


The Forum of North American and European Learning Cities, a joint initiative of Évry-Courcouronnes and Cork, with the support of the UNESCO Institute for Lifelong Learning, had its inaugural meeting in France in September 2025. This was to shape the governance of a new international learning network. Cork, Limerick, Belfast and Waterford Learning Cities were all represented at this meeting.

Two Learning Limerick Networking meetings were held in 2025. The first one focused on preparing for the 2025 festival and the flagship 'All Literacies Change Lives' seminar. The second meeting was held in December 2025 and marked the start of preparing for the 2026 festival; while reflecting on the learning from 2025. There were also inputs on - 'AI in Everyday Life' and 'Making Your Events Fun for all the Family'. The groupwork discussions then focused on applying this learning for next year's festival and beyond.




