Mill Road Active Travel Scheme

Official Launch



On Friday, 7th November, the new Mill Road Active Travel Scheme was officially launched by the Mayor of Limerick, John Moran. The event marked the completion of 1.4 kilometres of new infrastructure designed to make travel safer and easier for residents – especially pupils of Scoil Íde and students of St. Munchin's College.





Mayor John Moran was joined by Bishop Brendan Leahy, Director of Services for Transportation and Mobility Patricia Liddy, and Scoil Íde Principal Ray D'Arcy, who all highlighted the strong community cooperation behind the scheme.

Scoil Íde choir and music group performed for the guests, and two pupils delivered inspiring essays describing how the new path has made their journeys safer, greener and more enjoyable.



Corbally Road Active Travel Scheme



Over the past week, work has commenced on the excavation of footpaths at the junction of Lanahrone Avenue and Corbally Road. The installation of the new kerbs has begun, and the footpath area has been prepared in advance of the concrete pour.

Next week, work will continue on the excavation of footpaths across from Scoil Íde, extending from Lanahrone Avenue to the pedestrian crossing.

Additionally, new kerbs will be installed, and the first sections of concrete footpaths are scheduled to be poured.

Pedestrians are being redirected to alternative crossing points for safety. Temporary traffic management measures will be in place locally to facilitate these works.

Murroe Safe Routes to School

We were waiting for dry weather to add some final finishes to the scheme in Murroe - the road markings were completed this week with landscaping and planting to follow in the next few weeks.

[**Castletroy Link Road**](#) has been granted planning permission by An Coimisiún Pleanála ([documents are available here](#)). Our focus now moves to advancing the project to the next stage, which is subject to the necessary funding allocation being secured.

TUS Moylish to City Centre Scheme

Works are continuing at Bellefield Gardens near the Maternity Hospital as well as at Moylish Roundabout. The works include the demolition of existing footpaths, installation of new pedestrian crossings, new kerbing, footpaths, cycle lane and paving throughout section.

Note: Two way traffic will be maintained, apart for very short intervals where plant & material will be going into the works area via the site access points, flagmen will be present during these operations.

Temporary Closure of Roads: Mayorstone Upper and Coolraine
Roads to be closed: Mayorstone Upper Road, Coolraine (L-10027), from its junction with Cratloe Road (R445) to its junction with Merval Drive (L-10480).

Time of Closure: from Monday, 10th November, to Friday, 12th December, 2025

Works to install two new bus stops will commence at Boher before the end of November.


