# KILLEEDY ECO PARK

**Distance:** 1.6 km

**Start/End:** Killeedy Eco Park Car Park

**Difficulty:** Easy

Explore this vibrant space that actively nurtures local biodiversity. Located in Killeedy, County Limerick, Killeedy Eco-Park is a fine example of sustainable regeneration and community-driven development.

Established on the former site of an industrial facility, this 13-acre parkland has been transformed into a peaceful haven of rural tranquillity. The park has over 7,000 native trees all planted by volunteers and reed beds designed to treat wastewater from the nearby Kantoher Business Park and new housing planned for the nearby villages of Ashford and Raheenagh.


Did you know that on a clear day you can see five counties from the top of the Lookout Point? Can you list the counties and what to look out for to identify each of them?



The Mossy Quinlivan Bridge is a tribute to all the people that worked in Kantoher Creamery since its foundation in 1904.



The eco park's tunnel walkways are formed using willow trees. In the spring, willows have fuzzy, flower-like clusters called catkins. Male catkins are yellow and female catkins are soft and woolly.

## NATURAL FEATURES AND ETHOS

### 7,000 Native Trees

All planted by volunteers, schools and community groups. Species include oak, ash, birch, willow, alder, hazel, and more.



### 13 Acres of Biodiversity

The Eco Park covers 13 acres of diverse habitats: includes woodland, wildflower meadows, wetland – reed beds and more.



### Reed Bed Water Treatment

A living filtration system. Reeds naturally clean wastewater using plants, gravel and microbes.



### Amphitheatre & Outdoor Classroom

Built for: Education • Music & Events • Drama • Storytelling



### Wildlife Hotspot

Killeedy Eco Park is home to: songbirds, bats, butterflies, bees, frogs, hares, dragonflies, damselflies and many more!



### Carbon Capture

The 7,000 trees planted will store over 140 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> in the next 20 years.



### Living Classroom

Local schools use the park to learn about: Ecology • Renewable Energy • Water Systems • Climate Science
