



St. Paul's to Ballykeeffe

Active Travel Project

Dear Resident/business owner

Limerick City and County Council will commence construction of new infrastructure between St. Paul's Roundabout and Ballykeeffe Roundabout.

Shareridge Ltd. has been appointed as the contractor for the works following a tender process.

WHAT IS BEING CONSTRUCTED:

New Cycle Facilities and Road Layout Changes

Construction of dedicated cycle tracks along a 600 m section of St. Nessian's Road, including layout adjustments at St. Paul's and Ballykeeffe roundabouts and alterations to local junctions.

Pedestrian Improvements

Upgrading footpaths, installing new and improved signalised pedestrian/cyclist crossings, providing a new pedestrian link from Ballykeeffe Estate, and adding a new road crossing.

Public Transport Improvements

Introducing bus-priority signals at roundabout approaches and reconstructing bus stops, including new island-type bus stop layouts.

Boundary and Structural Works

Reconstructing sections of boundary walls at St. Paul's Nursing Home and St. Paul's Church structure, and modifications to the nursing home entrance.

General Civil Works

Road resurfacing, new markings and coloured surfacing for cycle routes, and upgrades to drainage, water, and utility services.

WHEN IS WORK BEGINNING:

Construction is due to begin in the area on Monday 13th April 2026 and is estimated to remain ongoing for approximately nine months.

Works are anticipated to run from Monday to Friday between 8am and 6pm and on Saturdays from 9am to 1pm.

WHAT IMPACT WILL IT HAVE ON ME:

A traffic management system will be in place for the duration of the works. The contractor will provide advanced notice regarding traffic management in such circumstances. The Traffic Management Plan will be in place which will cater for the needs of vulnerable road users (such as wheelchair users) and all vehicle types (including emergency vehicles, waste collecting vehicles etc).

Construction noise will be kept within allowable levels and noise monitoring will be carried out on a regular basis.

We apologise for any disruptions and inconvenience the works may cause.

WHY IS THE SCHEME BEING CONSTRUCTED:

Limerick City and County Council is continuing to expand Limerick's walking and cycling network, with funding from the National Transport Authority. St. Paul's to Ballykeeffe is a key connector to primary and secondary cycle routes in the Limerick Shannon Metropolitan Area Transport Strategy. It will enable people to walk and cycle safely to school, to work and in to and out of the city centre.
