

CORRESPONDENCE
MEETING OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT OF LIMERICK
16TH FEBRUARY 2026

- Email dated 15th January 2026 from the Office of the Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage in reply to Notice of Motion from Members that this District write to the Minister for Housing requesting the recording of figures of people who have died in homelessness in Limerick City.
- Email dated 16th January 2026 from the Department of the Taoiseach in reply to Notice of Motion from Members that this District call on the Department of the Taoiseach to initiate a full and urgent review of local government funding, powers and structures bringing us in line with our European counterparts.
- Letter dated 19th January 2026 from the National Transport Authority in reply to Notice of Motion from Members that this District write to the National Transport Authority, Irish Rail and the Department of Transport for a progress report on the constructing of temporary rail platforms for passengers travelling between Foynes and Limerick for the duration of the 2027 Ryder Cup event at all population centres along the route, such as Adare, Patrickswell and Rosbrien/Dooradoyle following on from the motion that was passed at the October 2024 Metropolitan meeting.

It was requested to amend the Motion to include asking whether it has been confirmed that the line would be a freight line, passenger line, or both; where the stops will be located along the route; has planning permission been sought, and this was agreed.

- Email dated 29th January 2026 from the Office of the Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage in reply to Notice of Motion from Members that District call on the HSE, An Garda Síochána, and relevant homeless service providers to strengthen inter-agency cooperation and implement measurable protocols to combat drug and alcohol misuse in homeless accommodation facilities in Limerick.

It was agreed to amend the Motion to include writing to the Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage and the Minister of State at the Department of Health with special responsibility for Public Health, Wellbeing and the National Drugs Strategy.

- Letter dated 27th January 2026 from Iarnród Éireann in reply to Notice of Motion from Members that this District write to the National Transport Authority, Irish Rail and the Department of Transport for a progress report on the constructing of temporary rail platforms for passengers travelling between Foynes and Limerick for the duration of the 2027 Ryder Cup event at all population centres along the route, such as Adare, Patrickswell and Rosbrien/Dooradoyle following on from the motion that was passed at the October 2024 Metropolitan meeting.

Dear Ms. Foley,

The Department does not collate information relating to deaths of homeless individuals. However, on 20 May 2025, the Health Research Board published a report “Deaths among people who were homeless at time of death in Ireland, 2021”. This HRB Bulletin was commissioned by the Department of Health to address the need to improve understanding of premature mortality among people who are homeless nationally, and to provide more complete and accurate national data to inform policy. The report can be accessed at the following link: <https://www.hrb.ie/wp-content/uploads/2025/06/Deaths-among-people-who-were-homeless-2021-bulletin.pdf>

The report shows that there were 347 deaths among people who were homeless in the period 2019-2021 (276 male and 71 female).

- 94 deaths occurred in 2019 (76 male and 18 female).
- 125 deaths occurred in 2020 (97 male and 28 female).
- 128 deaths occurred in 2021 (103 male and 25 female),
- The majority (59%) lived in Dublin (city or county).

Data on the number of deaths from 2019 to 2021 were reported by HSE Health region, with deaths among those located in the Mid-West which includes Limerick City and County, Tipperary and Clare amounting to 9 individuals in 2021, No deaths were recorded in that region in 2019 and 2020.

The deaths of people availing of homeless services are a concern and are being taken very seriously. It is important that we establish the facts concerning the circumstances involved, and that we base our response on the best knowledge and evidence available. The Department is working closely with the Department of Health, the HSE and local authorities to continue to deliver the appropriate measures to support all individuals experiencing homelessness including those with complex needs.

Dear Mr Foley,

I refer to your correspondence dated 20th November 2025 which was received by the National Transport Authority (NTA) on the 15th of December 2025 regarding the above matter.

Regarding progress on the temporary rail platform in Adare for the 2027 Ryder Cup, I can advise that the design is complete and invitations to tender for the construction stage were issued in December 2025. Tender returns are due in February 2026. Construction is planned to take place in Spring/Summer 2026 with a view to the platform being complete before the freight line becomes operational. The temporary platform will be in service for the week of the Ryder Cup event in September 2027 following which it will be decommissioned and removed. Regarding planning permission, it was confirmed in September 2025 that the proposed temporary platform is Exempt Development under the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended).

The primary rail-based transport solution being considered for the 2027 Ryder Cup is to operate a rail shuttle service between Limerick Junction station and Adare for the week of the event. Limerick Junction station will provide an interchange for intercity services to/from Dublin, Cork and Killarney/Tralee. There are no plans to provide any other station facilities on the Foynes line in relation to the Ryder Cup event.

Finally, I can confirm that the Foynes line will be reopened as a freight line as per the Final Business Case approved for the project

Thank you for your correspondence dated 20th November 2025, received by this office on 23rd December 2025.

With regard to progress on the temporary rail platform in Adare for the 2027 Ryder Cup, I can advise that the design is complete and invitations to tender for the construction stage were issued in December 2025. Tender returns are due in February 2026. Construction is planned to take place in Spring/Summer 2026 with a view to the platform being complete before the freight line becomes operational. The temporary platform will be in service for the week of the Ryder Cup event in September 2027 following which it will be decommissioned and removed. Regarding planning permission, LCCC confirmed in September 2025 that the proposed temporary platform is Exempt Development under the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended).

The primary rail based transport solution being considered for the 2027 Ryder Cup is to operate a rail shuttle service between Limerick Junction station and Adare for the week of the event. Limerick Junction station will provide an interchange for intercity services to/from Dublin, Cork and Killarney/Tralee. While there are no plans to provide any other station facilities on the Foynes line in relation to the Ryder Cup event, other possibilities to utilise existing rail infrastructure to maximize the rail based offering continue to be explored.

I can confirm that the Foynes line will be reopened as a freight line. While many of the attributes of a freight line are common to a passenger line, there are no stations planned for the corridor with the exception of the temporary facility at Adare for the 2027 Ryder Cup as mentioned above. Iarnród Éireann are supportive of the objective of establishing passenger services on the line in the future as noted in the All Island Rail Review, subject to an acceptable business case and Government funding. There is currently no funding available therefore do not have an active project however, should funding become available we will revisit this.
