We will move at the next Meeting of Limerick City and County Council that the proposed 2026 Roads Schedule of Municipal District Works be prepared to ensure an equal allocation of the roads budget, per kilometre of road network, across all Districts.

Reply:

Schedule of Municipal District Works (SMDW) — Allocation Principles

The Schedule of Municipal District Works, **SMDW**, which also includes applicable grant allocations, is apportioned in a fair and balanced manner across all MDs. The distribution is informed by the following criteria:

- The approved three-year roadworks programme submitted to the Department of Transport.
- An assessment of pavement condition and maintenance needs, informed by the Pavement Condition Index (PCI).
- Low-cost safety improvement works for regional and local roads, informed by collision and accident data and public-liability claims.
- The extent of the road network and population distribution within each district.
- Traffic volumes and traffic counts at road locations, including peak hours and Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT/ADT).

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Limerick City & County Council — Roads Budget 2026 (Local Roads Increment)

At the Budget Meeting held at the end of November 2025, the elected members adopted the Roads budget for 2026. An additional €400,000 was approved for Local Roads. In line with practice, this increase is distributed in proportion to the total kilometres of Local Roads within each Municipal District (MD).

NTA's Long-Term Commitment to Limerick.

The National Transport Authority (NTA) has made a long-term commitment to supporting Limerick through various schemes outlined in the Limerick Shannon Metropolitan Area Transport Strategy 2040 (LSMAT's). This commitment is essential for fostering a vibrant, connected, and sustainable community.

1. Investment in Towns and Villages:

The NTA recognises the importance of investing in our towns and villages to ensure that all areas benefit from enhanced transport infrastructure. By focusing on sustainable mobility solutions, we aim to support local economies and improve the quality of life for residents.

Limerick City and County Council along with Cork County Council are the only two Local Authorities in Ireland that receive the Towns and Villages allocation.

Each Area within Limerick City and County will receive €750k for Active Travel works.
