advise that a death has taken place but it is my understanding that this will change in the future.

Service managers within the HSE have contacted the Civil Registration Office for assistance in determining if those on their waiting lists are deceased and limited access to the CRSC can be granted by the Office of the Registrar General in this regard. In practice, service managers also use RIP.ie as a means of ensuring deceased persons do not receive appointment letters. A process has been put in place whereby service managers can request access to CRCS data. However, this access can only assist where the death is registered.

Every effort is made to ensure that appointments do not issue to deceased individuals. Regrettably in the absence of a formal notification system it is not always possible to prevent this from happening.

I trust this clarifies the position. Please contact me if you have any further queries.

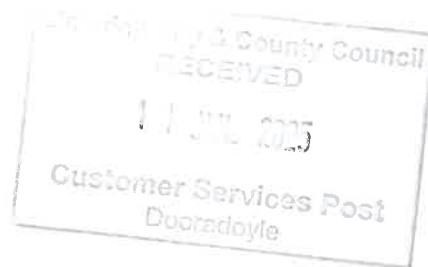
