Temporary Closure of Roads: Mayorstone Upper Road (L-10027), Coolraine, Limerick

Roads to be closed: Mayorstone Upper Road, Coolraine (L-10027), from its junction with Cratloe Road (R445) to its junction with Merval Drive (L-10480)

Alternative Route: Diversions via Cratloe Road (R445) to Mayorstone Upper, Farranshone (L-10028) to Merval Drive (L-10480) to Corrib Drive (L-10474)

Time of Closure: **From Monday 10th November 2025 To Friday 12th December 2025**

- Diversions will be clearly signposted.
- Local Access will be accommodated.
- Pedestrian access to footpaths will be maintained at all times.
- Local residents and businesses will be accommodated.

- Installation of a new 2 metre wide footpath from **Doon** towards **Cappawhite**.
- Install new drop kerbs.
- Install new drainage works.
- Install new road markings.
- Upgrade of existing public lighting.

The session was well received and highlighted the Directorate's commitment to collaboration, innovation, and service excellence across the Council.



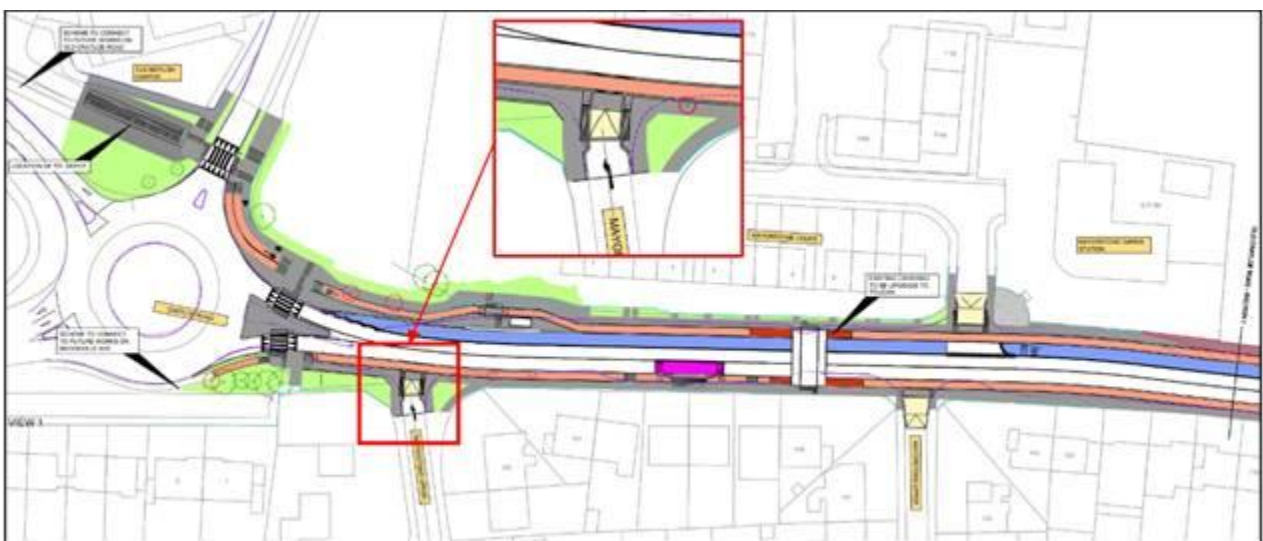
TUS Moylish to City Centre Scheme

Works have commenced and will continue at the Southern side of the project off the TUS roundabout heading towards Hassetts Cross the works will include:

- The stripping of topsoil & demolition of existing footpaths.
- Installation of new ducting, kerbing and pouring new footpaths for pedestrians.
- Installation of new pedestrian crossing, traffic signal poles and furniture at Thomond Park. The crossing will be made live for pedestrians to cross.

Construction Works have commenced on southern side of Cratloe Road, from Moylish Roundabout in the direction of Hassetts Cross:

- This section of the works includes the rearrangement of the junction of **Mayorstone Upper** with **Cratloe Road** (junction closest to Moylish Roundabout), to a one-way left out only, as outlined in the Part 8 Planning Layout Drawing below:



TUS Moylish to City Centre Scheme

Works are scheduled to commence this week at Bellfield Gardens down by the Maternity Hospital the works will include:

- The demolition of existing footpaths.
- Installation of new pedestrian crossings, new kerbing, footpaths, cycle lane and paving throughout section.
- New bus shelter recently installed will be in operation to the public off the roundabout from TUS.

Note: Two way traffic will be maintained, apart for very short intervals where plant & material will be going into the works area via the site access points, flagmen will be present during these operations.



Bloodmill Road, Windsor Court and Castletroy View Scheme

Improvement works at **Bloodmill Road** and **Castletroy View** include kerb realignment, footpath widening, new tactile paving, landscaping adjustments, removal of bollards, and updated road markings on **Windsor Court**.

The project also upgrades the existing pedestrian crossing on Bloodmill Road to a raised zebra crossing with improved drainage, enhancing safety and slowing traffic in the area.

All main works are now complete, with only minor snagging items remaining.



Pedestrian/Cycling Permeability Link **Childers Road to St. Brigid's School Scheme**

These works **are in addition** to the recently advertised Section 38 works at Granville Park (see link below)

Current works include:

- Realignment of the boundary fence and installation of a new gated entrance from Childers Road.
- Construction of a new shared footpath/cyclepath connecting **Childers Road to St. Brigid's National School** grounds.
- Associated kerbing, tactile and corduroy paving, and landscaping works.

Corbally Road Safe Routes to School Scheme Update

The appointed contractors, Shareridge, have commenced preliminary site activities, including exploratory works on the existing drainage system and the setup of their site compound.

The proposed development will consist of the following:

- Widening of St. Munchin's Gate to facilitate 2-way traffic.
- 3 New raised pedestrian crossings along Corbally Road.
- Widening and resurfacing of an existing path along the southern side of Corbally road from **Lanahrone Avenue** junction to **Shannon Drive** junction.

Towns and Villages Schemes

Note: The Active Travel team are tasked with providing new and upgraded pedestrian infrastructure across Limerick City & County Council's Metropolitan and Municipal districts.

The following works are now completed in **Strand, Co. Limerick**.

The works included the following:

- Construction of 587 m² of concrete footpaths have been completed, covering a total length of 310 metres.
- Installation of 270 metres of electrical duct for public lighting.
- 8 public lights have been installed.
- 42 metres of drainage pipe and 5 gullies.
