Active Travel Limerick News

“Road Traffic Notice”

Knockalisheen Road (L10013-1), for a distance of 150m from its junction with the Cratloe Road/Thomond Park Stadium For the Active Travel Scheme on the Cratloe Road (R445-29) to Sexton street North (R445-28 to25), Limerick City On Monday 15th of September to Friday 5th December 2025, 24/7.

Limerick City & County Council wish to advise that the Knockalisheen Road (L10013-1) will be closed to facilitate Roadworks in association with the Cratloe Road to Sexton Street North (R445-28 to25) Active Travel Project.

Please use the alternative route on the Kileely Road (R464-5) to access Ballynanty.

Limerick City & County Council advise motorists and road users that Temporary Traffic Management will operate at the above location and times approved 24/7 for the duration of the works and timeline given.

Any inconvenience is regrettable but unavoidable. please use the **Ballynanty Road(L10012-7), Kileely Road(R464-2), Watchhouse Cross (L10001-2)** as appropriate.

Corbally Safe Routes to School

Scheme Update

The scheme was approved by Councillors via a Part 8 planning application in October 2023, having gone through a public consultation process.

- Limerick City and County Council Surveyors are marking out the proposed road alignment, new kerb layouts, pedestrian crossings etc with temporary road marking paint.
- Engagement to begin shortly with the residents association to discuss the works and to answer any questions that may have.
- Shareridge Civil Engineering Ltd have been appointed as the main works contractor with construction estimated to start October 2025.



Old Cratloe Road/Redgate Road Cycle Lanes Scheme Update

The Section 38 Consultation process ended Friday, 5th of September.

- A report with replies to the 45 submissions received is currently being compiled.
- Limerick City and County Council Surveyors are marking out the proposed road alignment, new kerb layouts, cycle lanes, pedestrian crossings etc. with temporary road marking paint.
- Engagement to commence in the coming weeks with the various residents associations to discuss the works and to answer any questions they may have.

Freshers Week Visits

Safe Routes to Schools

Patrickswell, (L-1442): Signage and blue paint for disability parking remaining.

Athea (R-523): Signage, road-marking, bollard installation and snagging remaining.

Murroe (R-506, L-1127 & L-1161): Snagging works remaining.

TUS Moylish to City Centre Scheme

The following works are anticipated to be carried out as part of the TUS Moylish to City Centre Scheme over the coming weeks:

- Paving works are continuing outside **Thomond Park Plaza**.
- Footpath upgrades are ongoing, including new kerbs, tactile paving, and ducting.
- The cycle track is being prepared for tarmac and is scheduled to be surfaced with red macadam on **29th September** (weather permitting), from **Mayorstone Garda Station** to **Thomond Park Plaza**.
- Work is ongoing to remove the old boundary wall and build a new one at Thomond Park (weather permitting).
- The aim is to reopen the section from **Mayorstone Garda Station** to **Thomond Park Plaza** to the public by the week ending **3rd October**, subject to weather and progress.

Note: Two way traffic will be maintained, apart for very short intervals where plant & material will be going into the works area via the site access points, flagmen will be present during these operations.



Towns and Villages Schemes

Note: The Active Travel team are tasked with providing new and upgraded pedestrian infrastructure across Limerick City & County Council's Metropolitan and Municipal districts.

The following works at **Strand, Co. Limerick** have recently commenced.

The works will include the following:

- New footpath of approximately **275 metres**.
- Footpath upgrade of approximately **370 metres**.
- Public lighting.
- Installation of gullies.

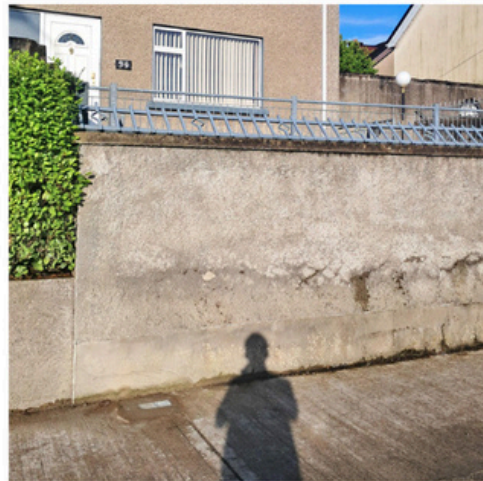


We extend our sincere gratitude to our colleagues in the **Newcastle West Operations team of the District Roads Area** for their work in completing these schemes.

Bus Stop Sockets

The Active Travel Limerick team are continuing to install new bus stop sockets in **Moyross, Ballynanty, Shelbourne, and Kileely**, along the **303** and **306** bus routes.

Several bus stop sockets have already been installed, as shown in the photos below. More bus stop sockets will be put in place over the coming weeks with the bus poles to follow.
